Giles Picnic

Once again it's almost time for the Giles Picnic. There'll be "big doin's" on the banks of old Buck Creek when this annual celebration gets under way the morning of May 30th. Everybody is invited.

Already big plans are in the making. There will be a boosters' caravan starting from the Lowell Houston home at one o'clock Saturday, May 23 for an afternoon tour stopping at Memphis, Childress, Wellington, Hedley and Clarendon. A group of the Beasley Square Dancers, fiddle music, and singing will furnish the entertainment at each stop. The towns will be alerted as to the possible time of arrival of the Giles Picnic troupers.

Flip Breedlove, the Panhandle Barbecue King, will barbecue the beef again this year and will set up camp on the grounds the day before the celebration. Lowell Houston, the Mayor of Giles, and Walter Johnson, the Giles High Sheriff will be on hand to see that everybody has the time of their life and doesn't eat too much.

Mrs. Charlie Crow has been busy as a bird dog in hunting season making bonnets for the picnickers and Richard Stotts will have charge of the musical entertainment which we hope to have going most of the day.

The festivities will get going about ten o'clock with Bob Ayers as Master of Ceremonies and continue on into the night with dinner supper, and singing on the ground. While red beans, stewed fruit, onions and pickles will be served with the barbecue, pies, cakes and salads will be most welcome.

This year folks are invited by the Houstons, owners of the Giles Section, to bring their camping equipment and camp on the ground if they like. Flip would enjoy the company but you must not get in his way as he will be a busy merchant cooking the beef. The beef, by the way, is a white-faced black steer so as not to offend either the Hereford or Angus folks, and was raised by Milton Beasley.

There will be water and lights on the ground but bring your own appetite and come to have a good time at the Giles Picnic!

The Giles Picnic Troopers will be in Hedley about 5 o'clock Saturday, May 23, with fiddle music and a program on the street.
