Health Clinic Scheduled At Sr. Citizens Center Wed.

Public Health Region 6 wishes to announce the operation of a Public Health Clinic in the Goldthwaite community at the Sr. Citizens Center, Old Priddy Rd. The Health Clinic will be held Wednesday, June 28 between the hours of 10:30 a.m. and 12:00 noon. This program will be conducted monthly on the 4th Wednesday during the same hours.

The Public Health Clinic will be staffed by Public Health Nurses and will offer services to all ages and will include child and adult health assessment, health teaching and counseling.

Some of the screening

procedures which will be available are: vision, hearing, blood pressure, anemia (including Sickie Cell), blood sugar, and limited cancers. Appointments are recommended to prevent unnecessary waiting.

The Clinic will also offer immunization against polio, measles, rubella, Diphtheria, pertussis and tetanus. No appointments are needed for the immunization clinic.

These services are provided for the public by Texas Department of Health.

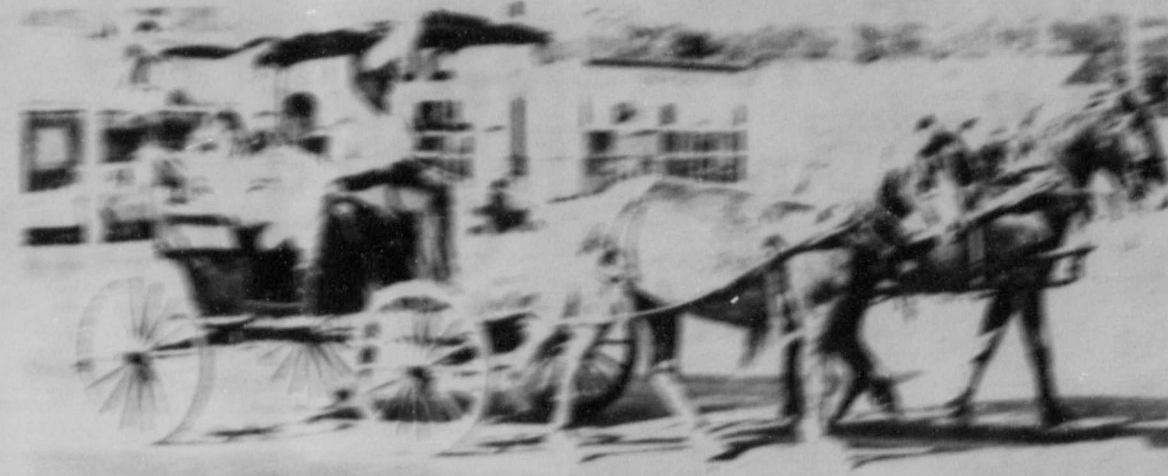
Mrs. Wilkins Attends Garden Club Convention

Marvin Leath Issues Thank You Letter To Voters

Marvin Leath, Democratic candidate for Congress, issued through Goldthwaite Monday, June 12, shaking hands and saying "thanks" to some of his key supporters.

Leath said, "This is a great trip around the district. I'm sure you could say I'm just doing my job in practice. On this trip, I'm able to see only a few of the many fine-people who did so much for me. I plan to come back another day when I will have more time and will visit with more people."

In the June 3 Democratic runoff, Leath, who finished second in the May 6 voting, captured 17 of the 19 counties of the 11th Congressional District. He lost the other two by a total of 103 votes.

The Marlin businessman now faces Republican opposition in November.

Some History — 'Trades Day' In 1909 Day Of Fun And Frolic

(Taken from the Eagle File of June 26, 1909)

FIRST TRADES DAY - A Grand Success and Everyone Well Pleased.

A FINE LIST OF PRIZES - An Immense Crowd in Attendance and a Fine Exhibit of Livestock and Farm Products.

Goldthwaite's first Trades Day was a great success and every body was apparently pleased with the outcome.

At an early hour on Monday morning the people commenced to arrive and by the time the parade started the town was thronged with people. It is confidently believed that there were more people here on that day than have been in this city on any one day in a good many years at any one time. They came from this and surrounding counties and the day was a pleasant one for everybody. The prizes were liberal and the number sufficiently large to get them pretty well distributed over the country and if there was any complaint about the manner in which the premiums were awarded the Eagle has not been advised of it.

The parade was far better than was anticipated, even by those who took part in it. A large number of the business houses were represented, some by decorated floats, others by buggies, ladies on horseback and boys carrying banners.

Everything was appropriate and the people thronging the streets through which the parade passed complimented every representation in the parade and it would be almost impossible to say just which exhibition and decoration was the prettiest and most appropriate.

It was at first thought best to allow each prize giver to appoint his own judges, but later a meeting of the Commercial club was held and a committee composed of Messrs. J. W. Driskell, Jas. Rahn and A. J. Cockrum was named to judge the livestock, and those who had offered prizes for other things were left free to make the awards as they thought proper.

Nearly every prize offered was claimed, and those who failed to call for the prizes due them will know better next time. As an example, there was a prize for the best mare, the best Durham bull and the best sheep, none of which were called for, although they could have been claimed by the owners of such stock if they had made their entries.

It is the intention of the Commercial club to make a specialty of these Trades Days, which will be every third Monday in each month, and a parade will likely be arranged for each occasion. The parade next third Monday will be made up exclusively of livestock and special attention will be given the premium list for stock.

The owners of any kind of livestock should get ready for the entries and suggestions as to the exhibit for which prizes should be offered would be received gladly by the officers of the Commercial Club.
