Badgers make it 3 straight; invade Rotan Friday at 8 p.m.

The toe of Keith Beddingfield and the pass and run from Jimmy Don Rogers to Lorne Sloan for the second week in a row carried the Merkel Badgers to yet another win as the Badgers downed Ranger here Friday night 13-7.

For the third week in a row, Merkel made things happen at the very start of the contest as Russell Lucas returned a Ranger punt 60 yards to the Ranger 8 where, after the offense stalled, Beddingfield kicked his second field goal of the year to put Merkel up 3-0 after only 90 seconds of the game.

The game rocked along smoothly until the first series of the second half when quarterback Jimmy Don Rogers, on third and eight, hit Lorne Sloan on a look in pass of about 4 yards and then Sloan literally ran out of his shoes and outraced the Bulldog defenders on an 84 yard catch and run to stake the Badgers to a 9-0 lead. Beddingfield hit the point after and Merkel was up by 10.

Beddingfield added another field goal, his third of the year later in the contest to complete Merkel's scoring.

Ranger managed their only score of the game with a 12 yard pass in the fourth quarter and then threatened with 1:47 left in the game. Ranger had a 3 and one situation and squandered their chance to tie the game. On fourth and goal Ranger quarterback Lynn Stewart dropped back to pass and Jay Gibson, Jimmy Mendez and Tim Brady put an end to that play with a quarterback sack to end the scoring threat.

Merkel's third consecutive win is the most wins in a row by a Badger team since 1977 and a win in Rotan Friday will equal the best winning streak since 1974.

Badger coach Eddie Lang told the Mail Monday the Badgers had run into a much better team than they had expected and called Ranger the best team they had faced this season.

Lang said "We had a chance to put them away early, but I had the team playing too conservatively. I didn't want to take a chance on fumbling by trying to use fancy plays. We pretty well stuck to the quarterback sneak and dive plays in the second half."

He said he was happy with the performance of his defense but like last week, said the Badgers would spend a lot of time this week on tackling drills.

The Badgers had three starters, John Warkala, Rogers and Lucas slightly injured during the

game but Lang said he was extremely proud of the way the team filled in for the injured players and responded to the challenge. The only Badger on the injury list now is Gary Forehand, who has been out for three weeks but is expected to play in the Badger's district opener here against Wylie next Friday.

Lang also had some kind words for Sloan, who scored as a receiver for the second week in a row and for Keith Beddingfield's kicking. He said "With Keith's kicking the ball the way he is, anytime we get the ball inside the 40 we can be a threat to put points on the board and that takes a lot of pressure off the offense."

He also said the Badgers made a minor adjustment in pass coverage at halftime because the Ranger receivers were slipping behind the Badger line backers and catching passes. In the second half, as soon as the linebackers saw a pass coming, they abandoned their zone coverage and played man to man which held the Ranger passing attack at bay.

MERKEL AT ROTAN KICKOFF AT 8

The Badgers will see about the fastest back in the state this week when they travel to Rotan to take on the Yellowhammers and speedster Roger Hooper.

Hooper can burn the 100 yards in 10 flat or better and Lang said "The teams that have beaten Rotan (they are 1-3 on the year) have contained Hooper and the team that was beaten by Rotan was beaten by him."

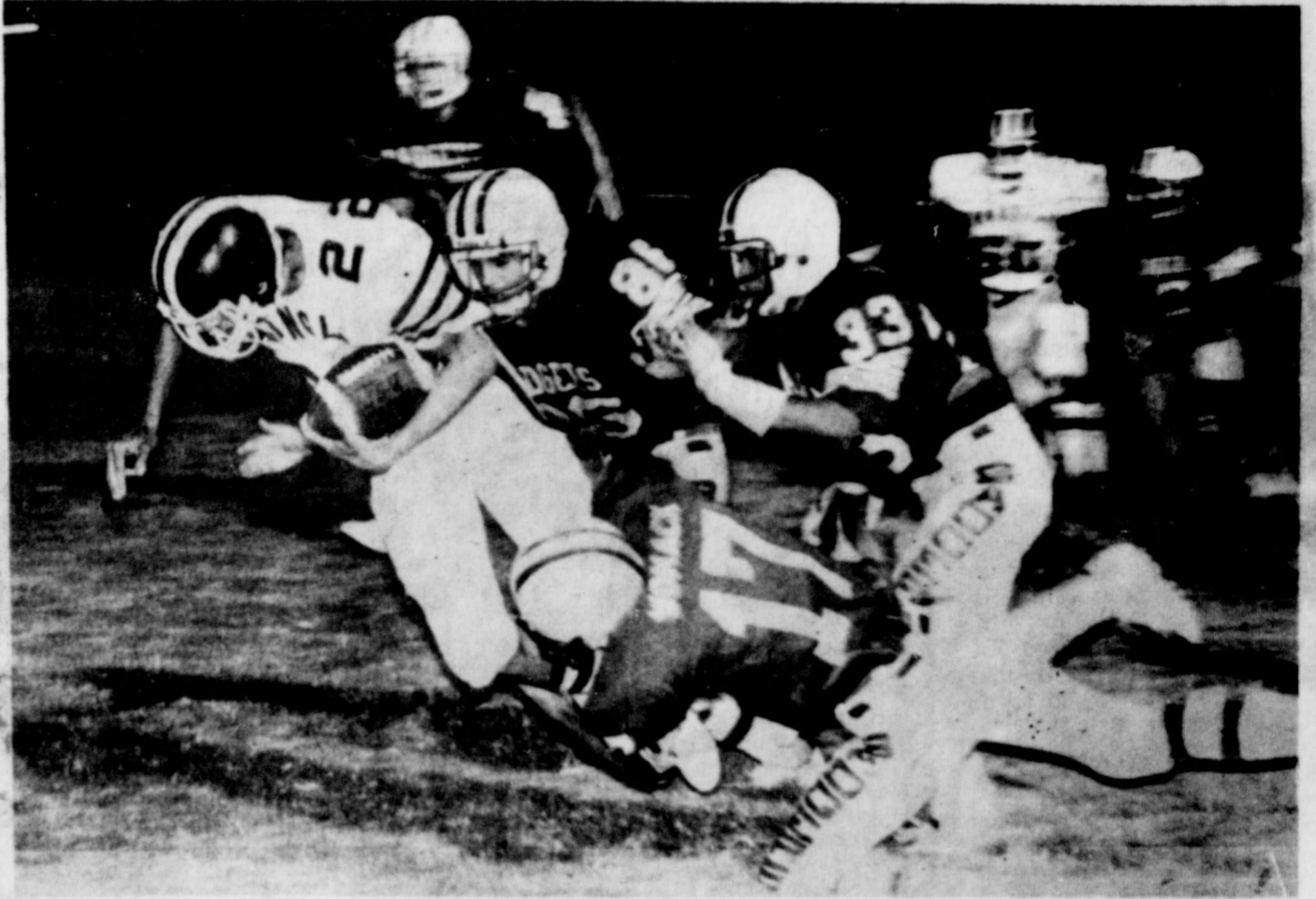
He said the Yellowhammers rarely throw the ball because of Hooper's ability to score from anywhere on the field.

