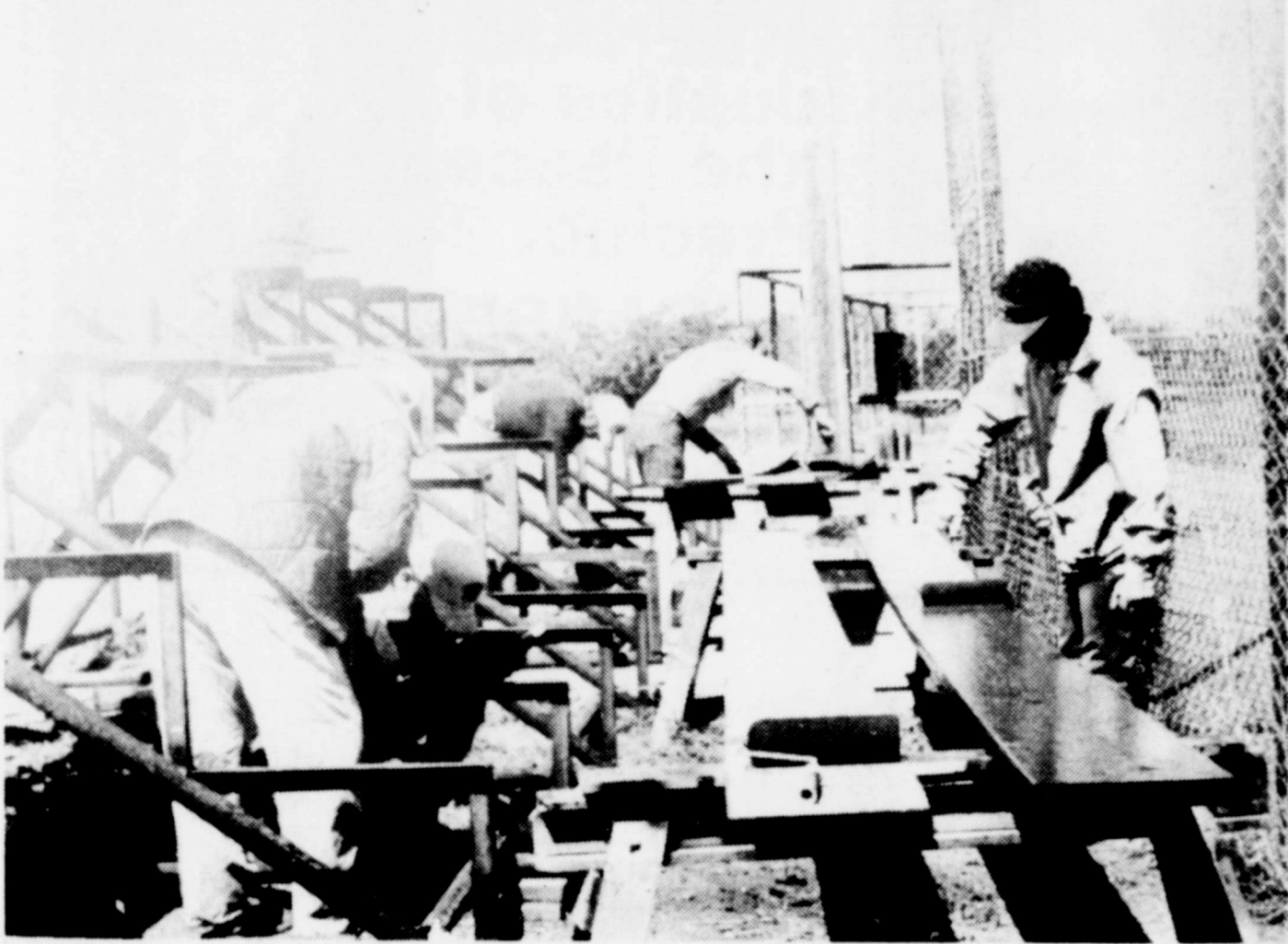

## Council will pursue rehab funds; sets public budget hearings

The Merkel City Council met Monday night and decided to 'move ahead' with an application for additional funds to rehabilitate local homes at their regular session held Monday night at Heritage Hall.

