Drivers Warned

An effort to rid Texas highways of unlicensed and unsafe drivers was revealed today by Major R. A. Crowder, Region 5 Commander of the Texas Department of Public Safety.

Officers of the Department will begin conducting driver's license checks in the immediate future on all traveled thoroughfares throughout the State.

Crowder said that thousands of Texas motorists are operating motor vehicles on expired driver's licenses or have never been licensed at all.

"It is not our desire to surprise motorists without a forewarning," Crowder said. "So we would like to take this opportunity to advise them that they may expect these checks at any time in the future," Crowder stated.

The Commander stated that the driver's license law in Texas is nearing 22 years on our statutes and we feel that no driver has a legitimate excuse for not having a valid driver's license. This law requires any operator of a motor vehicle who resides in Texas or has gainful employment in the State to be licensed as an operator, commercial operator or chauffeur.

The driver's license checks will be made on a full enforcement basis and vehicle safety inspection stickers will also be checked and motorists not having a valid driver's license or current inspection sticker as required by law will be cited into the proper court.

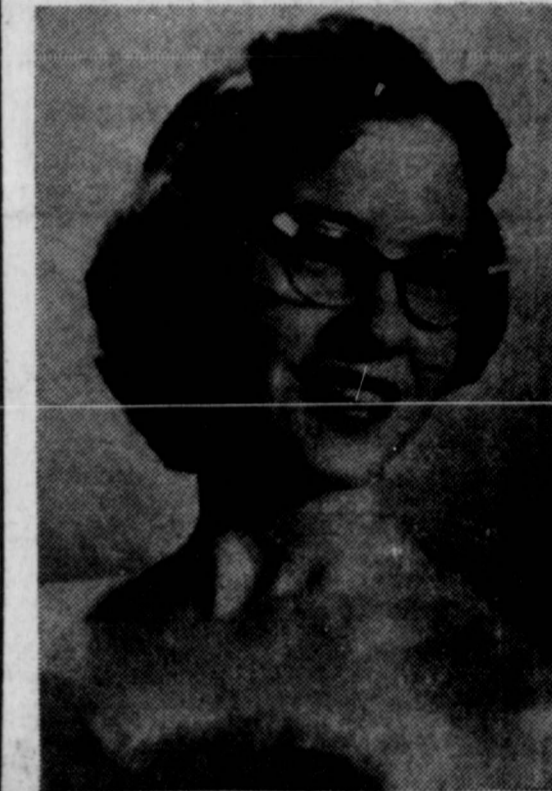
FFA News

News From Our County Agent

H. M. Breedlove, county agent, is urging all farmers who are interested in the growing of sweet potatoes on a commercial basis to come by his office and list the acreage they intend to plant this spring. The information is needed so that an estimate can be made of the acreage. Breedlove says that he has contacted a certified sweet potato grower in south Texas and the slips for planting will be delivered to Donley County for \$2 50 per thousand. The two varieties that have been decided on as the best for this area and best for market are Dark Gold Russet and Red Gold, possibly a small order will be made for a new variety of Porto Rico. Breedlove says that later on in the month all farmers who have filed an intended potato acreage in his office will be called into a meeting to form a sweet potato organization and to file their checks with whomever they elect as treasurer, so that the order can be sent in, and the delivery date set for the potato slips. Get your intended acreage in at once if you are interested in trying out this program for this year.

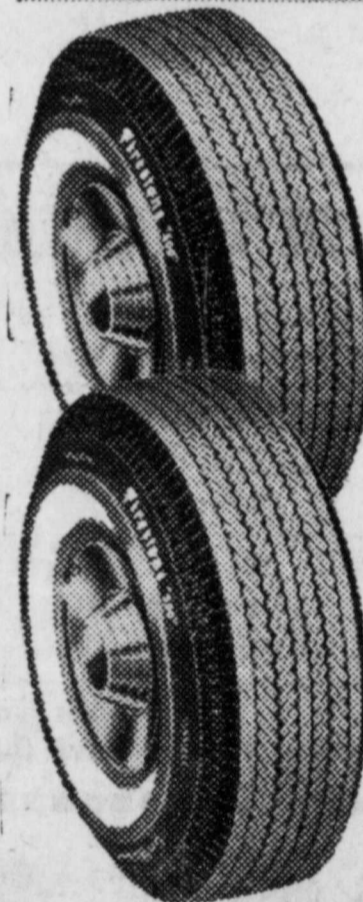

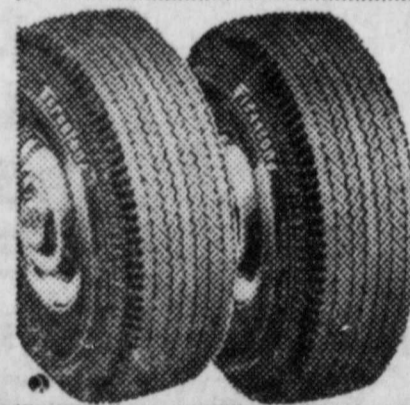

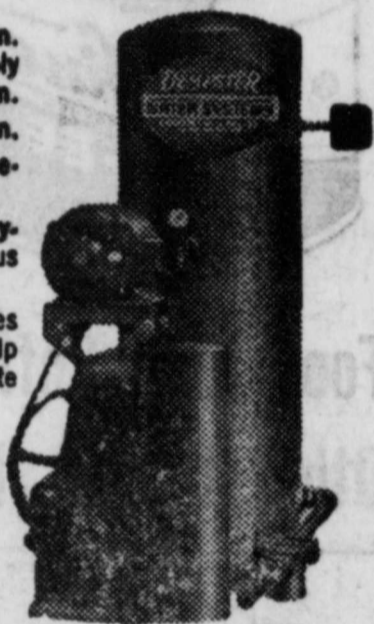
