New Taxation 'Deal' Spawns Local Meeting

1982 Deadline

Officials representing all of the taxing entities of Mills County met last Thursday night in the Courthouse to discuss implementation of Senate Bill 621. Alvis and Maxie Sewalt from the Early School District, along with Mills County Judge Jamie Ledbetter discussed the impact of the bill on the citizens of the county.

S.B. 621 is the new property tax code that will be in full implementation by Jan. 1, 1982. Each county in the State of Texas will be an appraisal district. Under S. B. 621, only one function — the appraisal of property — is taken out of the hands of local officials. This applies to all taxing entities in the county, such as schools, cities, water districts, and counties alike.

A six-member "State Property Tax Board", appointed by the governor, is established to provide for the certification of property appraisers, prepare appraisal manuals, promulgate standards applicable to procedures used by local appraisal officials, and provide technical assistance to local entities. This board will also be responsible for appraising railroad rolling stock and the intangible property of the transportation business.

Each appraisal district will be governed by at least a 5-member Board of Directors appointed by each taxing entity with votes weighted toward the amount of ad valorem taxes levied by each. A three-member "Appraisal Review Board" will be appointed by the Board of Directors to act

as a board of equalization for the entire district.

Counties can now vote to stay out of the appraisal district until they are forced to become a part by a constitutional amendment. Professionals say the amendment will have a 99% chance of passing.

County Judge Ledbetter told the persons at the meeting that "this will be a good law. People who have been rendering their property will not suffer, and will just pay a few cents more for equality," he said. "Those who do not and have never rendered their property are going to get the opportunity to pay for the government and school systems that they have never supported. This equality in taxation will be good," he added.

The Judge believes that the inequality that has evolved throughout the state has spurred this law into full gallop. It certainly will cost more to implement, but everyone will pay their fair share.

"Whether we like it or not, it is the law," Ledbetter said. "I'm hoping that local people will take the attitude that 'it's the law, let's make it work', instead of 'it's the law, and I won't help you.'" The new bill has 122 legally typed pages, crammed with directions for the carrying out of its directives.

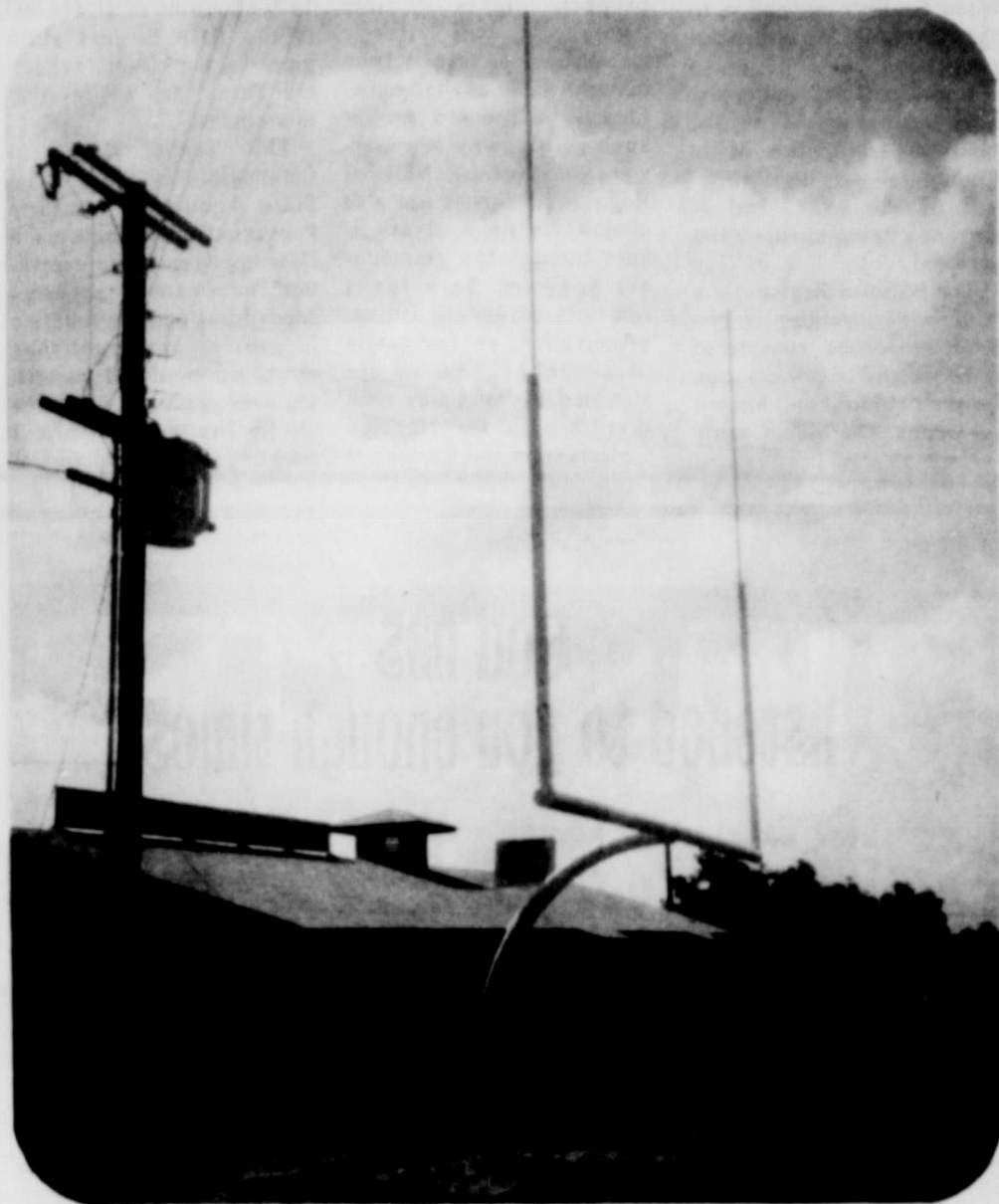
"Our main concern right now is getting five outstanding people to serve as board members," Ledbetter commented. "People

