## Greenbelt Dam News

Joe Carter, executive director of the Texas Water Development Board, and Marvin Shubert of Petersburg, a member of the board met with the directors of the Authority Thursday night of last week. Quanah's delegation of six was the largest present.

It was reported that the Greenbelt Municipal and Industrial Water Authority was progressing much faster than similar projects in the state. It was also reported that the Board of Water Development might be able to participate as much as \$5,000 in the project after the next meeting of the Legislature.

The core drilling rig moved into the site of the Greenbelt dam last week and then out again on account of too much water and storm warnings. Their plan was to core drill the river bed first, then other holes later. This will delay the coring a week or ten days. Five holes or more will be drilled, which will take about seven working days. The Authority's engineers will be on hand to check the results of the coring.
