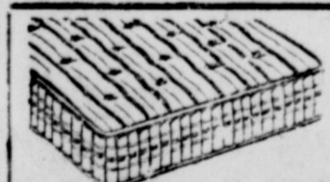

Heart Diseases And Cancer Now Lead In Deaths

Nearly three quarters of the \$335,000,000 paid to beneficiaries of deceased policyholders by the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company last year was for deaths from diseases of the heart and blood vessels, or from cancer.

About 55 percent of the payments—\$184,000,000—was for deaths from diseases of the heart and blood vessels. Twenty-five years ago the proportion paid out for these diseases was only 31 percent.

Cancer death claim payments totaled nearly \$62,000,000 or over 18 percent of the total, as compared with 10 percent 25 years ago.

The increase in the proportion of payments for the chronic degenerative diseases, the company statisticians explain, reflects not only the reduction in mortality from the acute conditions—particularly pneumonia, influenza, and tuberculosis—but also the

growing percentage of policyholders at the older ages.

The external causes of death accounted for approximately one ninth of the claim payments during the year. Slight increases in payments on account of accidental deaths and homicide were counterbalanced by declines for suicide and for deaths from enemy action.

In 1952 the payments for deaths from enemy action in Korea amounted to \$858,000, somewhat more than half the amount of the corresponding 1951 payments.

The total amount paid out in death claims during the year was the highest in the company's history, exceeding by \$23,000,000 the 1951 figure, and well over three times the total 25 years earlier. The rise is the result, the statisticians observe, of growth in the number of persons insured by the company and an increase in the amount of the average policy.

About \$4,500,000 was paid out on some 6,000 death claims of persons insured under policies which had been in force less than one year. In 1,886 of these cases the policy had been in force less than three months.

You Need Beer to Keep Tavern Open

WYOCENA, Wis. — Operators of two taverns here will have to close because, although they may sell hard liquor, they can't sell beer.

In a recent referendum, voters decided to outlaw the sale of beer in the village, but to allow hard liquor to be bought in taverns.

One saloon owner said it's impossible to operate a tavern if drinkers aren't allowed to buy beer.

MONTPELIER, Vt. — Some 87 per cent of Vermont's 22,003 farms now get electric service, according to the state public service commission. A total 19,123 receive electric service now, a gain of 1,215 in the past two years.

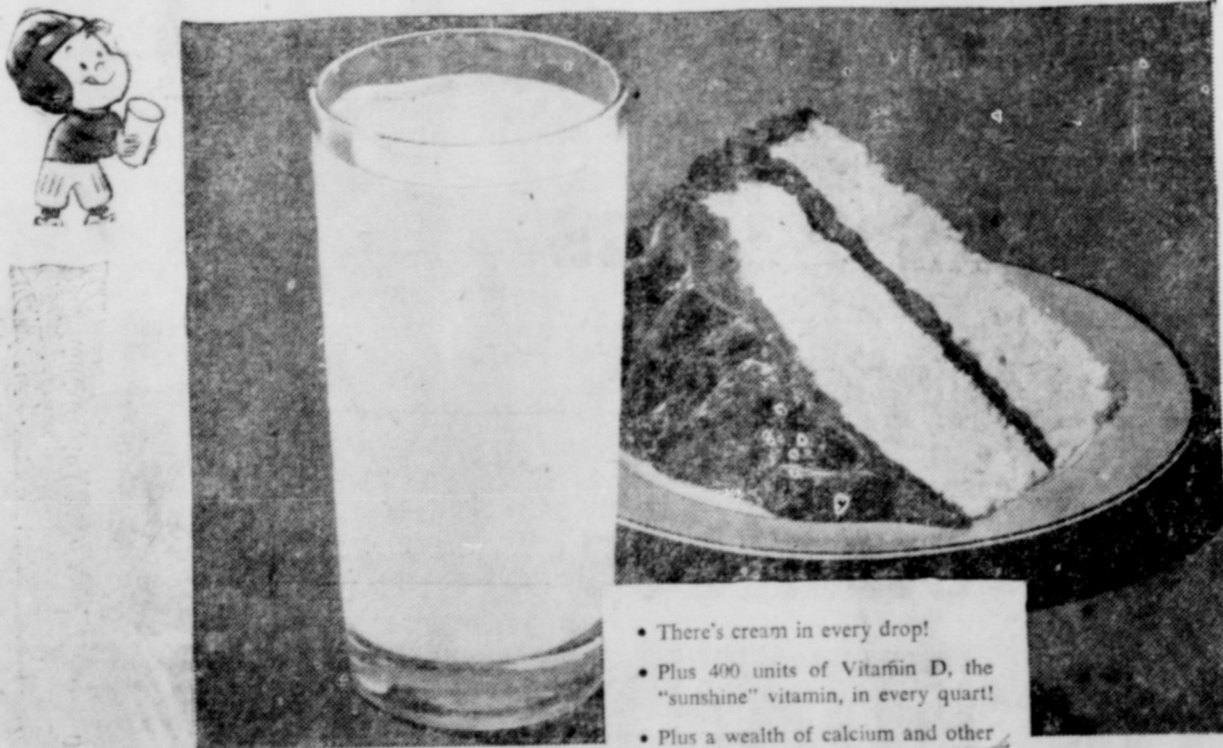
