"The night was wrapped in an ocean fog, there was no moon and no stars..."

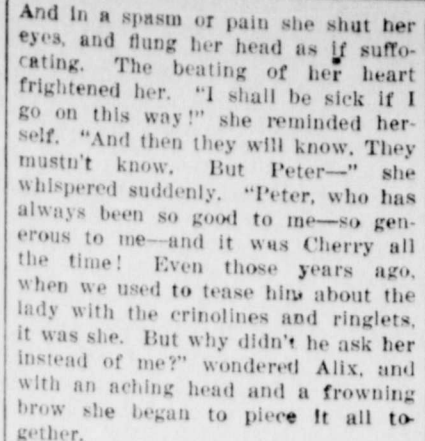
"I'm a poor person with whom to discuss...

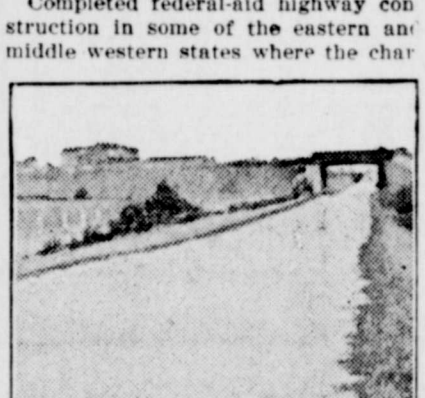
Highway Improvement

FEDERAL-AID HIGHWAY WORK Texas Leads in Mileage With 1,116.4 Miles, With Minnesota Ranking a Close Second.

Measuring the network of federal-aid highways spread over the country during the past 5 years, the bureau of public roads, United States Department of Agriculture, places their total length, January 1 last, at 28,741.6 miles...

Illinois, 722.9 miles costing \$24,608,358, of which \$11,221,464 was paid by the federal government...

Projects under construction and the degree of completion January 1 in other states were as follows:

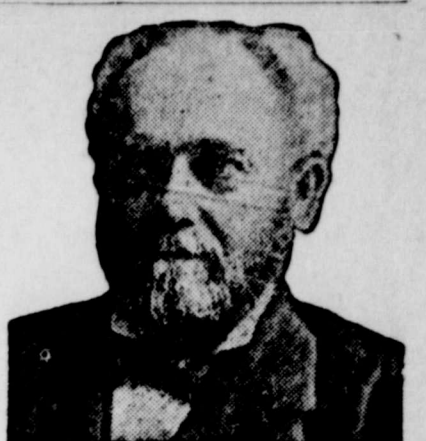
California, 382.9 miles, 55 per cent complete; Georgia, 492.9 miles, 65 per cent complete...

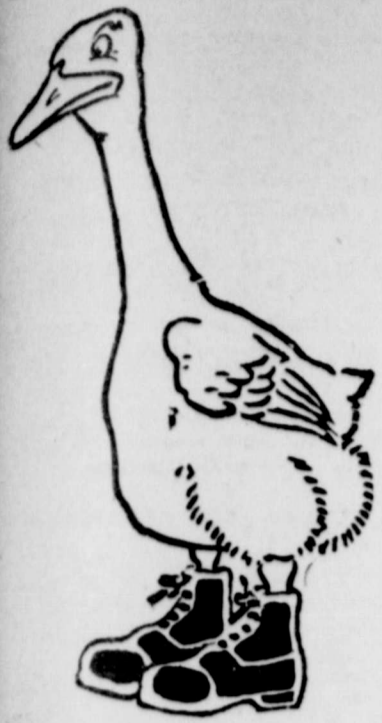

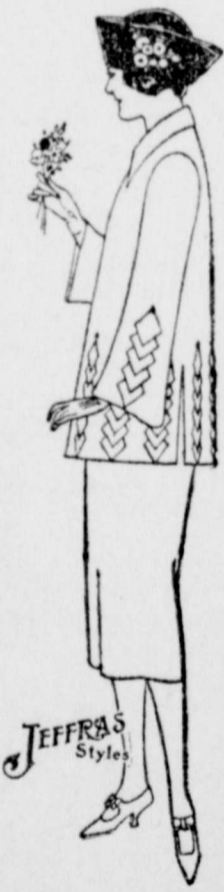