"Basically, we will have to shut down Rotan's offense in order to win. You can't get into a scoring battle with them because they have enough speed to score quickly and on defense they are just as fast," he added.

Lang also said he appreciates the fan support here Friday and hoped for a good turnout in Rotan Friday. He also is real pleased with nine consecutive wins from Merkel teams as the 7th grade, 8th grade and Junior Varsity teams won for the second week in a row.

The 7th grade, 8th grade and JV will host Rotan here Thursday night with games starting here at 5 p.m.

Merkel TV Cable's Channel 5 is carrying replays of the 7th, 8th, JV and Varsity games starting at noon Saturday & Sunday for the rest of the season.

City sets 31.9 cent tax rate, denies WTU rate increase

The Merkel City Council set the 1982-83 tax rate at 31.9 cents per \$100 evaluation which represents no tax increase from the City. Council also began talking the littering problem along Kent Street as they decided to publish a penalty bearing ordinance for failure to obey No Parking signs after hours. Those actions came at Council's regular session held at City Hall Monday night.

Council also denied the ceded jurisdiction to the Texas Public Utility Commission or WTU's proposed 9.4 per cent rate increase.

WTU's proposed increase will hit the city harder than most customers.

During the last rate increase, just a little over 1 year ago, the city's bill for street lights went from about \$300 a month to \$1,300 per month and the new request will raise those rates an additional 22 per cent. The city has budgeted \$13,000 for street lighting this year and that figure may be cramped before the budget year is over.

Local WTU manager Glen Teaff read a prepared statement before Council requesting the rate increase.

In that statement, Teaff cited rising cost of capital, inflation and expenses for expanding WTU facilities as culprits for the increase. WTU will gain, systemwide, an additional \$20,404,166 in revenues.

Teaff also said in the statement that 13 cities had already decided to cede jurisdiction to the PUC to decide the request and the Merkel council voted to adopt the same plan.

Merkel Police Chief Ray Pack then appeared before Council asking that an ordinance providing for penalty clauses for illegal parking along the "Right of Way" on Kent Street be adopted.

Pack told Council the city police were unable to honor business owners request to keep people from parking there at night and littering the area with beer bottles and trash.

He told Council that Ben Franklin's has

suffered almost \$600 in damages to signs outside of their building in the last five weeks and that other business owners had asked the city to do something about the trash and debris left behind on the Right of Way. Pack told Council "I'd like to use the ordinance as a pry tool to keep the kids from littering and destructing private property. We will now have the authority to ask the kids to move if they are causing trouble or being destructive. The kids have got to have a place to park but they don't have to throw their trash or beer bottles around. With the ordinance, I can at least begin working on the problem."

Council authorized publication of the ordinance and will set a penalty clause on the ordinance calling for violators to be fined not less than \$5 or more than \$200 for convictions.

Business owners will have to post public, outside signs stating no parking.

Council also decided against the idea of a reserve police force because of costs involved. Chief Pack had requested that reserve force at council's last session, but Council asked Pack and City Manager J.A. Sadler to come up with cost estimates of hiring a part time policeman.

Council was also formally informed of funding of the second year of the current Community Development Block Grant.

The \$647,685,000 will pay for street paving, adoption and enforcement of codes and ordinances, a master plan for the city and a continuation of the home remodeling program.

Council set the tax rate at 31.9 cents per \$100 evaluation based on evaluations from the Taylor County Tax Appraisal District. The county group had set land value at \$3,728,107, improvements at \$26,667,252, Personal Property at \$4,677,583 less exemptions of \$3,488,367 for a total taxable value of \$31,584,575. If the city collects 100 per cent of the tax, the city will collect \$100,754.80 in revenue.

Unless the damaged area is pretreated, the heat of the drycleaning cycle could make the stain appear. Drycleaners can do their best when informed of the locations of stains, what caused them, and whether or not the customer has attempted to remove the stains.
