A C P cost-share assistance is available to Donley County farmers who wish to chisel any crop land during the month of December.

Contour chiseling, cross-slope chiseling or chiseling not on the contour will be approved. The cross slope chiseling or chiseling not on the contour will be approved only on those areas where it is impracticable to chisel the land on the contour. Contour chiseling must follow terraces. Cross-slope chiseling must be performed as nearly on the contour as is practicable. Furrows must not be more than 4 feet apart and must be at least 5 inches deep. Operations which are a part of normal farming operations will not qualify.

The Federal cost share is 50¢ per acre.

Producers must make application for assistance before the practice is started and the practice must be completed on or before December 31, 1958 and reported to the county office on or before January 15, 1959.

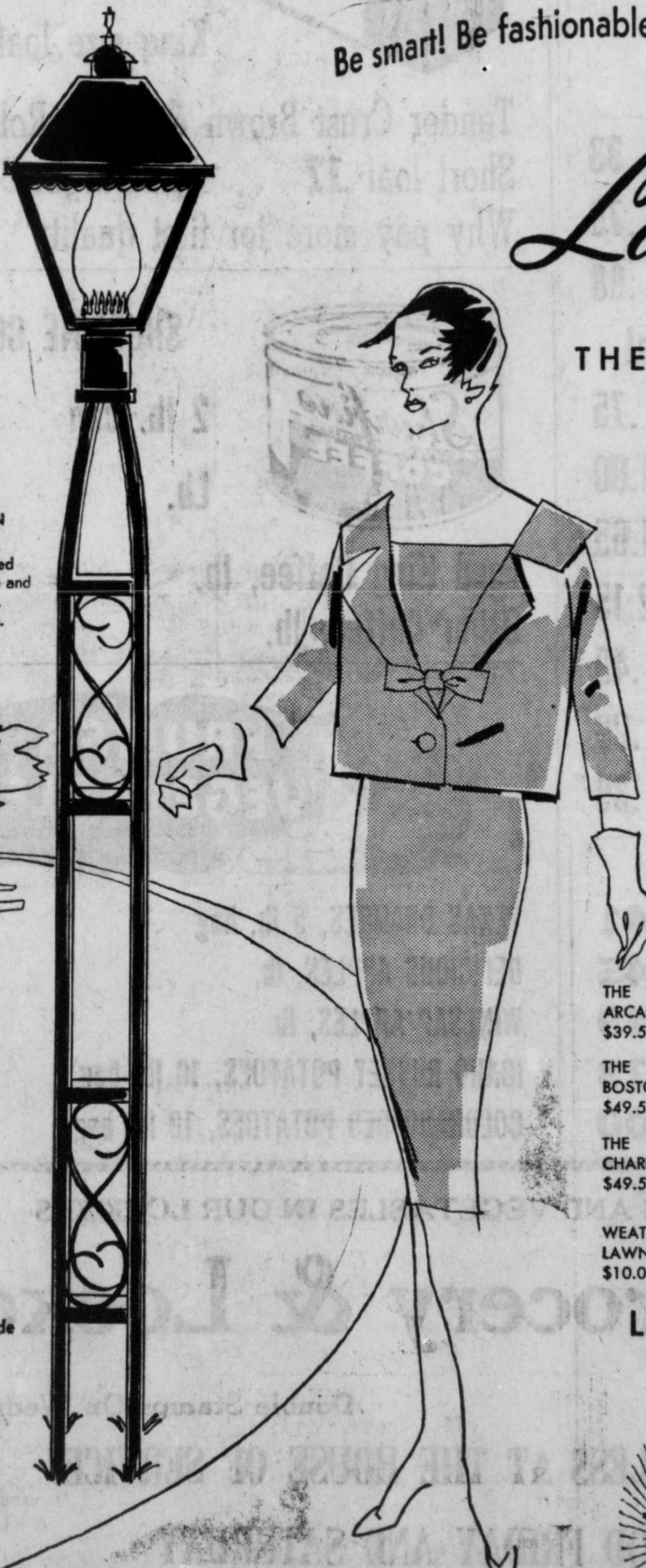

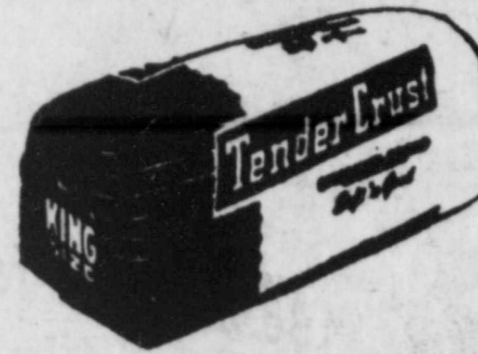
