Greenbelt Dam News Old Settlers Picnic

It is just below where White Fish Creek runs into the river, which is about 8 miles north and 3 miles east of Hedley.

The maps also permitted them to make an accurate area capacity curve for the reservoir. The reservoir site can be economically developed to impound 150,000 acre feet of water from the 770 lasting and eternal. square miles of drainage area While the Authority's permit is for only 100,000 acre feet of water the engineers think the Water Board would increase the permit to allow all the water impounded since good water is so scarce in Texas.

The area of the lake will be 4700 acres or you might say nearly seven and one half sections when full. The coring of the river bed at the dam site will start in a very short time. When coring is completed the cost of the dam and reservoir for 100,000 and 150,000 acre feet capacity will be figured A vicinity map and a reduced scale map of the reservoir are on display at the Security State Bank.

The directors of the Greenbelt Authority will meet at Childress next Tuesday night, July 2I, to let the contract for coring the dam and to take care of other matters.
