## NMS Test

All 1961 graduates who wish to enter the 1960-61 National Merit Scholarship competition should register now at the school office, Mr. J. S. Hinds, superintendent, announced today. The National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test will be given at 9 a. m., Tuesday, March 8, 1960.

To be eligible for the test, Hedley High School students must be second-semester juniors or first-semester seniors at the time of the examination. Students must pay a \$1 fee on the day of the test. Any interested student who is unable to pay the fee should consult Mr. Hinds.

The tests are given each year by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation as part of the nation's largest independent scholarship program. Last year 550,000 students competed in 14,500 schools for more than \$3.5 million worth of four year scholarships.

Awards are granted on the basis of intellectual merit, but student financial needs determine the size of individual stipends, which are renewable each year without further testing.

## Church of the Nazarene Report Shows Increase

Per capita giving in the Church of the Nazarene was \$135.51 in 1959—an increase of \$2.46 over the previous year, and a new denominational record.

Total denominational giving for all purposes was \$42,183,554 which was an increase of about two million dollars. The comparable total in 1958 was \$40,140,220.

Substantial gains in other areas of the denomination's work were shown in the annual statistical report released this week by Dr. S. T. Ludwig, of Kansas City, general church secretary.

Church membership climbed to 311,299—a net gain of 9,624, or a 3.19 per cent increase over 1958.

The denomination started 159 new churches in 1959, or an average of three per week. One of these was in Frankfort, West Germany. The net total number of churches at year-end was 4,696.

Sunday school enrollment gained 22,777—a 3.4 per cent increase, to a total of 696,512. The Foreign Missionary society added 18,047 members for a total of 173,825. The Young People's society gained 4,011 to a total of 97,080.

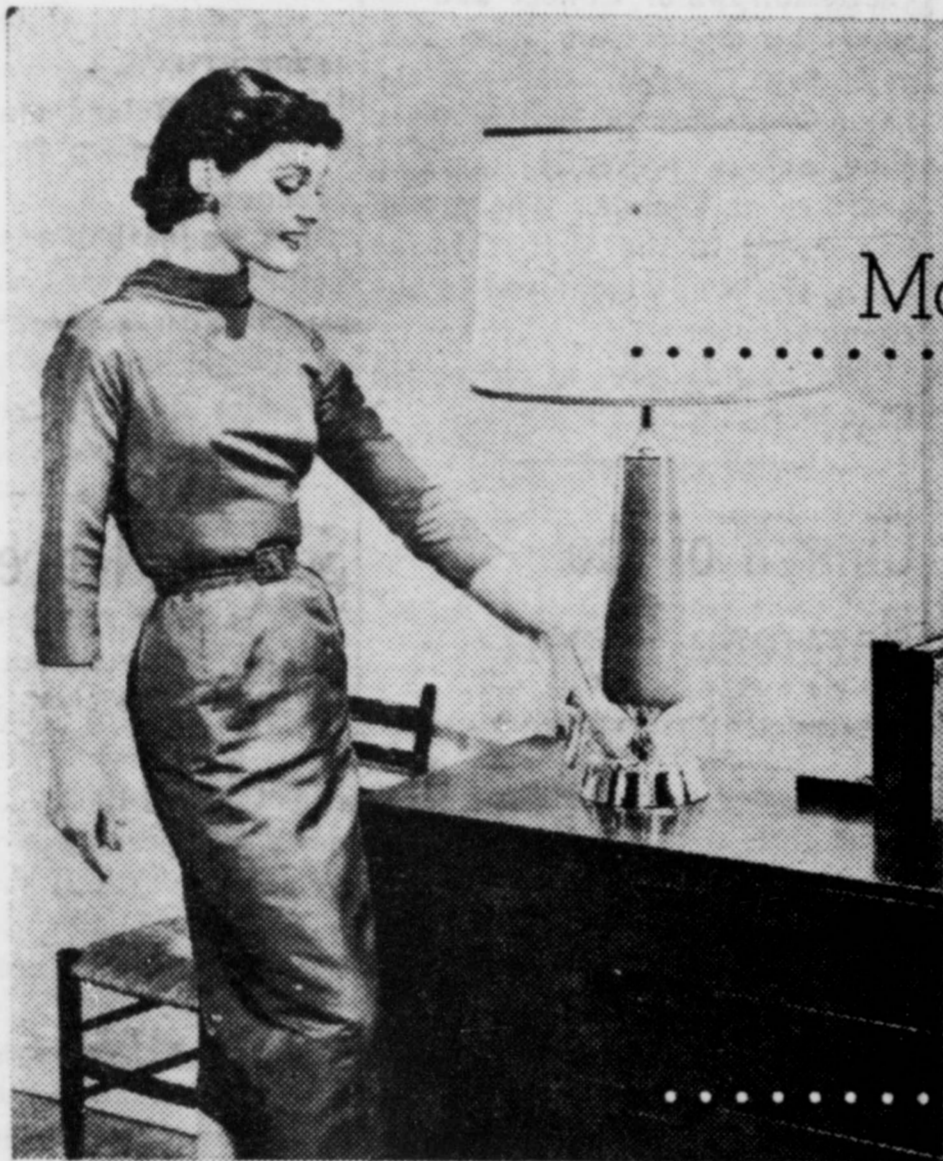

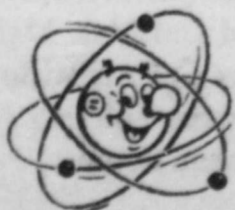

**Jerusalem**

The city of Jerusalem in Palestine probably stands out in front of any other in influence upon the hopes and destinies of mankind. Little is actually known of who built the original city. A master mind must have helped in the planning and situating of the town-site for its position was one almost impregnable, built on a hill, among hills with deep ravines on three sides. On one side a large spring of water, which on being tunneled into the city assured it of a fresh water supply even during a siege. The name Jerusalem means "peace," but a study of history and the Bible reveals a different story. The first siege probably was by the children of Israel soon after Joshua's death, and in the fifteen centuries following it was besieged seventeen times, twice burned to the ground and its walls destroyed twice. The Romans controlled Jerusalem in the time of Christ, the population being about 30 000. During the time the city was in the possession of the Israelites the history could have been quite different, for God promised to keep them safe and bless them abundantly as long as they obeyed his laws and remembered his teaching. Down through history God has always blessed nations who feared him, but nations who have forgotten him have fallen and ceased to be Christians are admonished to pray for the rulers of the world that we might have peace, but more important, and often overlooked, we are to pray "that they (the rulers) might come to a knowledge of Almighty God."

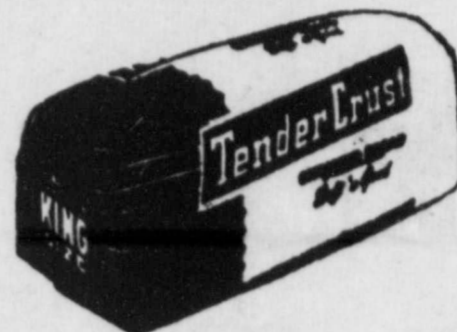