Council also honored retiring councilman Jerry Byrd with a plaque commemorating his 12 years of service for the city. Council also welcomed a new member, Phillip Doan, who was recently elected. Ted Smith was also named mayor pro-tem for an additional year by Merkel mayor Kent Satterwhite.

Merkel city manager J. A. Sadler asked for, and received permission to seek \$180,000 in federal funds for housing rehabilitation.

The city has just about completed a three year project here with federal funds under the Community Development Block Grants. Under that program, 50 local homes, all within a 'target area' were remodeled. If the city qualifies for the funding this go-around, homes all over the city will be eligible.

Council also set up two public hearings concerning the 1986-87 city budget. The first hearing will be held at 7 p.m. April 21st and the 2nd hearing will be held at 7 p.m. April 28th. Both hearings will be held at the Merkel Emergency Medical Service building.

Councilmen also heard the monthly police report from Merkel Police Chief Ray Pack. His

department worked a total of 74 cases in March.

Police investigated three cases of criminal mischief, a case of criminal damage and destruction, two cases of run-a-ways, and a case of cruelty to animals.

They also investigated 10 accidents, two cases of phone harassment, two cases of hit and run, answered three dog calls and picked up five dogs.

Police also investigated four prowler calls, issued 19 citations and investigated a case of theft.

Police also worked six burglaries, one auto theft, two family disturbances and one assault.

They also made six misdemeanor arrests and five felony arrests.

## WTU refund approved by PUC

West Texas Utilities Co. has received permission from the Public Utility Commission of Texas to refund more than \$9 million in over-collected fuel costs to its retail customers.

The PUC's action was in response to a request filed March 17 by WTU. The total amount to be refunded includes \$9,146,092 in actual fuel costs savings which have accumulated since the current fuel rate for WTU was set by

the PUC last August, plus \$215,837 in interest.

Also approved was WTU's proposal to reduce its fuel rates, technically known as the Interim Quarterly Fixed Fuel Factor, for the three month period beginning in May. WTU officials estimate that fuel charges to customers will drop by 8.2 per cent during that period. Base rates for kilowatt-hours used have not changed since 1984 and will remain the same.

WTU's fuel cost have declined for two years in a row, largely due to a softening natural gas market. Utility companies are allowed to pass the fuel costs to customers. Adjustments for over-collections or under-collections formerly were made automatically each month, but since 1983 utilities in Texas have collected fuel costs through fixed factors, which caused the need for refunds. This will be WTU's second refund within a

