Scattered Shots

We note in a daily newspaper that someone asks who was the first president of 48 states. The answer is William Howard Taft. There were 46 states when he became president, and Arizona and New Mexico were admitted during his administration. Eisenhower will, of course, be the only president of 49 states, as well as the first president of 50 states. No doubt the next thing we know Greenland or Madagascar or somebody else will want to be the 51st state.

If you go hunting or fishing, you are hereby reminded that your old license has now expired. New licenses became necessary Sept. 1st. The hunting license costs \$3.15 and the fishing license costs 2.15. Drouth in the Canadian waterfowl nesting areas caused a shortage in this year's duck and goose crop but the Texas Game and Fish Commission has authorized a liberal season. The duck season will open at noon Friday, Nov. 13, and last until Jan 1. Hours will be from sunrise to sunset after opening day, with a bag limit of four per day or eight in possession. It will be illegal to kill more than one redhead canvasback or ruddy duck.

The goose season will run from noon Oct. 26 through Jan 8, with a limit of five geese per day. A \$3 Federal duck stamp is required of all persons hunting migratory waterfowl.

And speaking of killing, the Dept. of Public Safety expects 31 persons to die on Texas roads during the Labor Day week end. There were 30 killed on the Labor Day week end last year, 26 of them dying in rural areas as a result of 18 accidents. Thirteen of these 18 involved only one car. So it appears that each driver would do well to watch himself, except, of course, in cases where sudden suicide is desired.

The different departments in the fair will be the Donley County flower show which is sponsored by the Les Beaux Arts Club; the merchants department, and this is open to all merchants and plenty of space is available; the community agriculture exhibits will have agriculture displays from fourteen communities in the county; the poultry department will feature the best in poultry and be in the new attached shed on the fair building; the home economics department is open to all home economics classes in schools of the county; needle craft department, fine arts and canned goods departments are open to all persons and will have new departments in them this year; the home made baking department is a new department and is open to all persons and all the above departments are published in the catalog with all rules and regulations for each department. The horse show is open to all counties and horses must be registered quarter horses in order to compete.

ASC News

Thursday, Sept. 10, is the last day farmers can take the first necessary step to participate in the Soil Bank's 1960 Conservation Reserve program, Mr. Cooke, Chairman Donley County Committee said. The first step is for each farmer who wishes to offer cropland under the program to ask the county A S C committee to set a basic annual rate per acre for the land offered.

The period for filing such requests is from Aug. 24 through Sept. 10. The Chairman emphasized that no requests will be accepted after Sept. 10.

After the basic rate has been established for the land offered, the farmer will then have an opportunity to apply for a contract at any figure below the basic rate. If the offer can be accepted, the farmer will be notified of the date by which he must return the signed conservation reserve contract to the county A S C office.

Farmers who would like to have further information about participating in the 1960 program are urged to get in touch with the county office as soon as possible, but certainly before Sept. 10.

The annual election of community committeemen in Donley County will be on Sept. 8, 1959. Voting will be by mail only and must be postmarked not later than this date.

Life today would be drab indeed without the dyes that are used extensively to color clothing, automobiles, furniture, house paint and many things too numerous to mention. In Bible times purple dye was an important item of trade. Some of it was made from roots of certain plants, some from a tiny animal living in the sea. Roman rulers wore purple robes to signify their rank. Once when the apostle Paul was in Macedonia in the city of Philippi he met a business woman who by trade was a seller of purple. Philippi was an important city of that day situated in the northern part of what we know as Greece on the great northern highway connecting the east and west. Lydia and some more people had gone to a place by a river to worship God and Paul spoke to them about Christ, whereupon Lydia obeyed the gospel, and afterward assisted Paul and his company in the Lord's work in Macedonia. The Gospel has the same marvelous power today as it did when preached by Paul on a river bank.
