## Fat Stock Show

Donley County 4 H Club steers sold at a good price at the Amarillo Fat Stock Show, says county agent H. M. Breedlove. Beverly Leathers sold her grand champion Angus steer for \$2110.00 including all premium money won at the show, the steer brought about \$2300. Beverly also won a beautiful \$75 watch for her steer being the best Panhandle calf. Wayne Leathers sold his reserve champion Hereford steer for \$905.00 and including all premium money the steer brought \$1015. Wayne also won first in showmanship at the show for which he received \$25. Fourth in showmanship was Janice Floyd and she received \$10. Fourteen other steers were sold at the show ranging in price from 34¢ to 41¢ per pound. Clarendon business men and ranchers sent Bob Head and Lloyd Shelton to the sale to support the price of the Donley County steers, and to them the 4-H Club members give their thanks.

Donley County 4 H Club members will either send two or four steers to the Southwest Livestock Show in El Paso. Gene Floyd will take one Angus and one Hereford and possibly Troy Harrison will take a Hereford and an Angus. Breedlove will leave for El Paso this Thursday morning with the boys and the steers for the show and return on the 14th, the closing day. Two of Gene Floyd's steers going to the show placed third in their classes at Amarillo and should make a good showing at the El Paso show. Both of Troy's steers have not been in shows yet and will either go to El Paso or Houston.

Dates to remember are as follows: Release of cotton allotments, April 17.

Determination of Choice A & B Plan, March 16.

File for New Growers Allotment, February 16.

Cotton Pre-measurement, April 1.

Plow-up of excess wheat, May 10.

The ASC County Committee and County Extension Agent plan to hold an informational meeting in the near future for the purpose of explaining important phases of the Choice A and B plan of allotments and price support applicable to cotton farms. If the farm operator elects the Choice A farm allotment and complies with it, his 1959 upland cotton crop will be eligible for price support at not less than 80 per cent of parity. If he elects and complies with the Choice B allotment which is 40 per cent larger than Choice A, his crop will be eligible for support at a level which is 15 per cent of parity less than Choice A. The price support for cotton for the program year of 1959 are 30.40 for Choice A and 24.70 for Choice B. The tentative plans are to hold two meetings, one at Hedley and one at Clarendon.

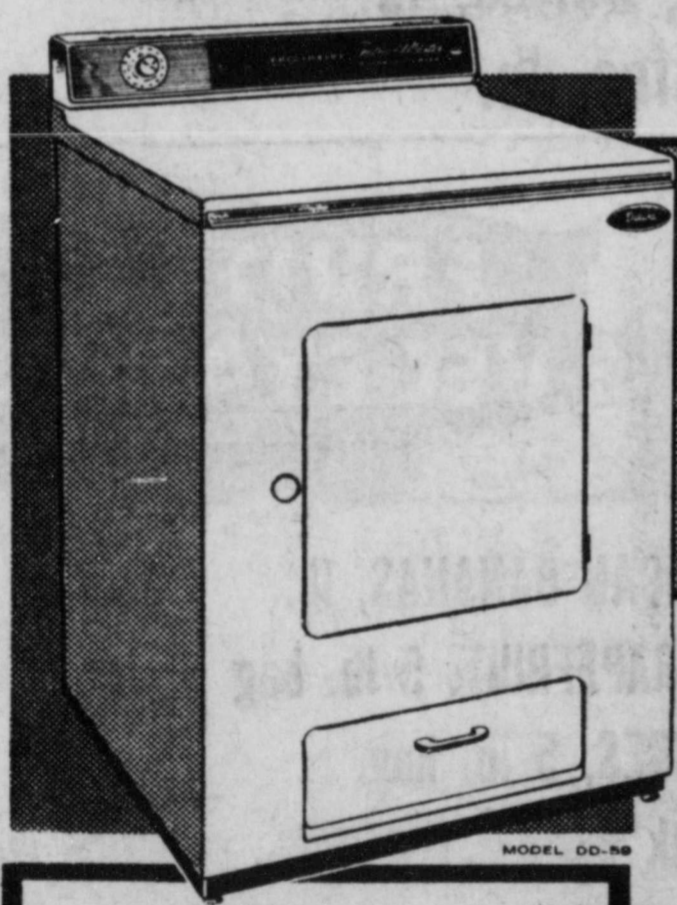
