Men's Bible Class Sets Annual Singing

The Goldthwaite Men's Bible Class will sponsor their annual gospel singing on Sunday, Oct. 21, 7:30 p.m. at the High School auditorium.

The class is observing its 25th anniversary this October. The non-denominational class was started by a group of men in 1949 (many whom are now deceased). It saw a need for a place to attend Bible study and participate in gospel singing, sharing with the sick, praying and unfortunate, their time, talents and money. Since that time, they have received cards, visits and help from Bible class members. One of the charter members, the late Ches Frazier, was instrumental in getting the gospel singing started when the Bible class began meetings a month on Friday night at the Baptist Church here, which is now the First Youth Center.

In 1950 the first annual singing was held under the leadership of Mr. Frazier and the late Bill Huggins. The singing was on the fourth Sunday of October. Each year since 1950 the Bible class has sponsored gospel singing

and also many years furnished barbecue prepared by Bill Fox. Mr. Fox was one of the early members and is still a regular attendee, always the first man to be at the Mills County State Bank Community Room to unlock the doors and greet members each Sunday.

The Bible class decided not to furnish free barbecue this year because of increased costs, but will continue to send cards, flowers and help in improving our community.

This is an excellent time of the year to clean up yards and flower beds. Fallen leaves and dead plant material are fine places for insects to winter and get a headstart next spring!

37-0 Loss - Eagles Find Early Quickness 'Too Much'

people at skill positions," Winchell reported of this week's opponent.

The quickness and speed of the Early Longhorns was the main concern of Goldthwaite head coach Joe Winchell, and for good reason.

The Longhorns' speedy running backs ran wide with great success and their quick, stunting defense kept the Eagles bottled up all night as the Longhorns romped to a 37-0 victory over the Eagles last Friday.

The Goldthwaite defense plugged up the inside running game of Early but when the Longhorns ran wide, they did so with ease.

"Our defense played pretty well", commented Winchell. His main defensive concerns are giving up the big play and the failure of the Eagles to make one-on-one tackles.

Linebacker Jeff Stephens led the defensive effort as he made numerous tackles, especially in the second half. He had help from Carson Padgett, David Livingston, Chris Boykin, Stephen Schwartz and Tony and Ricky Corona.

The Eagles' offense never got untracked during the game. The offense was held to minus 17 yards rushing and 37 yards passing.

"Our young, inexperienced (offensive) line couldn't pick up their stunting," Winchell stated. "They have a good, quick defense."

Early broke the game open in the second quarter, after leading by only 2-0 at the end of the opening period.

The Longhorns made it 10-0 on James Adams' 24-yard run with 10 minutes left in the half.

On the Eagles' next possession, Ted Tucker's screen pass was intercepted and returned 20 yards for the touchdown. That increased Early's lead to 16-0 with 8:44 left.

The hosts added a third TD before halftime for a 22-0 advantage.

Early took the second half kickoff and drove to the Eagle 4-yard line before the Eagle defense slammed the door and stopped the "Horns."

However, the Longhorn defense stopped the Eagles, who had to punt from their own 14-yard line.

The punt gave Early the ball on the Eagle 43 and the Longhorns scored 8 plays later to make it 30-0 with 1:22 to play in the third quarter.

Early's final score came after a snap went over punter Kenny Saathoff's head. He fell on the ball at the Eagle 5-yard line. Adams' one-yard run capped the short drive.

The only points of the first quarter came when Saathoff, punting from deep in his end zone, stepped out of it for an automatic safety.

Injuries hampered the Eagles' effort as Stephens, Livingston, Coy Hammond, Boykin and Padgett all played with injuries.

The Eagles, 0-5 for the season and 0-2 in District 10-A play, host the Bangs Dragons Friday night at Eagle Field. The homecoming game for the Eagles will begin at 7:30 p.m.

