Ceilings Expected To Bring Drop In Cottonseed Price

DALLAS—Action by the Office of Price Stabilization in setting new dollar-and-cents ceilings on cottonseed feed products generally result in lower selling prices in Texas and Oklahoma will generally result in lower selling prices, F. C. Tomlinson, OFS regional food chief, has announced.

Tomlinson said the new regulation (CFR 167, effective August 25) rolls back and fixes processors' ceilings in this area which are from \$2 to \$5 per ton less than previous prevailing prices for all cottonseed feed products, including cotton seed cake, flake, meal, seed cake, pellets, cubes, hulls, hull bran and cottonseed feed.

The OFS action in setting lower ceiling was taken to place all processors on the same basis in their producing areas, Tomlinson declared. The regulation now permits only one mark-up at each

marketing level for the products, and should eliminate speculative practices of pyramiding mark-ups which have resulted in increasing prices to feeders.

New ceilings, to ob. the mills in the States of Texas, Oklahoma, New Mexico, and Arizona are \$82 per ton for bulk cottonseed meal, \$83 for bulk sized cake, \$84.25 for pellets and cubes and \$25 per ton for bulk cottonseed hulls.

Subject to the addition of any actual transportation charges, the following prices, Mr. Tomlinson said, are what feeders can expect

to pay for cottonseed feed products under the new regulation: Cottonseed meal, \$88.60 to \$92.25 per ton; cottonseed pellets and cubes, \$90.85 to \$98.50 per ton; cottonseed cake and sized cake, \$89.60 to \$97.25 per ton; and cottonseed hulls—\$50.50 to \$52.75 per ton.

Mr. Tomlinson explained that the actual selling prices permitted by OFS are dependent on whether feed purchases are made at the mills or from retailers, and the type of sacking involved.

Jack Bishop Is Honored



Texas Congress Of Parent-Teachers To Present Program Workshops

Program demonstrations, taking the place of former workshops, will be an innovation this year at the state convention of the Texas Congress of Parents and Teachers in Wichita Falls, November 19-21.

Demonstration teams will consider, during a one-day period, 4 problems concerning the local unit as follows: 1. The local unit defines its program of work for the year and provides for a participating membership; 2. the local unit organizes and conducts study groups; 3. the local unit works effectively for legislation relating to child welfare; 4. the local unit engages in ethical money raising and spending.

The eight demonstration teams, now being selected from over the state, will consider the four problems in a variety of presentations. Delegates will be separated into eight groupings. As each delegate registers, he will be assigned to a certain auditorium where he will remain during the demonstrations. Only the teams will be on the move. In each delegate group will be a president, hostesses, analyzer, summarizer, consultant, recorder and guides.

Chairman of the steering committee and coordinator of teams is Dr. Byron England of El Paso, state chairman of high school service; other members are Dr. R. L. Sutherland of Hogg Foundation, University of Texas, demonstration director; Dr. L. D. Haskew and Ralph Duke, also of the University; C. E. Sanderson of Austin, expeditor; Mrs. H. G. Stinnett of Plainview, state president of the Texas Congress; state vice president—Mrs. C. R. Larimer, Houston.

Chairman—Mrs. Leon Price; Dallas; state chairman—Mrs. Warren Fread and Mrs. F. C. McConnell, Austin; C. E. Burnett, Harlingen.

Governor Allan Shivers, in an official memorandum, has designated October as membership enrollment month for the Texas Congress of Parents and Teachers. It has become a tradition for the governor to extend this courtesy to the parent-teacher associations. The governor is a life member of the state organization.

In the 43 years of its existence, membership in the state has grown to 401,541, ranking Texas fourth among the states; the national membership now being 7,219,165 men and women. During membership enrollment month, P.T.A.'s over the state will seek to enroll men and women interested in the welfare of children and youth.
