Football '79 Opens In Mills County This Week

Three Mills County football teams face action at the start of the 1979 season this week as the Mullin Bulldogs will take on Gustine Thursday at 8 p.m.

The Goldthwaite Eagles will do battle with Hico's Tigers here Friday at 8:00 p.m.

Following is a brief rundown of the angles associated with the local contests:

Goldthwaite

With 27 men to suit up for the game Friday, the Eagles are in good numbers for a real fine effort. The absence of a Junior Varsity team makes the local varsity team larger. Several players will be coming off the injured list to play in the opening contest for 1979.

Eagle Coach Joe Winchell said "We feel like Lometa played real outstanding in the scrimmage last Friday night, and we benefited greatly from the outing."

"Scrimmages are for the benefit of improving on mistakes and experimenting with offense and defense. We feel like that we can correct mistakes that we made in the scrimmage that were minor and can play real fine football against Hico," Winchell said.

"Our kids are looking forward to playing Hico and we think we will be ready to play with a lot of intensity and a lot of desire Friday night," he added.

"After looking at the film of the Lometa scrimmage, we were real pleased at how the offensive line blocked. Especially proud were we of Carson Padgett, Troyce Wilcox, Gary Mullins, Bart

McFarland and Stephen Ray Schwartz," Winchell said.

"The defense played well too. We thought Ricky Johnson, Ricky Corona, Jeff Stephens, Carson Padgett, Tony Corona, Jeff Stephens, Tony Corona, Bart McFarland, Ted Tucker and Stephen Schwartz did a real good job," the Eagle coach said.

"Overall, the scrimmage went well. Due to mental mistakes, six fumbles and two pass interceptions, our moving the ball was limited. Getting people off the injured list will help this situation," he said.

Mullin

The Bulldogs begin the year in a "do-or-die" game against Gustine. Because of the ten teams in the six-man district this year, the first game will be a district encounter. The Gustine and Mullin six-man units are highly respected this year and both are to be considered contenders for the district crown.

Coach Alan Luker reports the 'Dogs fared well in scrimmages and generally have looked good.

The game will be Thursday at 8 p.m. at the Mullin field.

Supt. A. R. Whisenhunt has issued a special invitation to Goldthwaite fans to come out and see a fine, fast-moving six-man football game.

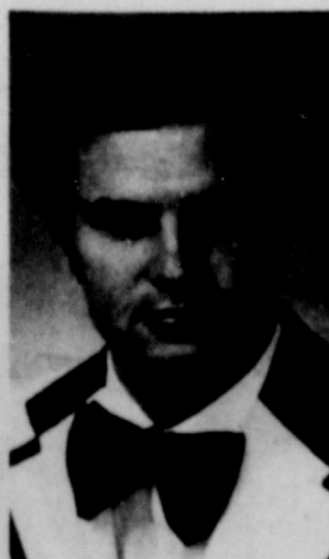
United Fund Annual Meeting Next Tuesday

Mullin Has Biggest Jump — Overall County School Enrollment Advances Over 1978 Figures

ENROLLMENT in the four schools of Mills County is up over four percent, compared to 1978 figures. The total enrollment of students in Goldthwaite, Star, Mullin and Priddy was 723 in 1979, as compared to 696 at the beginning of the 1978 school year.

Mullin and Priddy enrollments were responsible for the gains, while Goldthwaite dipped slightly, and Star remained the same as the previous year.

"MULLIN HAS the largest enrollment in 25 years," according to Superintendent A. R. Whisenhunt. The total registered at Mullin is 150, up from 123 a year ago. The increase amounts to nearly 14 percent over last year. Things are doing fine and as expected at Mullin's schools, according to Whisenhunt.

JAMES WHITEHEAD, Superintendent at Priddy, told the Eagle Tuesday that a total of 88 had registered for class in the twelve grades there. This represents a

gain of over 17 percent over the 1978 total of 75 students. Everything appears to be off to a good start at Priddy.

The new enrollment figures represent an average number of students. The 1978 figures were very low, according to other years.

ENROLLMENT AT STAR remained exactly the same as in 1978, according to Superintendent James Ethridge. Students registering totaled 77.

Star's school has had a lot of refurbishing during the summer months. A new gym floor and roof has been installed. A new store room addition has been made to the lunchroom. The gym also has received a new scoreboard and clock, and plans are underway for a new football clock.

Money is not currently available for the total price of the football scoreboard, according to Ethridge, and persons wishing to donate may contact him at the Star school office.

The funds for the new gym clock came from the booster club who sponsored the local volleyball tournaments, of which Ethridge is extremely appreciative and proud.

GOLDTHWAITE has a total of 408 students on the roll for 1979, down from 421 last year, according to Superintendent Gilbert Davis.

Davis reported that the summer was jam packed with maintenance work at the school plant. Landscaping work, painting and general repairs were the order of the day throughout the summer months in preparation for the flow of students and teachers.

Individual class figures for Goldthwaite are: first grade, 26; second, 38; third, 34; fourth, 25; fifth, 34; sixth, 35; seventh, 30; eighth, 37; ninth, 43; tenth, 32; eleventh, 21, and twelfth, 38.

