## Greenbelt Dam News

Clifford Johnson attended a meeting of the Greenbelt Water Authority at Childress last Thursday. The following article appeared in Friday's Childress Index:

Several representatives of The Bureau of Reclamation of the Department of Interior met with some of the directors of the Greenbelt Municipal and Industrial Water Authority here yesterday afternoon it was announced this morning.

The representatives assured the Greenbelt directors of their fullest cooperation in building a dam for water for municipal and industrial use north of Hedley.

The dam will be above the salt beds on the Salt Fork of Red River and the water is of the finest quality.

Dr. S. H. Townsend, president of the Authority who called yesterday's meeting, announced that Congressman Walter Rogers would be here for a meeting with the Authority early in March.

Representatives of the Bureau of Reclamation who were here yesterday included M. G. Barkley of Oklahoma City, area engineer; John C. Thompson of Amarillo, assistant Regional Director; J. C. Douglas and N. H. Plaigg both of Amarillo, who are with the planning department of the Bureau

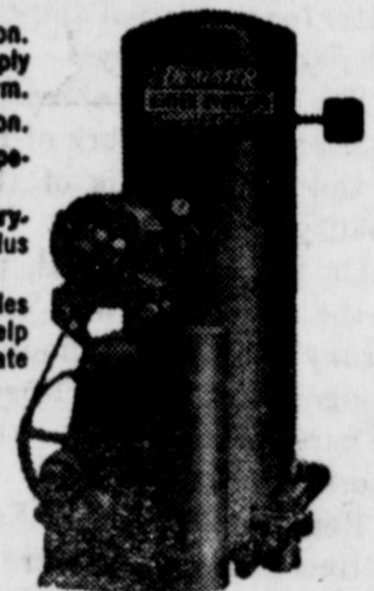
