# Goldthwaite Shows Gain In City Sales Tax Allocations

Texas cities shared \$218 million in rebates from the one percent optional city sales tax during the first six months of this year. State Comptroller Bob Bullock said last week in announcing June's tax allocations.

This figure compares to \$196.4 million that cities received during the same six months during 1978.

The increase represents just about a ten percent overall increase in the state's taxable sales.

In Goldthwaite, the sales tax collections rose

sales tax collections of \$14,551 for June, an increase of seven percent from last year.

• Lampasas dropped

about nine percent in its allocation, collecting \$21,934 in June payments.

• Lometa showed a gain of five percent, collecting 1,303 for the month of June.

• San Saba also recorded a five percent increase in sales tax, receiving \$11,119 for its June allocation.

Metropolitan areas of Texas continued to register the most increases. Hous-

ton's payment for June totaled \$14.3 million, and Dallas \$7.9 million.

Areas along the Texas Gulf Coast and towns in West Texas have recorded the best gains according to the report from the comptroller's office.

Held at the Texas 4-H Center, overlooking Lake Brownwood in Central Texas, the summer camp will include sessions for three age groups and provide food and lodging. Age groups are senior youth (ages 15 & up), youth ages (10-11), and youth ages (12-14).

The Texas 4-H Center features 78 acres of wooded land for outdoor activities; 10 housing units, swimming pool, baseball field, Tennis and Volleyball courts, and facilities for basketball and shuffleboard.

A new amphitheater completes the Center. There will be many camp activities available to the campers.

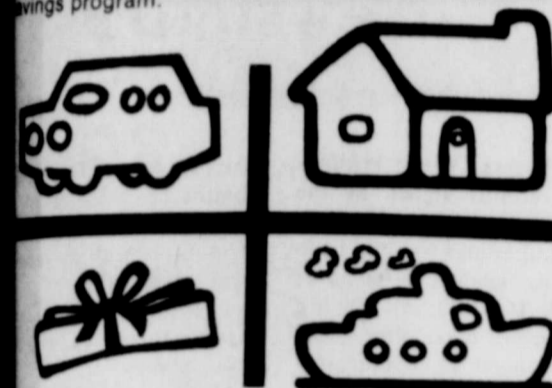

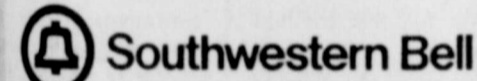

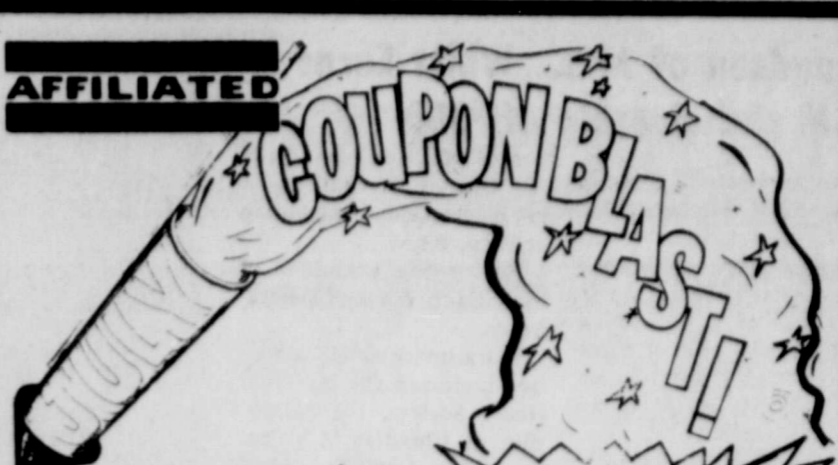
