







### Formal Double-Ring Ceremony In Baptist Church Unites Miss Alsobrook, Mr. Hardwick

Miss Anna Margaret Alsobrook, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. B. B. Alsobrook, 1407 North Fourth Place, Lamesa, became the bride of James Robert Hardwick at 7:30 p. m. Friday, Aug. 29, 1952, in a ceremony in the First Baptist Church, Lamesa.

Mr. Hardwick is the son of Mrs. Stella Lou Hardwick, 1005 North 12th St., Lamesa, and Mr. Ray Hardwick of Killeen.

The Rev. Robert L. Butler of Sweetwater, uncle of the bride, was the officiant. The double ring vows were read before an altar banked with greenery and yellow gladioli. A tall archway, under which the minister stood, was entwined with fern studded with gladioli. Tall white Cathedral tapers in branched candelabra completed the setting.

Miss Grace Dossett of Hillsboro, former college room mate of the bride, played a medley of pre-nuptial music and accompanied Miss Darlene Mayfield, soloist, who sang, "Wonderful One" and "Because."

The bride was given in marriage to her father. She wore an original model wedding gown of Chantilly-type lace and nylon tulle over tulle and satin, fashioned with a sheer drop shouldered yoke outlined and embroidered with lace applique. The fitted lace bodice had long sleeves ending in points over the hands. The voluminous ballerina-length skirt of tulle and lace was worn over crinoline to emphasize its fullness.
