Burglaries Hit Goldthwaite Area; Carr's Cafe Entered Two Times

Carr's Cafe and the Circle C Club, located at the north Y in Goldthwaite, was robbed of over \$500 in cash last week, according to Mills County Sheriff H.G. Brooks.

The establishment was also entered Monday night of this week and again several hundred dollars in cash was taken. Money was hidden in the freezer and it was stolen by the burglars, who knew exactly where to look.

The burglars, who took money from two cash registers and from several coin-operated machines were not noticed until the establishment was opened the next morning. Entry was gained by breaking in a window.

Brooks stated that no substantial leads have been uncovered in the incident.

LIBRARY BURGLARY

The library at the Goldthwaite High School was robbed of about \$20 in cash over the weekend. The exact time of the burglary could not be determined, due to

the fact that the school building was not opened until Monday morning.

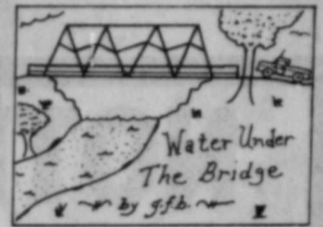
Entry was again accomplished by a window being broken. And again, Brooks reports that no concrete leads have been established.

TRIO JAILED IN BROWNWOOD

Two men and one juvenile have been jailed in Brown County jail following a string of house burglaries in Mills, Brown and Coleman Counties.

The men, all from Brownwood, entered the homes of Willard Mosier and L. C. Howard of the Mullin area two weeks ago and lifted several rifles and pistols. Guns and ammunition were also taken in all of the other burglaries in Brown and Coleman counties. About 30 guns were recovered by police officers.

The men have been changed with burglary of a household in Mills County, and will be up before the Grand Jury when it next convenes.

Texas DPS Urges Safe Driving During Holidays

The director of the Texas Department of Public Safety warned that the upcoming Christmas and New Year holiday periods would be the deadliest in recent years.

Tol. Wilson E. Speir said that while traffic deaths nationwide have been running at eight percent over last year, death counts for the 1978 July 4th and Labor Day weekends ran 40 to 50 percent over 1977.

Based on these trends, Speir estimated that 44 persons will die in Texas during the Christmas season, from 6 p.m. Monday, December 22, thru midnight Monday, December 25. He said another 35 deaths are likely in the New Year period from 6 p.m. Monday, December 29 thru midnight Monday, January 1.

At the end of preliminary holiday counts last year, 34 deaths were reported in the Christmas period and 30 during the New Year Holiday. Speir said all available DPS troopers will be on duty,

and they and local officers will be working to keep traffic moving safely.

"I have asked our personnel to place special emphasis on removing drunks and reckless drivers from the streets and highways," the DPS director added.

"We will continue to work with the news media to keep motorists posted on unusual traffic conditions, and to advise them on where and why serious holiday accidents are occurring," Speir said.

He noted that if present trends continue through the end of December, the state's traffic death toll will reach or exceed 4,000 for the first time in history. A record 3,698 persons died in Texas traffic during 1977.

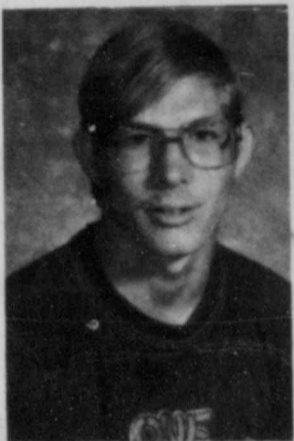

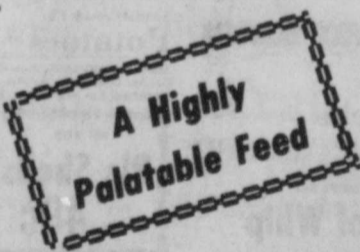

A beautiful setting adds glamour to holiday entertaining and serves as a colorful accent to your table and menu. Seasonal decorations are easy to put together. Try one of these: Stand red jumbo candles of varied heights in a group at the center of your table. For an attractive edible centerpiece, frost fresh fruit and arrange in a wicker basket or shaped bowl. Beat egg whites with a fork in a deep bowl, dip apples, pears, grape clusters and oranges;

sprinkle well with granulated sugar and let dry. Line container with plastic wrap and arrange frosted fruit, using toothpicks if necessary to hold them together. Twine a garland of greens, oversized pine cones and nuts around them, extending the garland onto the table beyond the candles. Wire greens and pine cones together and using florist's clay, stick clusters of nuts together and attach.

