Each voter shall present his poll tax receipt or exemption certificate, or an affidavit of its loss, to the election judge on the first time such voter participates in a primary election and the election judge shall stamp within the party affiliation space on the face of said poll tax receipt, exemption, or affidavit of loss, the words "Democrat" or "Republican" or other party vote connotation as

the case may be and such stamped poll tax receipt, exemption, or affidavit of loss shall be the designation of a qualified member of that party; such qualified member of such party, having once voted within a party primary shall remain a qualified member of that party for the duration of the poll tax period.

See page 229-230 (Nov. 5, 1957) in the Official House Journal; and it contradicts the information which the present representative is circulating in his campaign literature for a third term.

DID YOU REALLY HAVE A REPRESENTATIVE IN AUSTIN? — Absent 307 times

The present representative has been unable to find time to adequately represent the people of this district. In the 1957 session, he was absent from the House on 307 recorded roll-call votes covering 38 different days. In the 1959 session, he was absent from his legislative duties on 131 recorded roll-call votes covering 33 different days. These truths are a matter of public record in the Official House Journal.

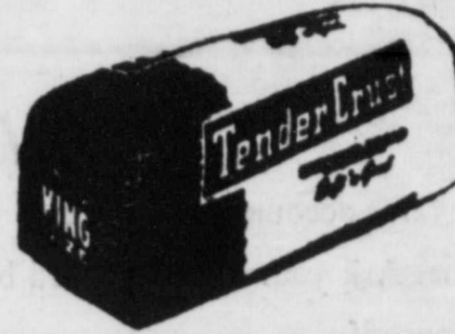
