Greenbelt Dam News

Full cooperation of the Bureau of Reclamation of the Department of the Interior was assured the directors of the Greenbelt Municipal and Industrial Water Authority in a special closed meeting of the directors by Congressman Walter Rogers at Childress Saturday night Clifford Johnson of Hedley attended the meeting

Rogers reported that the reclamation office in Amarillo was now handling all of the work in this area instead of the Oklahoma City office. This should enable the authority to speed up the progress on the dam.

Engineers from the Amarillo Reclamation office are expected to visit the dam site this week and make preparations for letting the contract for coring the river bed. With good weather the work should be started very soon.

This is just another reminder that when cotton is plowed up, be cause too much was planted, adjustments credit shall be given only for acres of regular shape, with not more than four sides. One side or one end of the plow-up area shall be parallel with the rows or field boundary.

If you do not intend to plant your cotton allotment this year, it would be to your advantage to release the allotment. The County Committee can reapportion the acreage to other farmers, but only to those who will come to this office on or before April 22 and sign Form MQ 30 "Request for Additional Cotton Acreage."

FHA Loans

During the 1959 fiscal year the Farmers Home Administration loaned \$403,000.00 for small watershed development projects. This is a new service rendered by FHA and is designed to finance projects that protect and develop land and water resources in small watersheds.

Loans may be made to install facilities to convey and store irrigation water, stabilize annual stream flow, store water for municipal water supply, recreation, fish and wildlife improvement and similar purposes.

The loans are made to eligible local organizations such as soil conservation districts, irrigation districts, and flood prevention or control districts. Repayment terms are up to 50 years.

Loans are made only for watershed projects approved by the Soil Conservation Service.

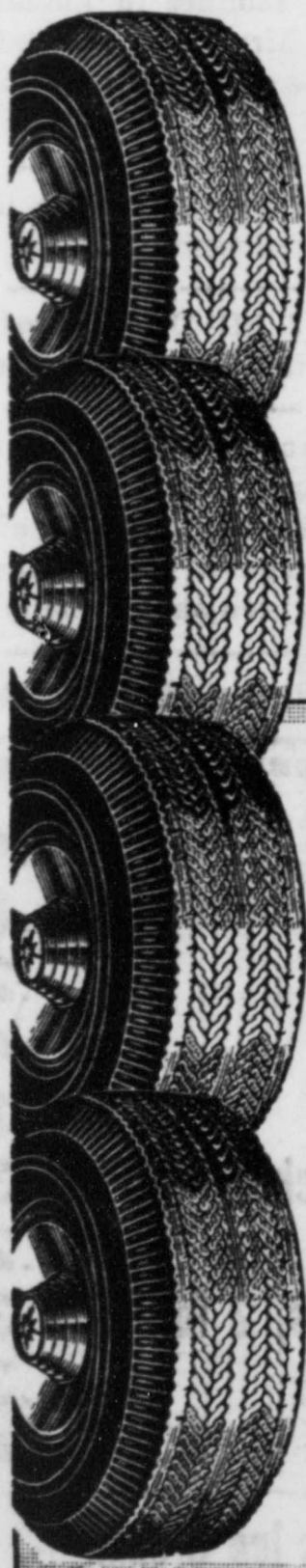

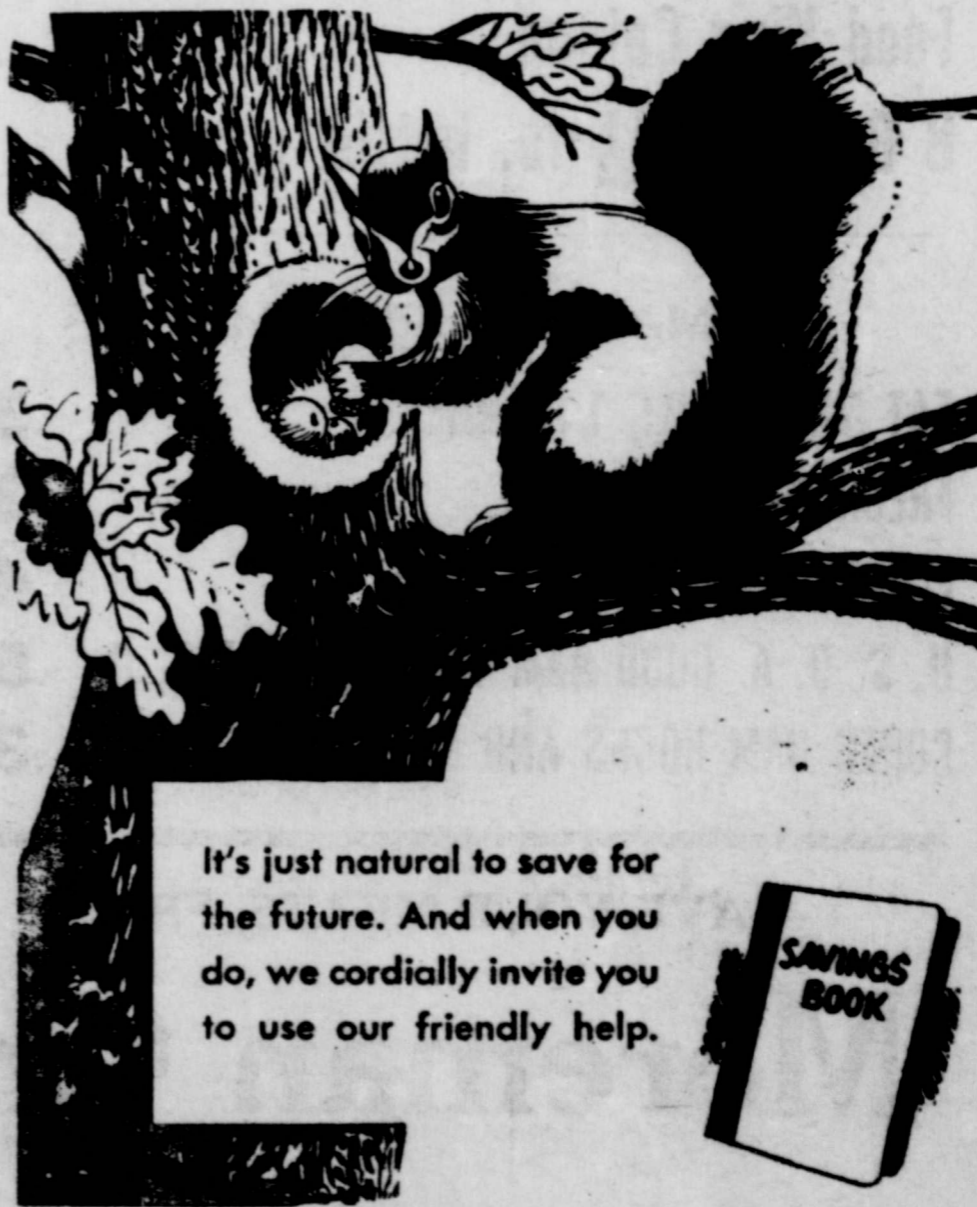
