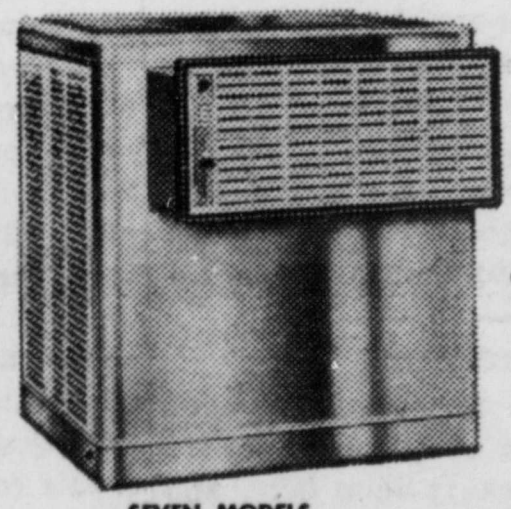

2. My opponent intimated that Will Ehrle voted for a General Retail Sales Tax. The truth is that I cast my vote against this Dallas Sponsored Sales Tax. THIS VOTE IS RECORDED AT PAGE 1852 IN THE OFFICIAL HOUSE JOURNAL.

The rest of my opponent's personal smear in his ad against members of my family was also misleading and distorted.

AS I HAVE SAID BEFORE I BELIEVE THAT MY OPPONENT IS A NICE YOUNG FELLOW. HE HAS, HOWEVER, BEEN VERY CARELESS AND NEGLIGENT IN NOT CHECKING THE INFORMATION WHICH LOBBYIST KIRKPATRICK HAS FURNISHED. The present representative, seeking a third term:

says he "fights the battle against the big business monopolies."
LET'S LOOK AT THE RECORD — In the 1959 session, he voted WITH the big gas pipeline companies right up to the last when he himself sponsored an amendment to levy a TOKEN TAX on the pipelines. Earlier he voted AGAINST all efforts to tax the natural gas pipelines and FOR sales tax proposals. (There is some doubt even as to the constitutionality of the gas pipeline tax.)

says he "voted against a sales tax." The record shows that he voted against striking the Sales Tax provision from the General Revenue Bill. See House Journal: pages 104-107 (June 27, 1959), pages 311-313 (June 30, 1959), 133-134 (July 23).

says he "voted for beer taxes." His record shows that he voted taxes OFF the breweries rather than ON. On May 8, 1959, he voted to suspend all the rules of the House to take up for consideration Senate Bill 170; a bill to reduce the license fees for the operation of a second brewery in the State of Texas. He voted to take money which was already on the books, off the big breweries. (Could the trip to Acapulco, Mexico, have anything to do with his WET vote.)

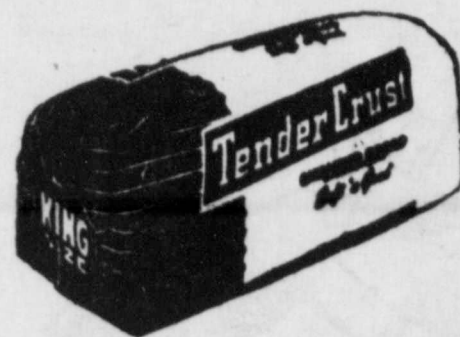