Producers with winter pastures in and growing have a valuable livestock feed commodity. Winter pastures such as small grain, ryegrass and legumes provide excellent quality forage. Such forage can be economical compared to other alternative feeding programs if close attention is given to management and use of such pastures.

The key point is to avoid putting livestock on pastures too quickly. A temptation is to begin grazing when growth starts. However, allow plants to make 6 to 8 inches of initial growth before beginning grazing. This enables them to establish a good root system so that they can recover more rapidly when grazed and can better withstand periods of dry weather and cold temperatures. Good initial plant growth is especially important this season as many pastures were established late due to dry weather. Less favorable growing conditions of shorter days and cooler temperatures have resulted in slow root development and

growth of such late pastures.

To get the most benefit from winter pastures, it's best to divide them with temporary or permanent fences to graze them on a rotational basis. As one area is grazed down, rotate cattle to another pasture. Topdress the grazed area with nitrogen fertilizer and graze it again when plant recovery and growth is sufficient. Since a new crop must be produced after each grazing, more fertilizer is required than if a small grain is grown for only grain crop.

An important consideration is using winter pastures profitably is to limit grazing in accordance to the nutrient needs of the cattle. One cannot afford to over-feed and waste such forage. Therefore, group cattle according to differing nutritional needs, such as dry cows, growing heifers, wet cows and stockers. The allow access to grazing for limited periods to meet their needs. Such management is a must to realize economical returns from high producing and high quality winter pastures.

County Farmers Paid \$13,538,000 For 1977

Mills County farmers and ranchers received \$13,538,000 in marketings and government payments during 1977, the Texas Department of Agriculture has announced.

The total included \$1,329,000 in cash receipts from all crops and \$11,984,000 from livestock and livestock products. Government payments made up \$225,000 of the total.

"With improved livestock

prices this year, particularly cattle, we are optimistic that 1978 cash receipts will be higher," commented Agriculture Commissioner Reagan V. Brown.

Texas maintained its third place national ranking in cash receipts despite problems throughout the year. Other first place rankings included: number of cattle and calves, 14.5 million head; Upland cotton production, 5.5 million bales; wool

production, 21 million lbs.; mohair production, 8 million pounds; number of farms and ranches, 197,000; and farm and ranch land, 139.8 million acres.

The state ranked second in

the production of grain sorghum, grapefruit, cantaloupes, carrots, rice, green peppers, cabbage, onions, American-pima cotton, pecans, honeydew melons and cucumbers.

Fur Industry Prosperous To Mills County Trappers

Mention fur trapping and you conjure up images of nineteenth century mountain men.

But about \$12,000 has been paid in the last year alone for furs in Mills County by D&W Fur Company of Halletsville, according to John Frank Shaddix, junior partner.

Each Monday, Shaddix arrives in Goldthwaite with a refrigerated truck and negotiates the purchase of furs at Oliver's Gas & Grocery.

Mr. Shaddix has been informed by New York that this fur season will definitely be the largest fur buying year probably ever recorded!

Mr. Shaddix got his start in the industry when he was in college. He became a professional bounty hunter in Tom Green County to help pay for his education.

Farmers and ranchers, as a whole, have legitimate complaints, which run into tens of thousands of dollars in damage to crops and livestock, caused by uncontrolled varmints.

Some humanitarian groups have vowed to try to stop all trapping and fur taking. These groups do a lot of good in certain areas by protecting birds, insects, fish, forests, etc. But in the area of conservation, pertaining to the fur industry, they have mistaken notions. Fur buyers and fur takers, in Mr. Shaddix's opinion, are more familiarized, better educated, and a lot more concerned with the conservation of fur bearing animals than most conservationists have ever realized!

As a member of Fur Takers of America and the Missouri Trappers, Shaddix is actively engaged in efforts to reduce waste of fur bearing animals through the use of traps which damage the pelt, such as the conibear trap. "Leg hold traps are by far the most successful and humane way of collecting the game. And they are more easily placed in areas where crops are

badly damaged by varmints than the live cage traps," he said.

Fur taking only lasts 66 days and is not profitable to hunters and buyers, unless furs are taken from overpopulated areas! Also, the \$5 fee for a trapper's license goes to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Dept. for conservation of the wildlife.