who are well liked and respected in their communities, who have good business sense and who can take possible mental and physical abuse from the taxpayers will be the key to a successful changeover," he said.

"We're worried that this will be the hardest part of implementing the law, finding the people who are willing to take the responsibility in administering the law as it is written," the Judge said.

The cost of the reappraisal will be the salary of a chief appraiser and staff, equipment and office space. The appraisal team prices have ranged from \$13.05 to \$18.50 per parcel. A parcel is a piece of property that requires deeded notes for description. In other words, if a house is situated on two city lots, that property contains two parcels. Initial estimates are that it will cost the whole county about \$125,000 to handle the re-appraisal work. This cost will be divided among all the taxing bodies of the county.

The Eagle will be publishing much more information on this important matter that will doubtless concern taxpayers for many years to come. In cooperation with the office of Judge Ledbetter, a series of explanatory articles will be prepared for Mills County taxpayers.

Col. Speir Tells Texans To

Be Careful On Labor Day Spree

Col. Wilson E. Speir, director of the Texas Department of Public Safety,

today estimated that traffic accidents will claim 37 lives in Texas during the Labor Day holiday weekend.

The holiday runs from 6 p.m. Friday, August 31, to midnight Monday, September 3. During the comparable 78 hour period last year, there was a preliminary death count of 45, with late deaths raising the toll to 62.

"Our estimate is lower this year because, due primarily to the supply and cost of fuel, weekend travel is reduced from 1978. But at the same time, we recognize that traffic will probably increase during Labor Day since it is the last holiday weekend of the summer," Speir said.

"We could easily have more deaths than estimated if drivers fail to put safety first. I would appeal to all motorists to save both fuel and lives by observing the 55 mile speed limit, and am hopeful that persons who are drinking will let others do the driving," he noted.

"People should also be aware that many holiday accidents happen close to home. Deaths in many of our cities are up substantially from 1978 levels, and it is possible that the majority of deaths during the Labor Day holiday will result from accidents in urban areas," Speir added.

To help keep traffic

moving safely, DPS and many local law enforcement agencies will be placing special emphasis on traffic enforcement during the Labor Day weekend. All available DPS Troopers will be on duty statewide, and the department will also work with the news media in the "Operation Motorcade" program which seeks to focus public attention on holiday traffic safety problems.

