The Edomites

The twin sons of Isaac and Rebekah were very different in personalities as well as the way of life each chose. Esau was hairy and ruddy complexioned at birth. He became a hunter loving the fields and woods. He brought sorrow and disappointment to his parents by marrying two women from idolatrous countries around them. He took his family to the top of Mt Seir to live. A wild rugged mountain range with almost sheer walls, about 100 miles long and 20 miles wide. Esau was also called Edom and the fierce people who were his descendants were called Edomites. They lived on these rugged crags for many years only coming down to raid the surrounding country. Esau had a marvelous future cut out for him by natural right, for he was the oldest son and all the wealth of Isaac would have been his. 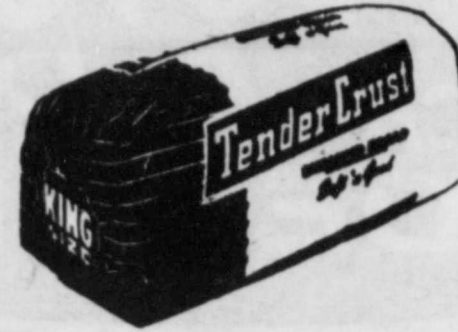
