

"Choice A" cotton will not be eligible for the Loan program but will be eligible for sale either to C C C or the open market.

"Choice B" cotton will be eligible for the loan or to be sold the open market.

The support rates for "Choice A" and "Choice B" are shown on the Form MQ-24A. Be sure to make your choice of allotment on or before March 16


