## Scattered Shots

Many books have been written about the reason why the United States has become the kind of country that it is, and what has brought about the American way of life. It seems to me that the greatest factor in our way of life has undoubtedly been the automobile.

A Frenchman, Nicolas Cugnot, in 1769 built the first self-propelled vehicle, a gun tractor powered by steam. It would actually make about three miles per hour, but had to stop about every 100 yards to get up steam again. It was wrecked on its second trial. Then in 1801 Richard Trevithick of England operated a steam vehicle which ran dry and burned up while he was eating Christmas Eve dinner in an inn. Next Siegfried Marcus of Austria ran an internal combustion engine on a hand truck on April 6, 1865. The vehicle made only 200 yards before the police arrived with the first traffic ticket in history.

Then in 1885 Karl Benz and Gottlieb Daimler of Germany actually produced practical internal combustion engines, powered by gasoline. In 1892 Emile Levassor of France produced the first real automobile. The first retail sale of an American car, a Duryea, was made in 1896. The first American factory built specifically to produce cars was the Olds Motor Works at Lansing, Mich., in 1899. The first national auto show was at New York City in 1900.

In 1908 the first Model T Ford was announced, and the first trans-continental motor trip was made, in a Packard. The first self-starter came in 1912, on a Cadillac. The first installment plan for buying cars was introduced in San Francisco in 1913, and in that year Ford reached an output of 1000 cars a day. Also in 1913 the first real drive in filling station was built by the Gulf Oil Co. in Pittsburgh.

## New Flags

The Security State Bank presented new forty nine star flags to the Hedley Lions Club and Troop 36, Boy Scouts of America this week. These new flags are not to be flown until July 4, 1959, but can be displayed now. The Bank has one on display in their lobby. The new flag has seven rows of stars with seven stars in each row. The rows of stars are offset. It is a very beautiful flag.

## ASC News

The cotton allotment for 1958 was 30,208.4 acres. According to our records, only 15,162.5 planted acres reached maturity and was harvested, but all but a mere 3% of our allotted acres were either planted or in Soil Bank Acreage Reserve. 8,184.7 acres of cotton allotment were under Soil Bank Acreage Reserve. Almost 6,000 acres (5,930.4) of cotton were destroyed by hail and heavy rain too late to be replanted. Some 15 farmers did not plant their allotted acres, not even any part. This amounted to 325.6 acres. Other producers, in their effort to be in compliance with their allotments, underplanted a total of 605.2 acres.

All producers who have received a cotton allotment for 1959 and who do not intend to plant that acreage and who are not in the Soil Bank Conservation Reserve program should release the acreage to the County Committee for re-apportionment to cotton farmers who will plant.

Even though your allotment is small, 0.5 acres, and you do not intend to plant cotton, you should release the acreage. Be sure to attend to this matter.

### It's the Truth

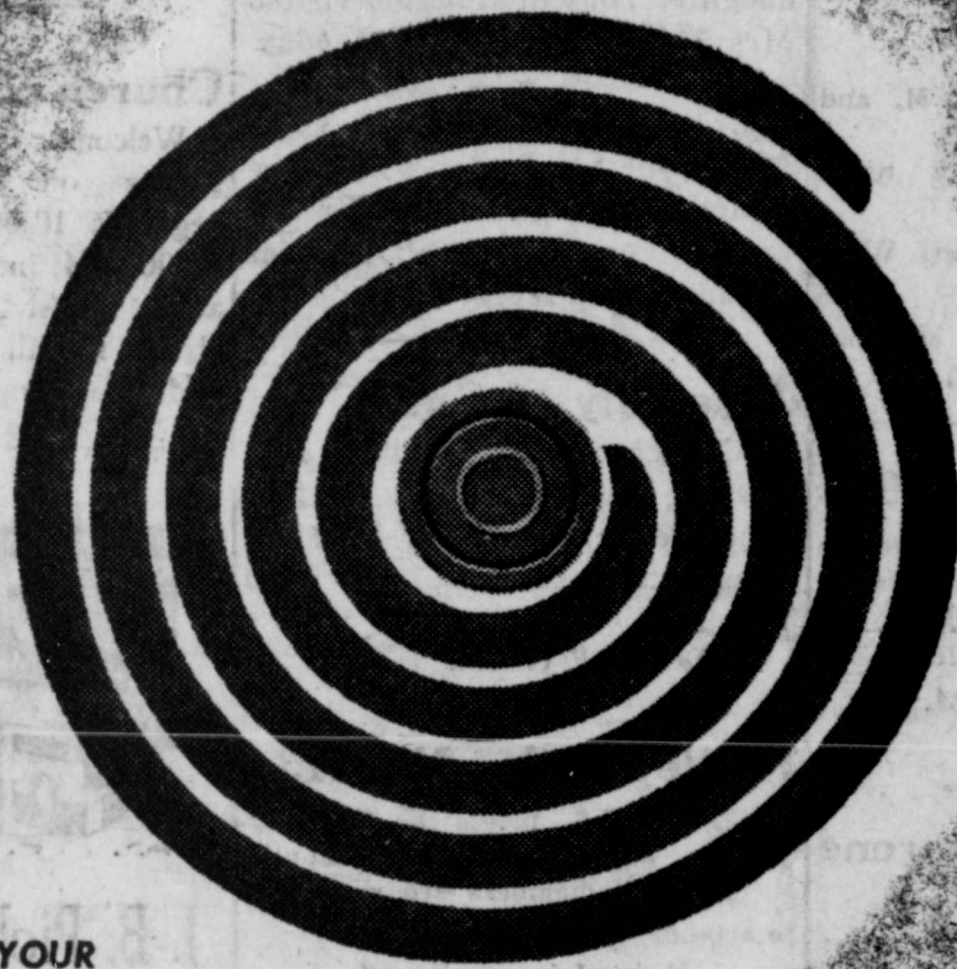

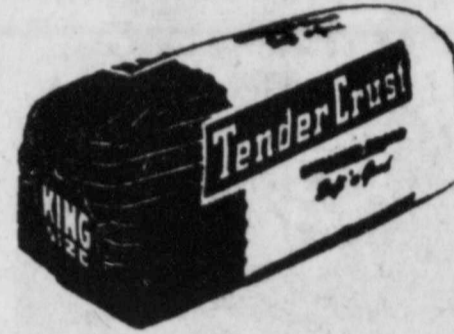
