Greenbelt Dam News

The directors of all seven cities of the Greenbelt Water Authority met in Childress last Wednesday night. Also meeting with them were Col. Si Freeze of Freeze and Nichols, Engineers of Fort Worth, Texas, Clarence Crow of McCall, Parkhurst and Crow, bond attorneys of Dallas, members of the press and other guests. C. L. Johnson and M. D. Shaw attended from here.

Since the authority's water rights expire May 9th application for permit to build the dam is being submitted. When this is passed on by the State Board of Water Engineers two years will be given in which to build the dam.

The topographical mapping of the area will be completed. As soon as their report is received the exact location of the dam will be set. Then will come the coring of the river at the dam site.

When all this is compiled the authority will have the quantity and quality of the water, the amount of land that will have to be purchased, the size of the dam and if it will hold water, the silt, evaporation and all things needed so that the engineers can figure the exact cost of the water for each of the seven towns.

Then will follow the voting of the water contract, the voting of the bonds, the sale of the bonds and the construction of the dam. It may be sooner than we think.

City Election

City voters are reminded that the city election will be held next Tuesday, April 1. There will be two names on the ticket for Mayor C. H. Reid and B. C. Stone. One of these will be elected to serve for two years.

Three of these will be elected, the two getting the most votes to serve for two years and the third man to serve for one year. Holdovers on the council are Sam Sanders and Harrison Hall.

Fire Insurance Increase

The 15% good fire record credit compiled by the local fire department will be cut to 10% on April 1st. This was on account of the heavy fire losses in Hedley in 1957 and may continue to decrease 5% a year for the next 3 years or more.

Local insurers may take advantage of the now cheap fire rates by having their policies rewritten in either 3 or 5 year terms. If the premium is too heavy for your pocket book they can be rewritten on the 2 or 3 payment plan. See your local agent.

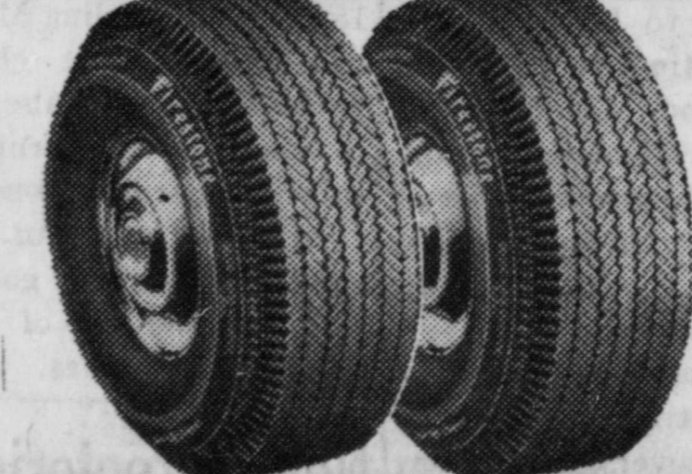

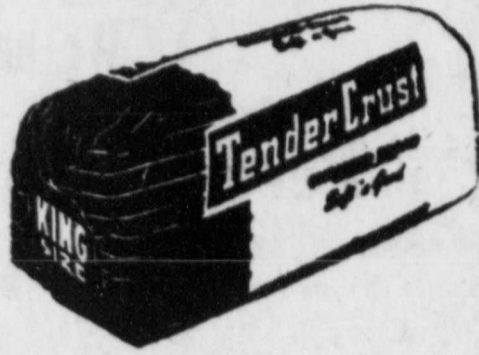