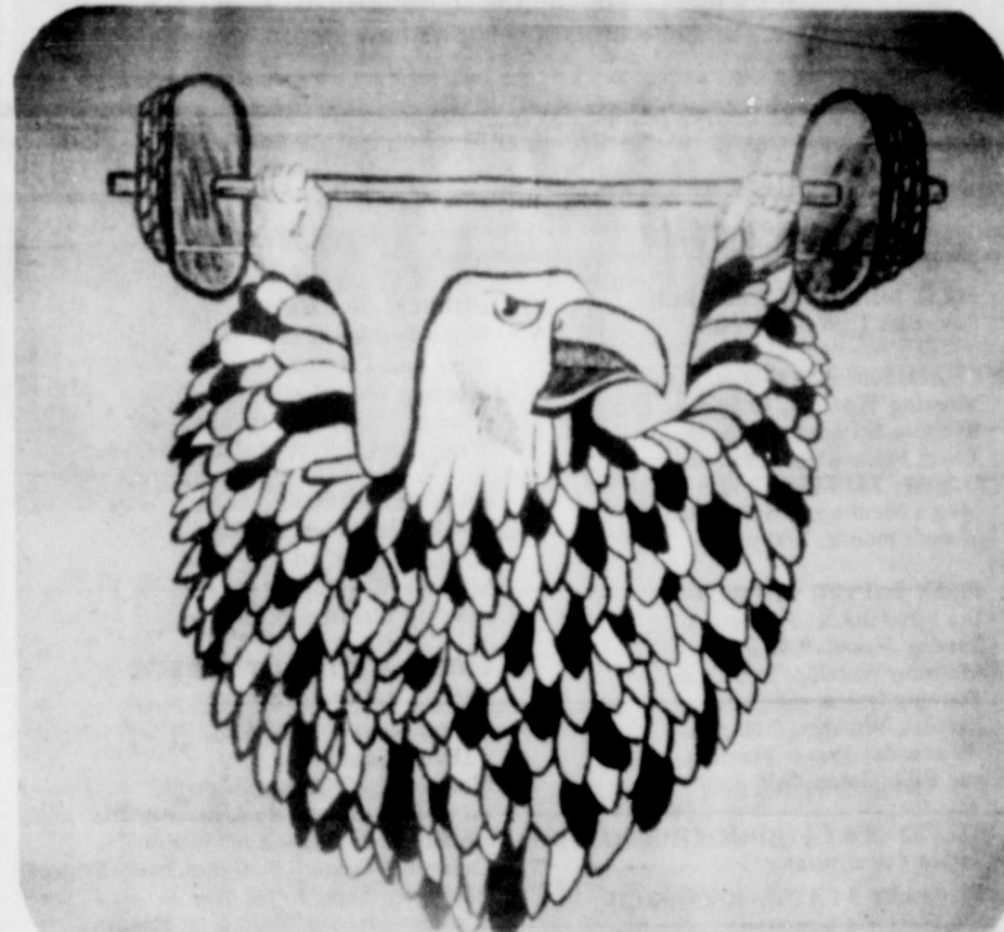

Mills Co. Jailhouse Added To National Register

The Mills County Jailhouse, a significant Mills County historical site, was officially listed in the National Register of Historic Places on May 8, 1979. Nominated for inclusion in the Register by the Texas Historical Commission, the site is now formally recognized for its contribution to the history of the American people.

Built in Goldthwaite just after the county was organized in 1887, the Mills County Jail was in continuous use to 1977, and is currently being updated and restored.

The National Register is a nationwide inventory of historic properties considered to be worthy of preservation for their cultural and historical values. The Mills County

Jailhouse is one of approximately 600 Texas sites of archeological, historical, or architectural significance which have been included in the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966.

This designation does not infringe upon the private property rights of site owners. It does offer a measure of protection from disturbance in any federally-funded or licensed project such as highway or reservoir construction. National Register properties are also eligible for financial assistance through the grants-in-aid program. Such funds can be used for acquisition, preservation, or restoration of the sites. Funds are allocated to the states each year through the Heritage Conservation and Recreation

Service of the Interior Department. The money is administered in Texas by the National Register office of the Texas Historical Commission, under the direction of Truett Latimer, State Historic Preservation Officer and Executive Director of the agency. Texas' 1979 allocation of \$1,494,000 is the fifth largest state grant in the nation, reflecting Texas' active preservation efforts.

The Texas Historical Commission is the Official State Agency for Historic Preservation. It acts as a clearinghouse for preservation information, sponsors educational and consultation programs, and publishes preservation-related materials. The agency is responsible for the state historical marker program and for an

extensive program of workshops, publications, and services in the fields of preservation, archeology, and museology. The Commission works closely with a network of 250 county historical commissions as well as 237 non-profit heritage organizations in the state.

Dear Editor:

On July 20, 1979, President Carter replaced Nixon's 1972 executive order that divided the United States into 10 federal regions by one which is more radical. The goal is the elimination of states' rights and the extension of federal control.

Regionalism sets up a new unelected political order of bureaucrats appointed by the President and not responsible to the electorate. This new regional government bureaucracy will direct every economic activity including the way you use your own land. It will coordinate the development and growth management activities now performed by the governments of states, counties and

I sometimes find myself being too critical of others. My dutiful wife, from time to time, reminds me of such "mote-gloating" and tells me, "Doug, you're just looking for things to be critical about." I'm afraid she's right. And I'm afraid all of us are and have been guilty at one time or another of searching for the seam and crack in someone else's character. We forget about the "2 X 4" in our own eyes while looking for the particles and shavings in another's.

