To Have Short Course On Insect Control

Insect control short courses are scheduled to be sponsored by the vocational agriculture departments of six plains area schools during June and July. Schools that are to hold the courses are Estelline, Childress, Hedley, Clarendon, Tulia, and Cotton Center (Hale County).

The short courses are to be taught by H. A. Turney, Insect Control Specialist for vocational agriculture. Courses are to be organized and conducted under the direction of the vocational agriculture teachers in the sponsoring schools.

Turney has both a B. S. and M. S. Degree in Entomology and has had four years of field experience in insect control work. During the past 11 months he has taught 36 insect control short courses. He states that he expects the farmers participating in the various short courses to gain enough additional knowledge about identification of insects, about their habits, and about insecticides and method of application that they will be able to carry out more effective and economical prevention and control measures.

Meetings are to be held in the vocational agriculture building. At the first meeting the dates for subsequent meetings are to be worked out. Both classroom instruction and practical work in the field are to be included in each course.

The first meeting in Hedley will be held at 6 p. m. on Monday, July 6. Farmers interested in attending one of the short courses should contact the vocational agriculture teachers in their respective communities. An entry fee of \$2.00 per person is to be charged. Entomology Certificates are to be presented to farmers who attend all the training sessions offered in the short course in which he is enrolled.

The insect control short courses are being conducted under a program operated through the Vocational Agriculture Division of the Texas Education Agency.

ASC News

We are afraid some Soil Bank participants are going to be mighty unhappy this year if they do not receive their annual payment for failure to plant the land under Conservation Reserve contract to an approved grass. All Conservation Reserve land that has not already been planted to an approved grass should be seeden and performance reported. Otherwise the producer may be considered as having violated his contract and, if so, no annual payment will be made this year. This matter should be given immediate attention by all concerned. In this connection, we quote the following requirements:

1. A workman effort must be made in land preparation and in seeding a grass cover the first year of the contract period;
 2. Approved cover of grass must be established and maintained on all eligible Soil Bank land;
 3. Failure to establish and maintain an acceptable grass cover constitutes a violation of the contract and the loss of annual payment; and
- Soil Bank land shall not be grazed at any time and no crop harvested therefrom during the contract period—sunflowers, cockleburs and Russian thistles must be controlled—do not exceed permitted acres on the farm.
