Merkel lost a long-time physician and a truly remarkable man with the passing of Dr. William T. Sadler

Dr. Sadler died Monday morning.

I didn't know Dr. Sadler, I met him, he knew my name, and would speak when I saw him. Being a newcomer of only eight years and having had Dr. Iran as our family's doctor since we moved here, I didn't know him.

I did learn some facts about him, things I never knew before, and by the reaction of a lot of long time Merkelite's, I was sure he was something very special to a lot of people.

From researching for a series of articles I wrote during Merkel's 100th Anniversary, I became aware of Dr. Sadler and what kind of man he was.

This is a man who at age 14 was the salutatorian of his high school third place district finish class. 




