

# Exerpts From "No Man's Land Becomes A County"

**METHODIST CONFERENCE - 1881**  
(Williams Ranch)

The Third Quarterly Conference was held July 18, 1881 at Williams Ranch. The pastor in charge was Rev. Hamner. Rev. M. N. Weatherly conducted the religious service. The official roll call was made. Those present were: John Tisdale, L. D.; J. D. Chesser, Steward; G. W. Templin, C. L., Steward; Wm. Tolson, Steward; and J. E. McGowan, Steward. Everything was as usual except under the heading of complaints. When the pastor got to that item, all seemed to become very sad. There was a short pause and Bro. Weatherly prayed a fervent prayer and Bro. Templin, with tears in his eyes, sang the chorus of the song "Is It With My Soul?". The pastor read the complaints -

'W.R. Bratton selling liquor'; Bro. Bratton was suspended from stewardship but not turned out of the church. Another complaint dealt with Bro. J. D. Chesser, a most devout Christian man, always had family prayer, gave the land for the church and school house, and his home was the preacher's home. The complaint was 'Performing work on the Sabbath'. Mr. J.D. Chesser replied, "Dear Father and Brethren: Yes, I ran my reaper one Sunday, although I stopped the reaper and went to church. When church was over, I went to work for the rust had struck the wheat; it meant bread for our families to save the wheat. There are only two reapers in the area - my reaper and J.B. Head's at Center City. Our crops of wheat would have been destroyed in a few days. I was doing all I could for the neighbors. I hated to

work on Sunday, but under the circumstances I would do it again!' The Conference at once decided that "the ox had been in the ditch"; Brother Chesser was excused and a regular love feast took place among the brethren.

## City Council Hears Rose Resources Representatives

The City Council of Goldthwaite met in special called session last Thursday to hear and address questions to Jim Rose, of Rose Resources of Austin.

Rose, whose company is involved with the procurement of grants and assistant payments to municipalities, is a former Director of Planning for the State of Texas and an ex-member of the Texas Water Quality Board.

The city council requested an audience with Rose because all avenues are being explored in relation to grants and other methods of financing the improvements to the water system for the City.

Estimates have run as high as \$300,000 to repair the eroding off-channel storage reservoirs and enlarge the filtering capacity for the city.

The Rose Resources firm, which has been in existence since last September, has

been enlisted by several small cities in Central Texas to make an effort to supply federal and state monies, by either grant or matching funds methods. San Saba and Lampasas are two that have asked for the services of the group.



## Extension Highlights by Danny Long

It's not too late to have soil samples tested. Extension Service Soil Testing Labs at College Station, Lubbock and Seymour, are processing samples promptly and reporting results about a week after receiving samples.

The level of available nutrients in a soil is especially important for the efficient and profitable use of fertilizers. Soil tests have been developed to provide information about soil nutrients as a basis for determining if the soil level is

adequate or deficient. Soil low in nutrient will yield more when nutrient is added to the fertilizer, while soil high in the nutrient will benefit little from adding more of the same fertilizer. This would be a costly error to add nutrients that are already present in adequate amounts.

Soil testings should be a regular standard procedure in every farming operation. More information about soil tests can be obtained from the County Extension Office.
