Sponsored by the Hedley Cotton Festival Committees, the Tri-County Cotton Clinic will be held in Hedley Tuesday, May 6. The meeting will be held at the Hedley Theatre beginning promptly at 1:30 p. m. Everyone in the counties of Donley, Hall and Collingsworth interested in cotton should attend this meeting.

Due to the efforts of County Agent Flip Breedlove, Charles Cooley of Memphis and others, some of the greatest speakers of the cotton industry will be here to talk.

Mr. Fred C. Elliott, Cotton Work Specialist, A & M College Extension Service, will discuss all phases of cotton production. He will also discuss spot oiling of Johnson grass in cotton and other matters.

Dr. Freeman M. Fuller, A & M College Extension Service Entomologist will speak on insect control and other matters. All phases of the industry will be discussed including harvesting, marketing, price and further markets for cotton products and by-products.
