ASC News

Through the 1959 Agricultural Stabilization Conservation Program, the Government will participate in cost-sharing assistance on the following practices: Establishment of additional acreage of vegetative cover in crop rotation, field strip cropping protect soil from wind or water erosion, improvement of an established vege-

tative cover for soil or watershed protection (reseeding range land), deferred grazing, controlling competitive shrubs, constructing wells for livestock water, constructing dams, pits, or ponds for livestock water, establishment of permanent sod waterways to dispose of excess water, constructing terraces, constructing diversion terraces, constructing erosion control, detention or sediment retention dams, constructing drops spillways, pipe

drops, drop outlets, etc., reorganization of farm irrigation systems, leveling land for irrigation water, establishment of winter legumes in the fall of 1959, establishment of legumes for summer protection, stubble mulching, deep plowing, control of bindweeds, seeding rye, application of cotton burs

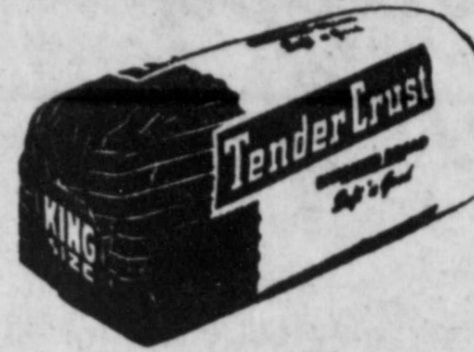
