### GISD Board Holds Reg. June Meeting

The Goldthwaite School Board met Monday night and dealt with a variety of items on the agenda. The Board voted to include cars on the tax roll for the coming year, and to refrain from using the agriculture production method of assessing values of farm and ranch land. More on these items will be forthcoming from the tax office of the school district. The Board handled the following items in the meeting:

- Bids will be taken on the placing of tile on the floor of the high school cafeteria.
- The summer renovation program at the school was outlined by Supt. Gilbert Davis. The school annually receives painting, and rou-

time maintenance, during the summer months. The Heritage Student Insurance Program will again be used by the School. Students who play football need not take the school insurance if they show the policies they have in force and sign a release from the school plan. The other parts of the insurance program will remain the same as in the past. The five-year accreditation plan was discussed. The current topics dealt with are reading in the kindergarten through sixth grades; math in the kindergarten through sixth grades; citizenship, discipline and social studies in high school; and developing new curriculum guidelines. The building repairs and additions plan was also worked on by the Board. Mills County State Bank was voted the depository for school funds for the next two years. The Board also voted to retain the services of the Service Center at Waco as a consultant to the district.

### Lightning Precautions

In West Texas, it struck someone playing baseball with an aluminum bat. On the Texas coast, another victim was just getting into a car. In Harris County, it happened during an installation of pipe at a construction site.

What happened to all these Texans? They were struck by lightning.

Although lightning is obviously not something that can be eliminated, fear of lightning can be replaced with facts and basic precautions, according to the Insurance Information Institute.

#### ON THE ROAD

Suppose you are driving through flat farmland in Texas. What appeared to be a mild shower off on the horizon seems to be moving inland. More and more lightning streaks across the darkening sky. As you pay closer attention, the grumbling thunder turns into loud frequent claps.

There is no question that you are about to be caught up in the midst of a Texas thunderstorm. It's the kind of storm that may be good for

your parched lawn back home, but it is potentially dangerous and even deadly for you at this moment, depending on what you know and what you do.

If you see a shed off the road, should you stop and seek shelter there until the storm passes over? Is it safe to stay in your car? Should you keep the radio on?

The first thing to do is to remain calm but cautious. If you notice a shift in the weather while traveling in your car, try to tune in to a local radio station to get better idea of the forecast. Once in the midst of a thunderstorm, turn off the radio.

Your metal car is the safest place you can be. Pull over to the side of the road and sit the storm out. Do not touch the metal parts of your car. A convertible car, which is not all-metal, is not safe. If you cannot see any such shelter, crouch down in the open.

Stay away from trees, telephone poles, wire fences, tractors, and anything else that might serve as a conductor of electricity.

The main thing to remember is that you must not be the tallest object in the field. Drop to your knees, bend forward and place your hands on your knees. Wherever you find yourself, be aware that if your hair stands on end or your skin tingles, lightning may be about to strike you. Crouch down at once.

#### IN THE HOME

If the same kind of storm catches you at home, the Institute suggests other precautions.

Avoid windows, doors,

fireplaces, radiators, stoves and metal pipes or sinks. Refrain from using electrical appliances such as radios, TV's, toasters, hair dryers, electric razors. Stay off the telephone-lightning may strike the outside lines. Don't take a shower or bath.

It is important to instruct children about lightning as well. Even a very young child should know to stay out of water during storms and to go indoors if they are playing outside.

#### WITH A VICTIM

If you are with someone who is struck by lightning, you must think clearly and act fast. The victim has received a severe electrical shock and may be burned. They are not "charged" and are perfectly safe to touch. Even if the person appears to be dead, prompt first aid often can revive them.

If they are not breathing, give mouth-to-mouth resuscitation once every five seconds to adults, once every three seconds to infants and small children. If there is no pulse, it is necessary to administer both resuscitation and external cardiac compression.

#### STAY CALM

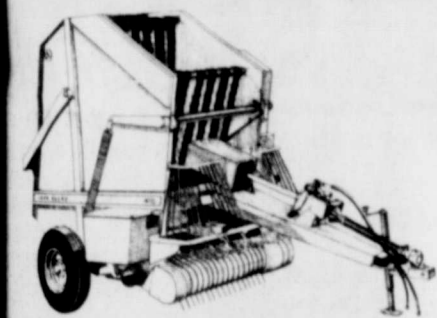

Social Security student beneficiaries were warned today that their monthly checks will stop if they don't complete and return a required school enrollment report.

"This spring, for the first time, school officials are being asked to verify on the form that the student is enrolled on a full-time basis," Ms. Tercero said.

"If a student fails to return the form, or the form comes back without the necessary school certification, the student's monthly checks will be stopped."

Students 18 to 22 may qualify for social security payments if a parent is receiving retirement or disability benefits or has died, Tercero explained.

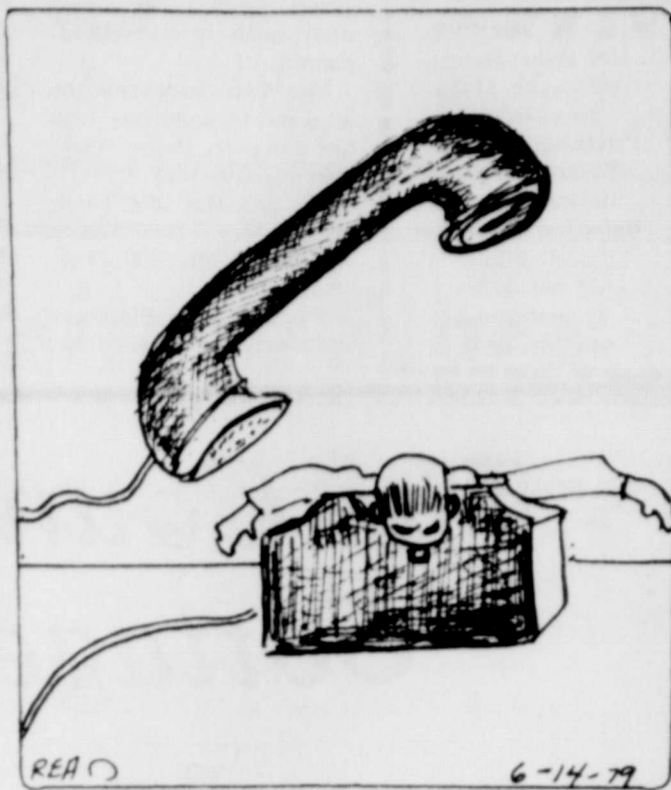
