NMS Test

All 1961 graduates who wish to enter the 1960-61 National Merit Scholarship competition should register now at the school office, Mr. J. S. Hinds, superintendent, announced today. The National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test will be given at 9 a. m., Tuesday, March 8, 1960.

To be eligible for the test, Hedley High School students must be second-semester juniors or first-semester seniors at the time of the examination. Students must pay a \$1 fee on the day of the test. Any interested student who is unable to pay the fee should consult Mr. Hinds.

The tests are given each year by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation as part of the nation's largest independent scholarship program Last year 550,000 students competed in 14,500 schools for more than \$3.5 million worth of four year scholarships.

Awards are granted on the basis of intellectual merit, but student financial needs determine the size of individual stipends, which are renewable each year without further testing.

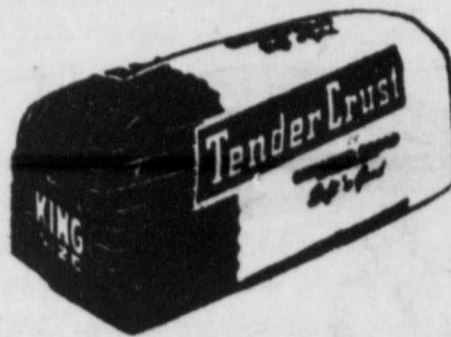