Jesus referred to this in His sermon from the mountain side. He sternly cautions us about staring at the speck of sawdust in our brother or sister's eye, while ignoring the wall studs in our own. The Master Carpenter handed down the right rule when, in effect, He said, "Get rid of the beam of timber in your own eye and then you can see clearly how to take the tiny speck out of your brother's eye."

The message of Matthew 7:1-5 might be paraphrased to read like this: "Do not be critical of another. When you are, remember you will be judged by the same measure."

Implied in Christ's teaching here is a principle called "The benefit of the second look". It instructs us to take a second look because none of us are perfect. Take a second look because what we think we see may not be a true and accurate picture. Take a second look to see our own faults.

I remember reading a

brief article in Reader Digest back in 1971. The article was about a young writer who was searching for a main character for her book. She wanted what she called "local color" and character from a shiffling impoverished community. She thought she knew where to find such a place and took off to an area of run-down farms, seedy men and washed-out women. Students Pay Tribute To Miss Nelson

Any time a group of GHS students gather to call any period between the 1940's and 1960's, the discussion will eventually lead to Miss Laura Nelson. She was long enough and you will learn of her stern, high mannerisms that outwardly masked her genuine care and concern for her students and the stories that linger to prove her dry

wit and sense of humor. Mrs. T. J. Blackburn recalls walking past Miss Nelson's classroom and observing two girls cheating during a test. "I called Miss Nelson to the door and told her about the cheating," and Miss Nelson replied, "I know, but the two of them together couldn't make a passing grade." Mikey Skiles, a 1964

graduate, recalls writing her a letter to request her presence at a class reunion. She was unable to attend due to illness, but she corrected the grammar, spelling and punctuation marks in his letter and returned it to him!

Janell Jernigan Sherwood tells about helping Miss Nelson average grades for report cards. "We averaged Jack Edington's grade several different ways in hopes it would come to a passing grade, but it always came to 69." Miss Nelson finally said, "What the heck! Make it 70. He's a good kid."

Miss Nelson was born March 11, 1898 in Big

Valley. Her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Walter Nelson, were pioneer citizens of that community. While in high school at Goldthwaite, she lived with her great aunt, Mrs. H. P. Smith, the widow of Dr. H. P. Smith, one of the early doctors in Mills County. She received a B.A. degree from Southwestern University, Georgetown, and did graduate work at the University of Texas and Howard Payne University. She taught 39 years in the Texas public schools, 19 of these years were spent in GHS as an instructor in English and Spanish.

She began her work here

in 1945 and retired in 1965. In addition to her work in the Goldthwaite Schools, Miss Nelson taught in Seagoville, Florence, Melvin, Mullin, Eagle Pass, and Marfa. Miss Nelson died on March 30, 1979, after a lengthy illness, and was buried at Lower Big Valley Cemetery, southwest of Goldthwaite. Survivors include two sisters, Evelyn Weaver and Nancy Bohannon, both of Goldthwaite, a brother Hugh Nelson of California, and a number of nieces and nephews.

Among her collection of valuables and papers are several poems she wrote. Some are religious, some humorous, some quite serious, and some are even addressed to her students.

This poem was written to someone named 'Patsy'.

YOUR GRADUATION

As you live,
Do the things you want to do;
To get the most from life
From the beginning, for
You'll be here only once.
Since you're here,

Miss Nelson was highly respected by her co-workers and students, but many students failed to completely appreciate the strong foundation they acquired from her in English and Spanish until they began college.

To the many teachers dedicated to students and to learning, and to Miss Nelson, Thank You.

- Although there are many chemicals, including alcohol, that can mask stress symptoms, they do not help you adjust to the stress itself. The ability to handle stress comes from within you, not from outside.

- Get enough sleep and rest.

- Schedule time for recreation to relax your mind.

- Do something for others. Sometimes when

you are distressed, you concentrate too much on yourself and your situation. When this happens, it is wise to do something for others, and get your mind off yourself.

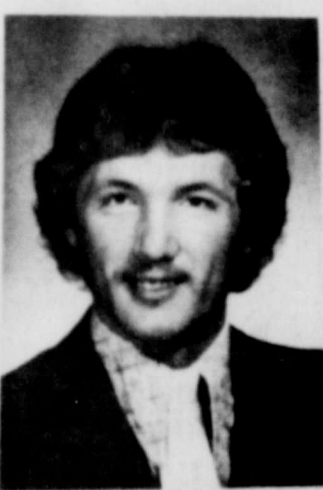
