## Greenbelt Dam News

The topographical maps of the Salt Fork of Red River and the area drained by the river were received by the Greenbelt Water Authority Monday, June 22nd. The maps had been expected by the Authority some time back and progress on the dam was halted until they were received. No further delay is expected and progress can be resumed at a normal rate now.

The Authority's engineers, Freese and Nichols of Ft. Worth, now have a copy of the map and are getting their data. Within a short time they will have the information to allow the Authority to let the contract for the coring of the river bed at the present location of the dam site.

However this delay will probably not amount to anything in the long run as no election was anticipated until September, when most of the voters will be back from vacations. Daily sampling of the water at the dam site will continue to September 1st.

**Scattered Shots**

Somehow this column has been left out most of the time in recent weeks, going on the theory that local news is of more interest than personal comments. However I have learned that this column has at least one reader, so this column is for his benefit, and the rest of you don't have to read it if you don't want to.

One anniversary that passed by without comment last month was that of the battle of Midway, which took place 17 years ago, in June of 1942. This battle was one of the most important ever fought by this nation's armed forces, and was actually the turning point of the Pacific war, a fact which was not realized by our own commanders for some time.

Six Japanese aircraft carriers were involved in the attack on Pearl Harbor which led to this country's declaration of war. At the time of the Midway battle two of these were undergoing repairs, but four of the carriers which had attacked Pearl Harbor were present. They were the Kaga, Akagi, Hiryu and Soryu. A number of American torpedo bombers were sacrificed when they failed to reach the Jap carriers but a follow-up series of attacks by American dive bombers succeeded in sinking all four of the Jap carriers. In the course of the war Japan managed to replace the carriers, but never overcame the shortage of trained personnel which resulted from these sinkings, which is why Midway has been called the turning point of the war.

This was so disastrous a defeat for Japan that the Japanese people did not learn the truth until 1951, several years after the close of the war, and they only learned then because two former Japanese officers wrote a book describing the action. Perhaps this defeat was equaled only by that of the battle of Leyte Gulf, which took place late in 1944, and which was the largest naval battle ever fought in the world. However this column is not long enough to describe the Leyte Gulf battle, which must wait for another time.

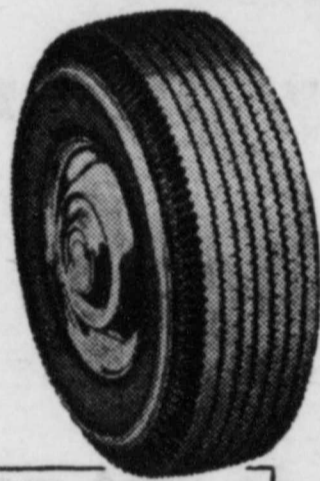

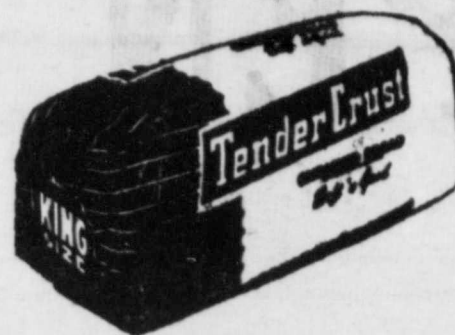
