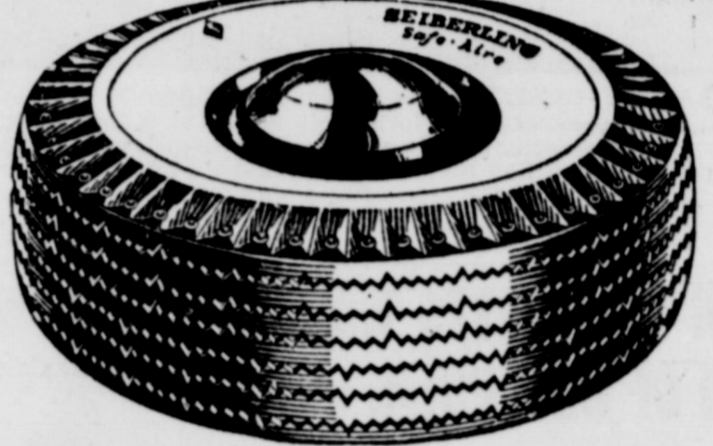

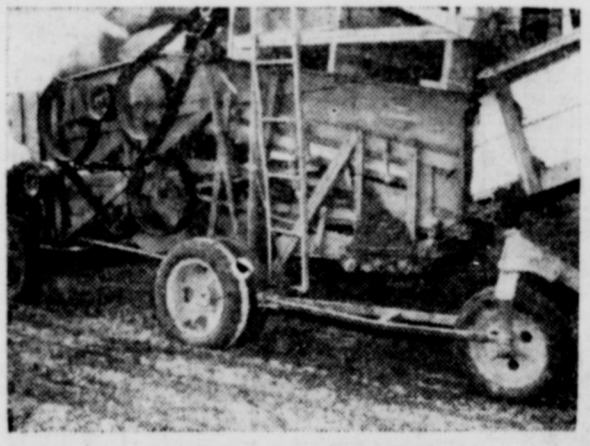

The vines from this peanut thresher will go to feed livestock and the nuts will go to market.

Properly cured, leafy peanut hay is practically equal to alfalfa for dairy and beef cattle. A ton of choice peanut hay contains about 200 pounds of protein, the equivalent of about 450 pounds of cottonseed meal.

But some portion of the nuts leaving the threshing machine are destined to see the inside of a glue factory. Glues are made from peanut meal and are suitable for making gummed tape and paper. That package you have which is tied with gummed tape may be the product of a peanut field.

With the right program peanuts can be a profitable crop. If you need late information on peanut growing, ask your County Agent.

### Typhoon Lashes Okinawa; Heads For Japan Isle

TOKYO, Aug. 16—An erratic Pacific typhoon which battered the American military base on Okinawa with 110-miles an hour winds, switched directions Saturday and was believed headed toward the southern Japanese island of Kyushu.

The destructive gale, which did "thousands of dollars" damage to U. S. Army property on Okinawa, at first was thought to be going up the north China coastline.

But Japanese weather observers said later reports indicated it was moving northeast in the direction of Kyushu.

The storm, dubbed "Typhoon Karen," smashed communications facilities, flooded military installations, and dislodged roofs and doors on the U. S.-held island. Four persons were reported injured.

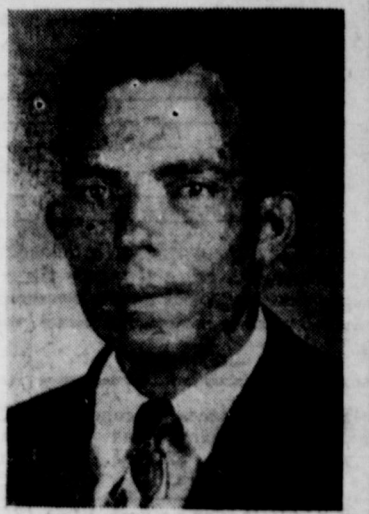