Mr. Shaddix states that due to the status of the bobcat population, the Texas Dept. of Wildlife will be setting up tagging stations

all over Texas. At these stations, the hunters must have their bobcat pelt tagged before they are sold. This is the law! Shaddix encourages all fur takers to have their trapper's license and/or buyer's license.

D&W Fur has been recognized as the largest fur company in Texas, covering the entire state for the third year in a row. Shaddix personally covers one-third of the territory, using the company motto: "Quality furs brings quality prices."

TIIC Warning Against Fires-- Light Up Your Holidays Safely--

'Tis the season for trees, candles and lights -- all potential fire hazards when they're set up inside a home or business. And because of this, every year the holiday season brings sadness to those who lose lives and property.

To avoid having your holiday season go up in smoke, the Texas Insurance Information Center (TIIC) of the Insurance Information Institute offers these fire safety tips:

- When setting up a tree, place the trunk in a solution of water and sugar. Add water daily to prolong its life.
- If you buy a flocked tree, make sure the flocking is flame retardant.

- Keep the tree away from fireplaces, radiators and heaters.

- Check all tree lights and outdoor lights for frayed wires, loose connections, cracked sockets, etc. Never use lights on a metallic tree; they can cause a tree to be charged with electricity.

- Do not connect too many light strings on one circuit or overload electrical outlets.

- When you leave the house for any length of time, turn off the tree lights.

Now that you've made it through the checklist this far, there's one more to go:

- Have a good, safe holiday. Common sense will prevent many accidents and losses.

Sales Tax Revenue Up Across State

State Comptroller Bob Bullock Thursday said Texas cities will end 1978 receiving more than \$424.8 million as their share during the last 12 months of the local option 1% sales tax.

This is 17.5 percent more than Texas cities received in 1977, Bullock said.

Comptroller Bob Bullock forecast Monday in a revenue report to the Legislature that Texas' economic prosperity will continue for the next two years but he cautioned that national forces may slow down the rate of the state's growth.

Even with a mild recession in mid-1979, though, state government will have available for its budget record money from taxes and other sources, Bullock's revenue estimate said.

He predicted that money

from existing taxes and other sources will top \$21.2 billion in the 1980-81 budget period, or \$2.8 billion more than the state is spending in its current budget.

The estimate includes a \$743.2 million balance expected to be left in the treasury August 31, but that figure includes \$300 million which has already been appropriated to the agencies by the Legislature and may be spent. The balance may be further reduced by special or emergency appropriations by the incoming Legislature.

The constitution requires the Comptroller to make a revenue estimate at the start of each legislative session, and under the state's pay-as-you-go policy the Legislature cannot spend more than the Comptroller says will be available.

Besides the mild recession, Bullock's estimate is based on assumptions that there will be a gradual recovery and that federal policies will bring inflation under control by mid-1981.

He predicted that Texas' economic growth will slow down to less than three percent during the recession. "We are talking about something that has a high

probability of happening but is not a certainty," Bullock said.

The estimate, for the first time in history, was based on a news economic forecasting technique designed and

developed by the Comptroller's Planning & Research Division.

The technique mathematically relates tax collections to economic variables in spending growth and price levels.

