## Free Piggy Banks

The Security State Bank has just received a supply of plastic piggy banks. Each child who now has a savings account in the bank can get one free for asking. Also all children opening a savings account will be given a bank until the supply is exhausted. Interest is figured at the rate of 3% per annum on all savings accounts. The next interest payment date is Jan. 1st, but the interest will be paid about 10 days early in order that the savings depositors will have their interest by Christmas.

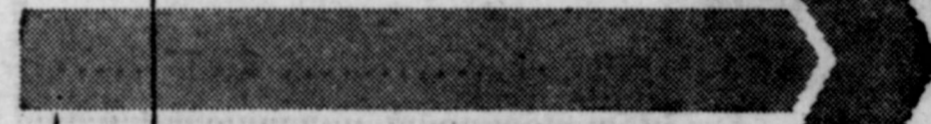
