disciples and those early day preachers and missionaries a set code for operations. As they went their many ways they confronted just as many different problems. These problems had to be solved in the Christian spirit, and in the spirit of meekness. Modes may have been quite different, but all were for the purpose of glorifying God and His Son, our Saviour.

When the conversation ended, both of us felt happy. After all we were willing for the Holy Spirit to lead us, and neither thought of changing his church affiliation.

Naturally I am happy that we are a Baptist, but millions of intelligent Christians choose to be Methodists, Presbyterians, or what have you. Do we for a moment think all this group as a bunch of deluded fools bound for hell?

No, a thousand times no. They have believed in the Lord Jesus Christ and have been saved. There may be those who will get to heaven in spite of their church rather than because of it. Their beliefs are queer, so far as we are concerned, but they will be saved, and we shall see them in heaven, simply because they were saved with an everlasting salvation when they accepted Christ as their Saviour.

All may wander off in sin, and our church doctrines may not be above reproach, yet Jesus has promised to save us and His word is true. Christians will be punished, and there are times when we know that God is punishing us, but in the end we will be saved. He may correct us for wrong doing just as a father corrects a wayward child, but His loves does not diminish. He doesn't wish to kill, but to correct us.

Jesus Christ is the head of the church. He has blessed it, and told us that the gates of hell should be man-made ordinances that we do not prevail against it. There may sometimes use to govern the local assembly, that we think of as "church or denomination gospels" when they are not. The real gospel is a Gospel of Love, and man cannot change that. Fundamental truths live until Christ returns.

Just depend on Christ, and not the church to save you and keep you saved, though it may cause you to live a richer and fuller life.

For what you or I think doesn't change the truth. Just be humble and submissive and the Holy Spirit will lead you to ultimate victory.

Ranger Rodeo Features Thrilling Trick-Riding

No rodeo is complete without an exhibition of trick riding, because equestrian skill puts into the arena girls and beauty. Four of the greatest trick riders in the business will present a show of precision and skill at all four performances of the 1953 Ranger Rodeo here next Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday, July 22-23-24-25.

They are Mrs. Frank Mariani of Ranger, wife of the former world's champion bullrider and arena director for the big 8th annual Jaycee event, Don Wilcox of Tulsa, Okla., and Dorene Morris of Baker, Montana.

Years ago, trick riding was a contest. The performers were judged on the basis of their performances in such standard tricks as the one-foot stand, cossack drag and tail stand.

The prize money was small, and when divided up the girls often found they were not making expenses. Not infrequently the riders believed they had been judged unfairly, leading to a lot of squabble.

Work Under Contract
So the event died as a contest and became a paid exhibition. The performers today work under contract. Their pay must be more than adequate to cover costs of their wardrobes.

Trick riders are the best and most expensively dressed performers in rodeo. They change costumes completely from performance to performance, and costumes must be kept clean. You should pay the tailoring and dry cleaning bills!

Trick riding is dangerous. There always is the chance a rider can get hung up from a stirrup, dragged and kicked senseless. Many are the girls who have aspired to be trick riders but have given up because of the rigorous training required.

The business is as much horse as it is performer. Success depends on the co-ordination of the two. The rider must choose and develop an animal compatible with his or her strength, size and ability to perform the work desired — a horse that can and will learn and tall stand.

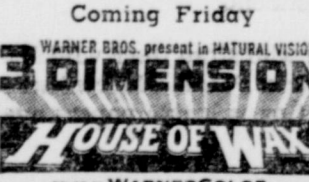

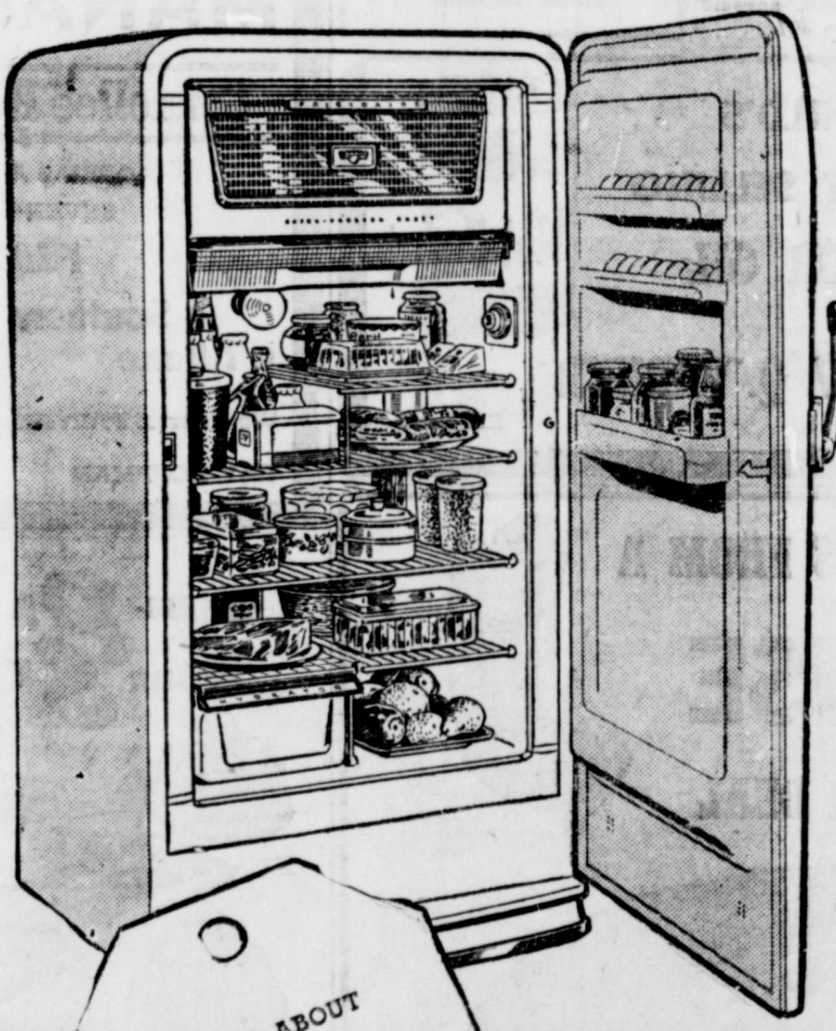