The Dragons will operate offensively out of the wing-T. Leading the Dragons will be quarterback Barry McCorkle, fullback Tom Koen and wingback Rob McKinney, who is possessed of 9.9 speed for 100 yards.

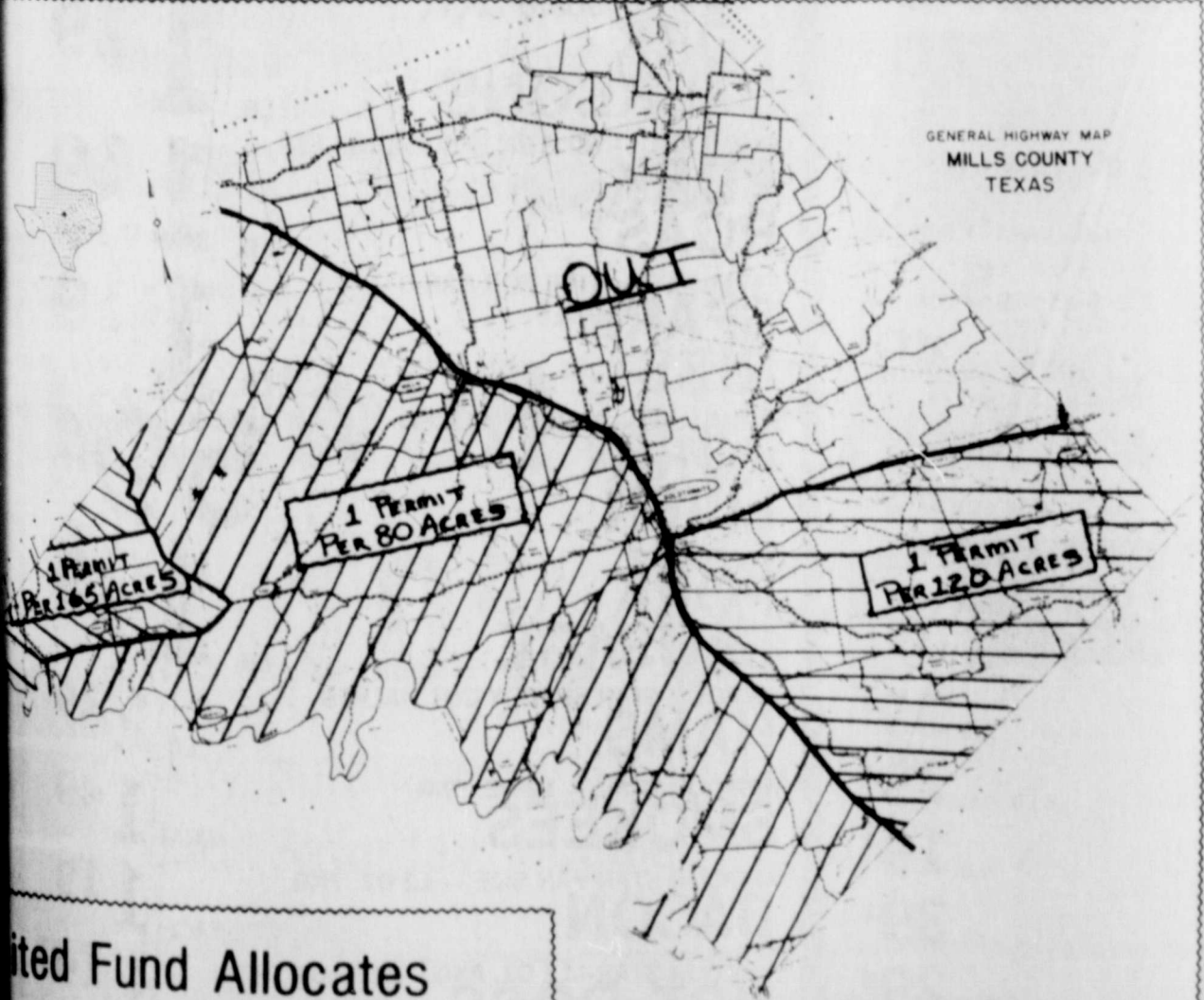

Antlerless Deer Permits Issue Date October 30 For Mills Co.

