Insurance Reduced

There will be a reduction in insurance rates effective July 1st. This will apply to fire, wind, and hail on both town and farm properties. There will be no change in automobile rates. This reduction will not apply to existing policies, but will be a saving on all new policies and increases in insurance. This is the first reduction in some time. In fact our rates have been going the other way.

If you have been carrying one year policies, it would be to your advantage to take a three or five year policy at the reduced rates. The adjusters who worked our May 3rd hail loss found practically every house in town under-insured. In fact, there are very few if any houses in this area carrying enough insurance to replace them if blown away or burned. To provide the coverage you need you can have your present policy increased at the new reduced rate.

Don't delay, see your local agent at once and make sure you have enough coverage. The storm period is still on.

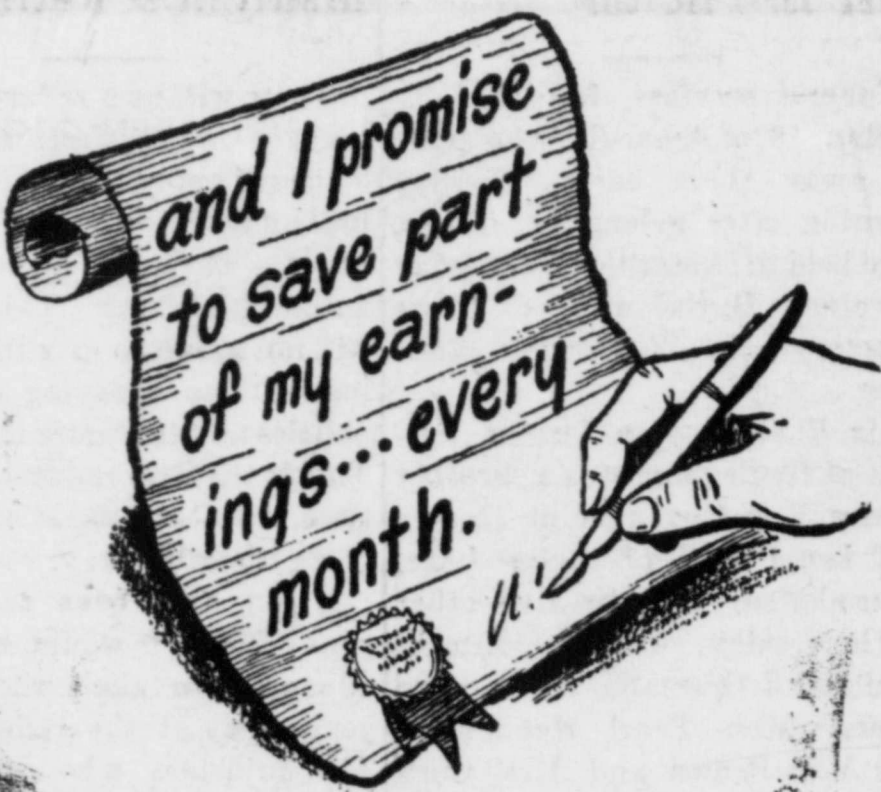

This office began measuring cotton on June 1 and completed field work on about 400 farms. Out of this number 365 have been completed in the office and notices have been mailed to inform you whether you were overplanted or in compliance. Remember you have only 15 days from date of notice to destroy your excess cotton.

Be wise—Take a mid-summer inventory of your farm or ranch. What is missing? After you have made the inventory and decided on what improvement to make it is time to consult with your SCS technician, county agent, community committeeman, county committeeman or the ASC Office to see if a Practice is available to cover your needs. A limited amount of money is still available to help you carry out such practices.

Donley County has 15 farms in "A" community, which have part or total cropland under a Conservation Reserve contract. The total irrigation wells in Donley County is 142.

To Have Short Course On Insect Control

Insect control short courses are scheduled to be sponsored by the vocational agriculture departments of six plains area schools during June and July. Schools that are to hold the courses are Estelline, Childress, Hedley, Clarendon, Tulia, and Cotton Center (Hale County).

The short courses are to be taught by H. A. Turney, Insect Control Specialist for vocational agriculture. Courses are to be organized and conducted under the direction of the vocational agriculture teachers in the sponsoring schools.

Turney has both a B. S. and M. S. Degree in Entomology and has had four years of field experience in insect control work. During the past 11 months he has taught 36 insect control short courses. He states that he expects the farmers participating in the various short courses to gain enough additional knowledge about identification of insects, about their habits, and about insecticides and method of application that they will be able to carry out more effective and economical prevention and control measures.

Meetings are to be held in the vocational agriculture building. At the first meeting the dates for subsequent meetings are to be worked out. Both classroom instruction and practical work in the field are to be included in each course.

The first meeting in Hedley will be held at 6 p m on Monday, July

6. Farmers interested in attending one of the short courses should contact the vocational agriculture teachers in their respective communities. An entry fee of \$2 00 per person is to be charged. Entomology Certificates are to be presented to farmers who attend all the training sessions offered in the short course in which he is enrolled.

The insect control short courses are being conducted under a program operated through the Vocational Agriculture Division of the Texas Education Agency.