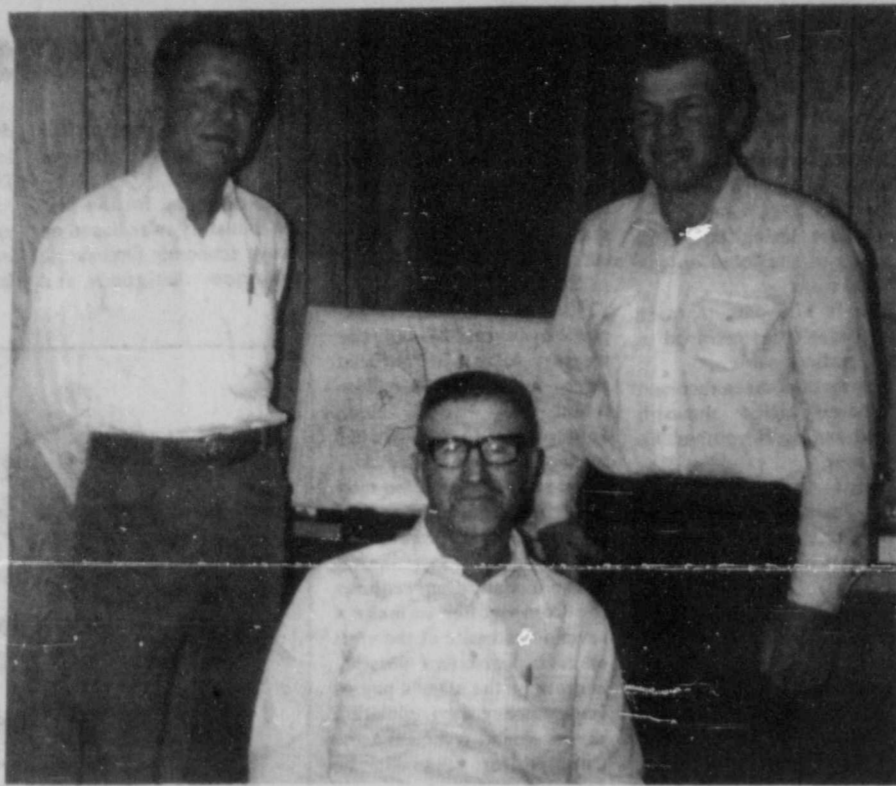

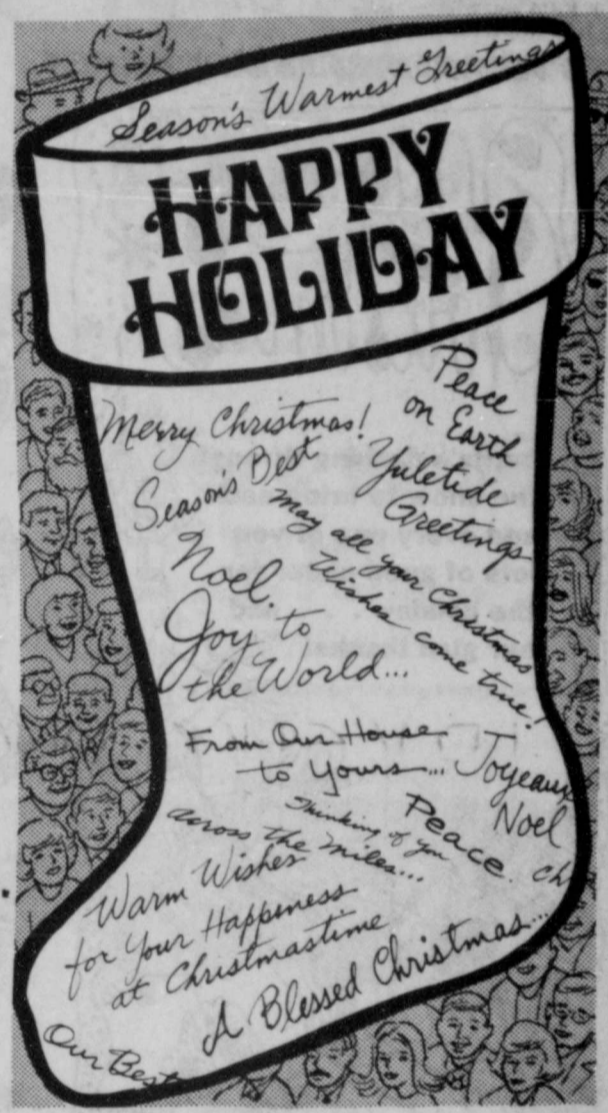
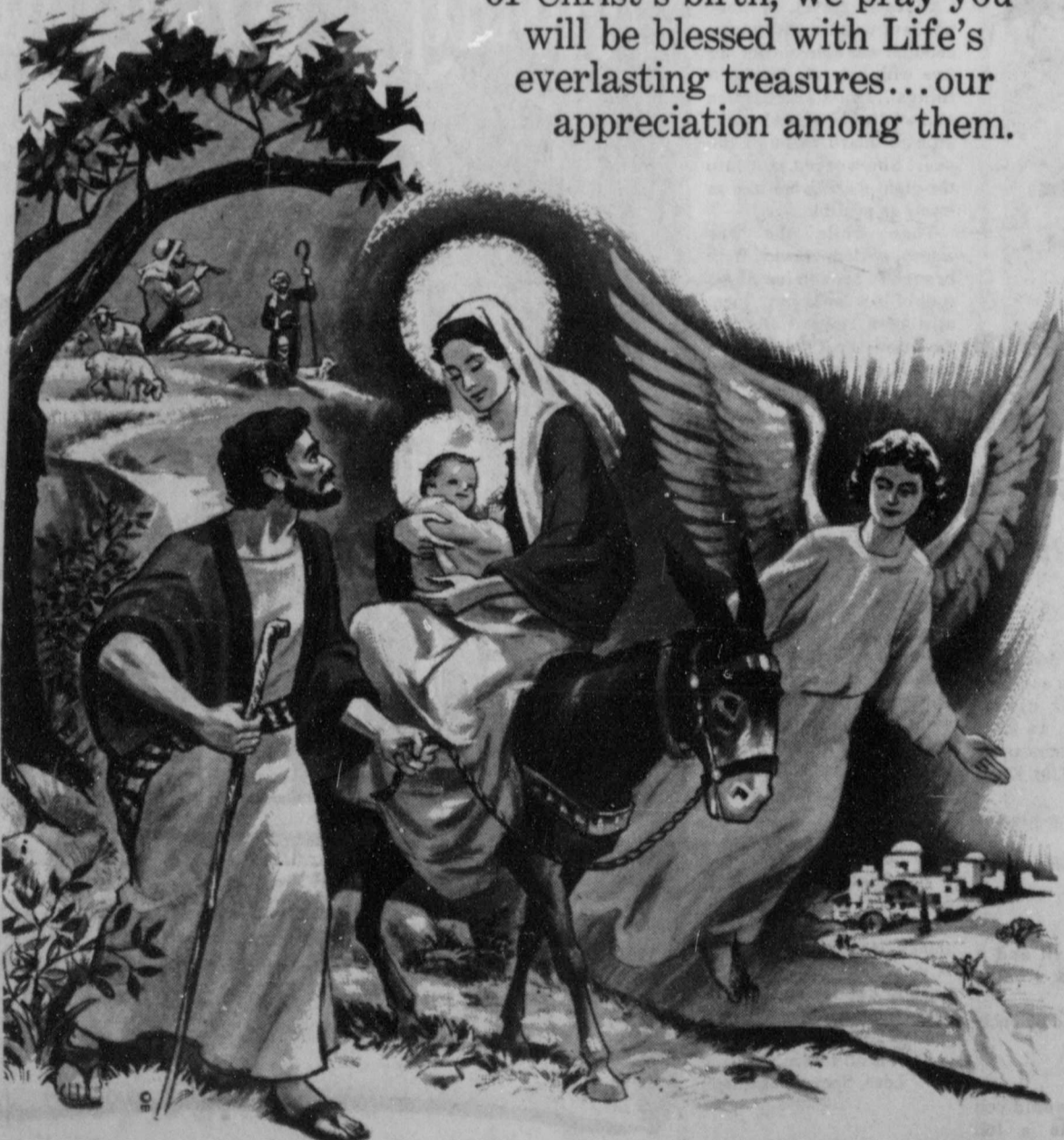