The Texas Parks & Wildlife Department will issue antlerless deer permits for Mills County on October 30, from 8-12 noon and 1-5 p.m. in the County Courthouse.

A map with antlerless deer permit issuance rates and issuance compartments will be posted in the Mills County Courthouse prior to the issuance date. To qualify for at least one permit, a landowner must own or control acreage at least equal to one-half of the permit issuance rate of the compartment where the tract is located.

If someone other than the landowner wishes to obtain permits, a letter of authorization from the landowner will be necessary.

A larger map showing the issuance rates and areas will be posted in the Courthouse.

The bag limit in those areas receiving antlerless deer permits is three deer, no more than two bucks and antlerless deer by permit only. In those areas not receiving permits, the bag limit will be two buck deer only.

The deer season opens November 17 and runs through January 1.

Limited Fund Allocates \$625 To Senior Center

Mills County United has allocated \$1625 to Mills County Senior Center, which is located on Old Priddy Road, Goldthwaite.

During the past year, 681 citizens have participated in the activities at the Center. The Center is open from 8 to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. One of the popular activities is a noon meal served each day, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. Donations are needed for these lunches. The first Wednesday of each month a salad lunch is served and birthdays

and anniversaries are celebrated. The second Wednesday is marked by a covered dish luncheon.

Special services include a health clinic held each 4th Wednesday, a Social Security consultant visits twice a month, a V.A. representative is there each Tuesday, and a housing assistance representative is also present to aid the Senior Citizens.

The Center also sponsors trips, bazaars, special parties, game tournaments and crafts and games each day. Scheduled transportation to Mullin, Star and Priddy, as well as Goldthwaite, is also included.

A. The Rent and Lease List. This is a free service for all people who have properties for rent or lease in the county.

Q. How does that work?

A. If you have any property for rent or lease, call the Chamber office and ask to list that property. Then when anyone calls us and asks about available property, we will refer them to you.

Q. What kinds of properties are you talking about?

A. All kinds. Houses, apartments, business locations, warehouses, ranch land, hunting leases, you name it.

Q. You mean if I have a lot of grass on my ranch and would like to pasture some extra livestock on it for, say, six months, I could call you and list that with the Chamber?

A. Sure. Our hunting leases

have worked so well, that we wanted to expand this aspect of our service. We will simply be a referral agent to help you rent out your property.

Q. What if I want to sell some property? Can I list that too?

A. No. This is exclusively for renting and leasing.

Q. Do I have to be a Chamber member to take advantage of your Rent and Lease List?

A. No.

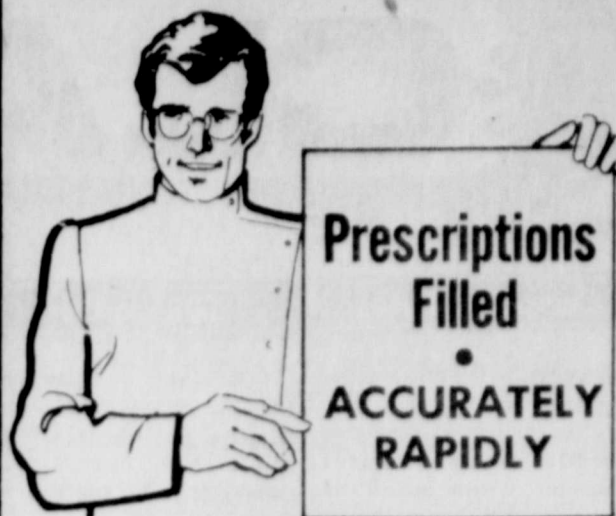
Dear Mr. Davis:
