Scattered Shots

Sometimes the question is raised as to distances in Texas from one border to another, usually by someone who has tried to drive across it in one day. In a straight line the longest north south distance is from the northwest corner of the Panhandle to the southern tip near Brownsville, a distance of 801 miles. East west the longest distance is from the eastward bend of the Sabine in Newton County to the westward bulge of the Rio Grande in El Paso County, which is 773 miles. Highway distances, of course, would be something else again. The elevation in Texas varies from sea level to 8,751 feet at the top of Guadalupe Peak in Culberson County.

The boundary of Texas, without counting the smaller indentations of the coast line and river mouths, is a total of 2,845 3 miles, which includes 889 miles of the Rio Grande, 370 miles of coast line, 180 miles of Sabine River, Lake and Pass, 106 5 miles from Sabine River to Red River, 480 miles of Red River, 133 6 miles of the East Panhandle line, 167 miles of North Panhandle line, 310 2 miles of West Panhandle line, and 209 miles along the 32nd parallel. If the meanderings of the rivers and tidal coast line are counted, the total is 4 137 miles.

Returning to the highway mile ages mentioned above, the distance from El Paso to Texarkana is 804 miles from El Paso to Orange is 873 miles, and from Texline to Brownsville is 919 miles. If your car only gets 9 miles to the gallon, maybe you had better not go.

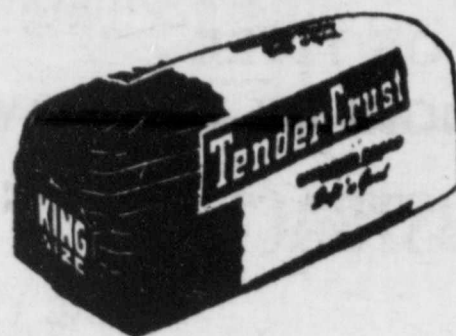
