Scattered Shots

A. W. Atkinson came by Saturday and we had a little talk about some of the oldest towns in Texas and their origin. The oldest is Ysleta, and second is Socorro. Their full names are Ysleta del Sur and Socorro del Sur, meaning Ysleta of the South and Socorro of the South. They began when the Indians in New Mexico revolted against Spanish rule in 1682, and many Spaniards and loyal Indians from the New Mexico towns of Ysleta and Socorro fled for shelter to El Paso del Norte, now Juarez. They then moved down the Rio Grande a short distance and founded the two towns mentioned above. San Elizario, a third town in this group, was established a little later. This seems a strange place for the oldest town in Texas, 800 miles from the eastern border of the state.

Not so strange is the location of Texas' oldest hotel, which is the Excelsior Hotel in Jefferson, Texas, not far from the Louisiana border. The oldest drug store in Texas is located in Bastrop, southeast of Austin. The oldest residence in Texas is the Vice-Regal Palace, located at San Elizario, mentioned above.

Egg Law Explained

Forty five egg producers and retail merchants gathered at the court house in Clarendon on Mar. 11 to hear Mr. Wade and Mr Kruger of the State Department of Agriculture explain the new egg law. H. M. Breedlove was in charge of the program and showed colored slides of different grades of eggs. The men from the state department said that any producer and seller of eggs who wanted to claim a grade on his eggs must have a license. Any producer who sells and does not want to claim a grade and sell his eggs as ungraded eggs, does not need anything but his egg cartons must be marked, Ungraded. Applications for license for claiming a grade on eggs can be obtained from the State Department of Agriculture in Austin, Texas

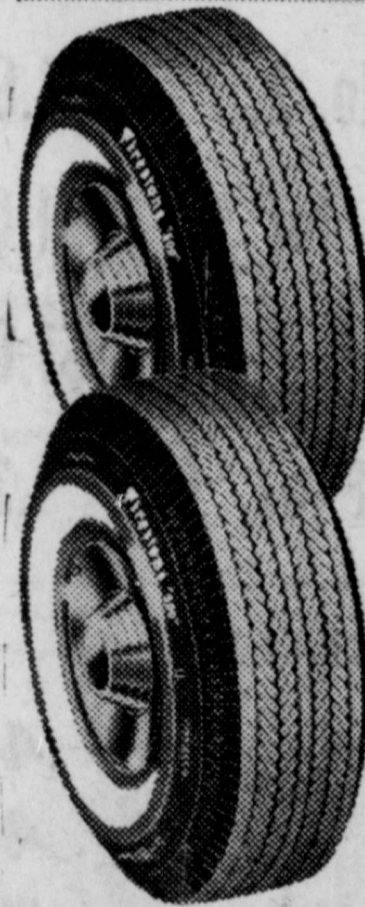

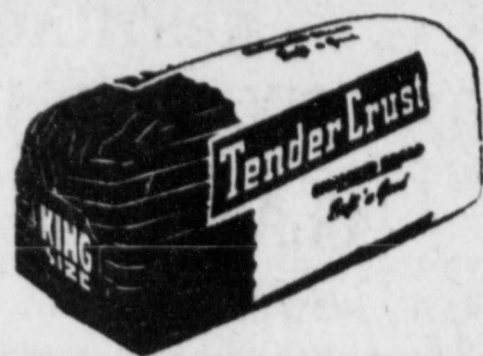