Kindergarten has 40 enrolled at Goldthwaite elementary.

"Double batching" enables homemakers to get two dinners from one recipe—provided extra freezer space is available.

Simply cook a double amount of a favorite recipe. Serve one batch, and freeze the other for later use.

To freeze, prepare the food in the usual way except

double the recipe and cook it until almost done.

Frozen meats and vegetables easily become overcooked when reheated if they are completely cooked before freezing.

Season lightly during preparation, because pepper, cloves and synthetic vanilla tend to become strong and bitter when used in frozen foods. Add more seasoning just before serving.

Add crumb and cheese toppings to the frozen food just before reheating.

Use proper freezing containers and follow recommended freezing procedure.

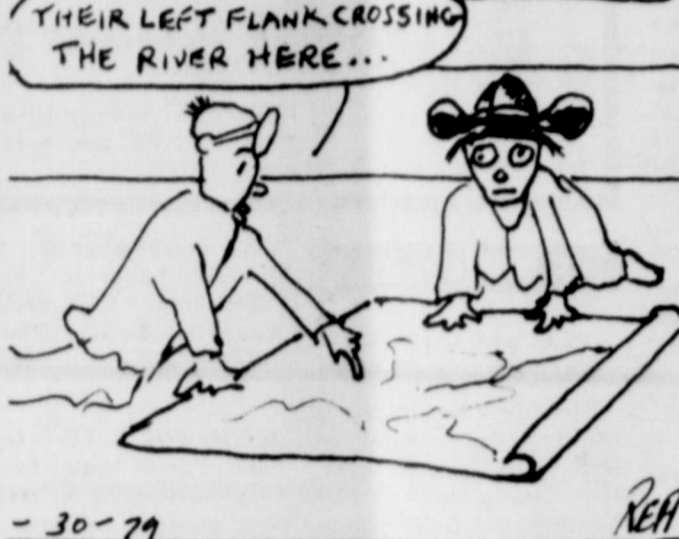

Chamber Comments

Q. How much does it cost to be a member of the Chamber of Commerce and Agriculture?

A. The schedule for dues is: Individual membership . . . \$36
Business—
No employees \$36
One employee \$48
Two employees \$60
Three employees \$72
Four employees \$84
Five or more \$100

Q. Whew! Well, I sort of hope this chamber idea works. If it does, I just might join up. Don't you think it's smarter to wait and see what happens before I shell out 36 dollars?

Q. Your question reminds me of a doctor who looks at a sick patient and asks, "Well, should I treat him? He's not dead yet!"

Q. Are you saying Mills County is sick or something?

A. Sad to say, Yes. There's nothing wrong with the people here certainly. None finer anywhere! But the county is dying and has been for some time, and there are statistics to prove it.

Q. Sure, sure. You can prove anything with statistics.

A. No, you can't. You can't prove that Mills County is growing. Since 1950 the total population has declined steadily. Just recently (1970-1975) the total population dropped 4.6% and our average age keeps getting higher. For instance, the last available figures show that people from ages 55-59 totaled

1,210, while there were only 151 people in the whole county between the ages of 25 and 29. That means that there are not nearly as many young adults in Mills County as there used to be. And that one fact alone affects schools, income and job force.

Q. Well, so what. I don't want Mills County to be a big metropolitan area anyway.

A. Your Chamber doesn't want that either. We want Mills County to retain all of the values associated with a rural way of life. But we don't want to see the county decline so much that we have to be dependent on other areas for our livelihood.

Q. Is that really a possibility?

A. Ask some people who have lived in a small community what has happened when all its young people moved away. First, the schools go, and then many businesses can't make enough money to continue. And if other jobs aren't available to supplement income, many young people are unable or unwilling to take on trying to make a living solely on the family farm. The number of farms in Mills County [as well as total acreage in farming] has declined over 10% in the last 10 years.

Q. And you think the Chamber will have all the answers?

A. No. But we're going to find some of them. Whether it's helping our businesses and industries expand to provide more jobs, or promoting outside "money flow" in to the county, we're going to work . . . NOW.

Q. And you really think that if everyone got behind this Chamber that it will make a difference?

A. Absolutely. The way your Chamber figures it, we'd rather be fighting for Mills County and all the good that is here, than to shake our heads 20 years from now and moan, "Ain't it sad." But planning for 20 years from now is only one goal of the Chamber. We're also interested in you now.

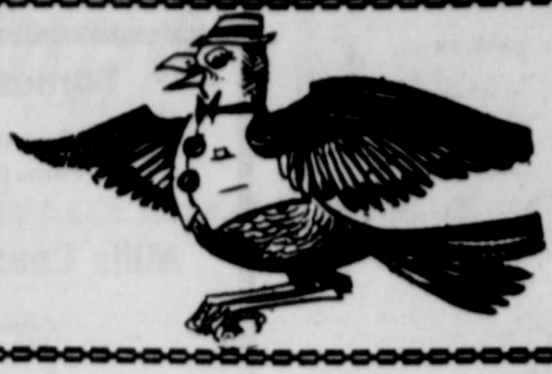
