plans for preventing underage drinking in their hometowns.

"The Youth Leadership camps are a great venue, not only to teach our Texas youth leadership skills, but also to solicit their help in combating underage drinking," said TABC Chief of Enforcement Sam Smelser. "Youth are a necessary part of the solution to preventing underage drinking and the tragedies that accompany this behavior."

Alcohol kills 6 1/2 times more youth in the U.S. than all other illegal drugs combined. Last fall, the National Academy of Sciences Institute of Medicine released a report that labeled underage drinking as an epidemic. The report called for adults to play a lead role in the prevention of underage alcohol use.

"Students who attend Power Camp return to their communities eager to work with law enforcement, government leaders, school officials and other youths to change the social environment that often condones underage drinking," said Chris Johnson, MADD Texas state chairman.

The Post students returned with a plan to tackle underage drinking in their community. They plan to work with law enforcement, town and school leaders to address the problem.

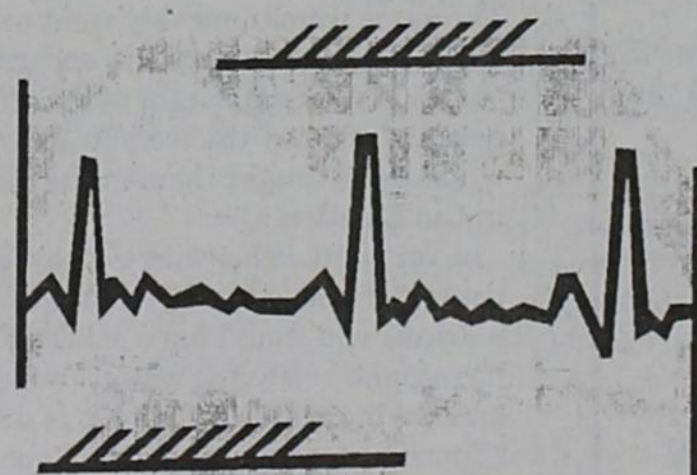
The appraisal district is supported solely by payments from the local taxing units served by the appraisal district.