Colorful Wrap-Up Shows Individuality

A gift expresses you as uniquely as the way you sign your name. Your taste, creativity, even your sense of humor combine to make each gift a personal creation.

Wrapping your gifts needn't leave you at loose ends. Here are some basic guidelines for your Christmas wrap-up.

Use a large, flat surface that will hold gift wrap supplies, in an area that you can work in undisturbed. If you have a dining table, use it and try to keep inquisitive prowlers away. Gather paper, ribbons, trims, stickers, double sided tape, scissors and gift tags together before you start.

Before wrapping, cut the paper to the right size. Cut paper wide enough to overlap slightly on girth of package and long enough to overlap again when ends are turned down. Center the gift upside down on cut paper. Turn the overlapping piece under and tape securely. Fasten ends by folding sides in, the top flap down and the bottom flap up. Secure with tape, seals or gift trim.

For odd shaped items such as tricycles, portable televisions, and doll houses, slip them into colored plastic gift bags and dress up with a big bow and candy cane.

For gifts you will be mailing, it is important to dou-

ble-wrap. To protect your gift, place it in a larger cardboard box surrounded by crumpled newspaper. An inverted box lid will keep the bow from being crushed. When mailing a small, breakable item place it in a well padded metal tin which can then be placed in a padded cardboard shipping box. Wrap the shipping box with decorated parcel post paper and parcel post gift labels. Tie securely with twine or cord, wrapping the twine around the package twice in both directions. Tie twine at each intersection.

Wrap large packages first, then use leftover papers and trims for smaller gifts. Other leftover pieces and scraps can be used for children's crafts, collages.
