## Ranchers Receive Nearly \$1 Million In Emergency Funding

Livestock producers in Mills County received \$985,367.92 in emergency feed aid between November 14, 1977 and April 14, 1979 to help them purchase 58,977,976 pounds of feed, it was reported by Lee Roy Schwartz, Chairperson of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation (ASC) committee.

This assistance was provided under the Emergency Conservation Program, administered by the ASCS Office, to help producers provide water and prevent selling of their livestock due to the drought.

235 producers in Mills County. To have been eligible under the emergency program, a farmer must have had a tank or well fail due to the drought. Farmers were reimbursed up to 80% of the cost of the practice for the following: 79 wells, 123 storage tanks, 17 pipelines, and 76 dirt tanks.

"This assistance was provided under our emergency feed program to help livestock producers preserve foundation herds and prevent wide-spread selling or destroying of herds due to natural disaster", Schwartz said. Of the 1017 applications received during the period, 950 were approved.

To have been eligible for the emergency feed funds, farmers must have suffered a substantial loss in the amount of feed normally produced, have had insufficient feed for the period of the disaster, and must have purchased larger - than - normal quantities of feed.

According to Schwartz, participants were reimbursed up to 50% of the cost for feed purchased during the emergency period. This, however, could not exceed two cents per pound in terms of feed grain equivalent.

## Farm Bureau Newsletter

There are many questions that both landowners and taxing agencies have been asking about the recently passed tax relief legislation that the governor signed. The tax relief should go into effect in 1979, but it will go into effect in 1980 (the taxing authorities have no choice in 1980).

This week we will answer four questions on tax relief as follows:

1. What is agricultural use evaluation? Agricultural use evaluation is an alternate method of determining the value of property tax purposes on land that is used for agriculture. The value is calculated according to the agricultural income from the use of the land for

agricultural purposes. It is based on a five year average income determined by categories of similar land.

2. How do I receive this benefit? You must apply with each unit of government that levies property tax on agricultural land (i.e. counties, cities, school districts, junior college districts and other special districts).

3. What do I have to tell them to apply? Very little information is required; only the number of acres in agricultural use and the type of use for the past seven years. No income or personal business information is needed. All of the production and income figures will be obtained from the Soil Conservation service, the Extension service and state universities, not from the taxpayer.

4. Is there any way a taxing unit can deny this tax relief to me? Every agriculture landowner qualifies for this unless the owner is an alien or a business entity owned to a majority extent by an alien who is required to register under federal law. However, a taxing unit's governing body may pass an ordinance or resolution which exempts them from granting this type of treatment in 1979. They cannot do this after 1980.

We have a nice hay crop. Mr. and Mrs. Hugh Nowell are getting their hay baled.

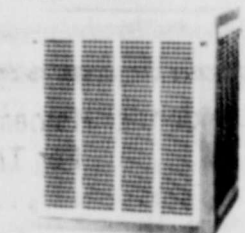

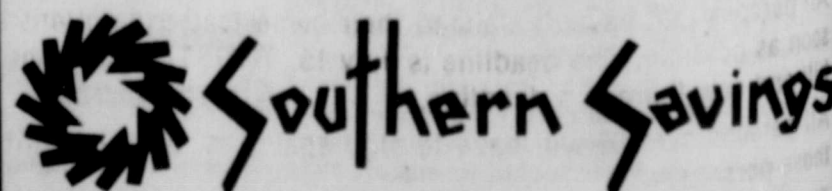

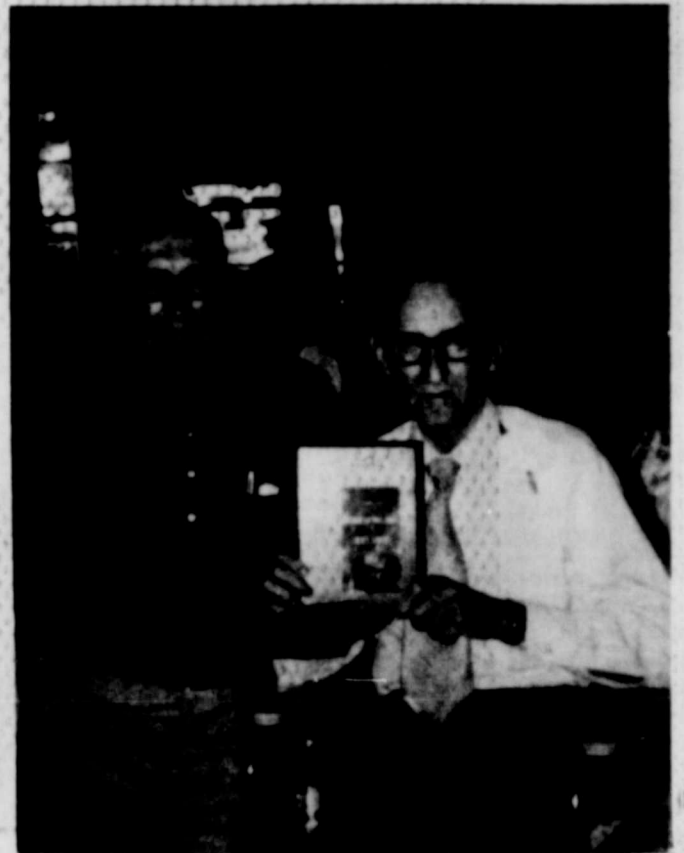
Jake Long was honored

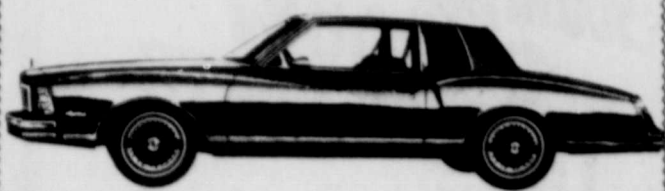

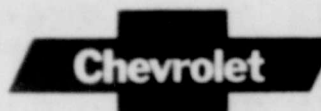

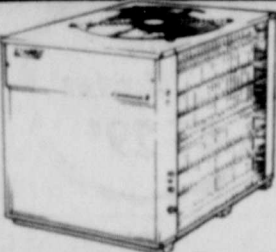