After lunch, a video presenta-

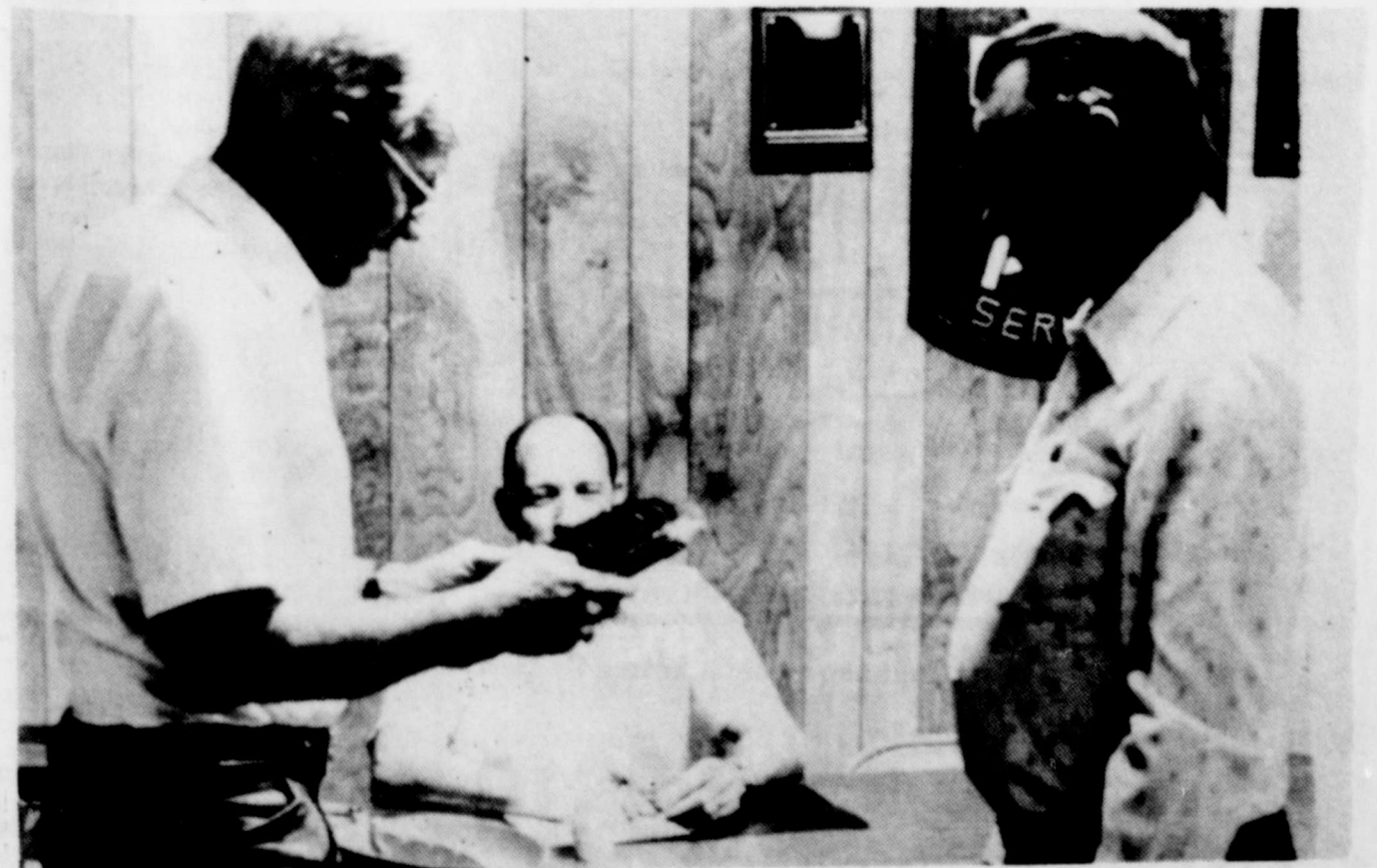
tion entitled "Legacy of a Dream" will be shown. The presentation depicts the history of electric cooperatives in Texas.

# Tax rebates down here

Merkel's share of the state sales tax collected here so far this year is running 3 per cent behind payments through the same period last year, according to a news release from the State Comptroller's Office.

Merkel has collected \$18,963.97 so far this year, compared to \$19,661.59 for the same period last year. The decline is 3.60 per cent.

Trent's sales tax rebates are still running 20.88 per cent ahead of last year. So far, Trent has

deposited \$1,329.88 in sales tax rebates in 1986.

Tye's rebates are almost 8 per cent behind last year.

Tye has collected \$21,569.60 so far this year, compared to \$23,425.95 for the same period last year.

Spring Thing April 26th at 6 p.m. A covered dish supper will be held.

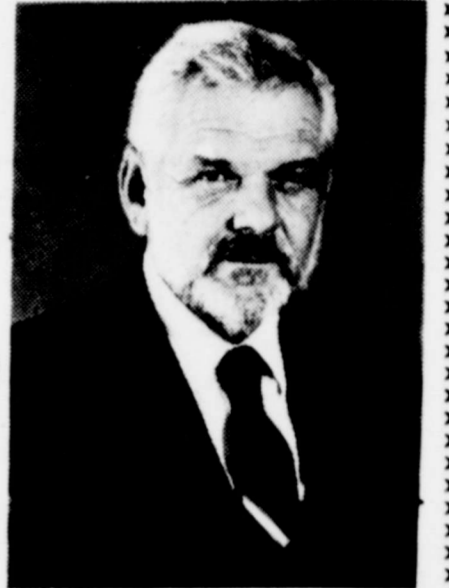
