If approved in the referendum, the system of quotas would apply to the 1961 cotton crop. This would be the eighth successive year in which quotas have been in effect for upland cotton.

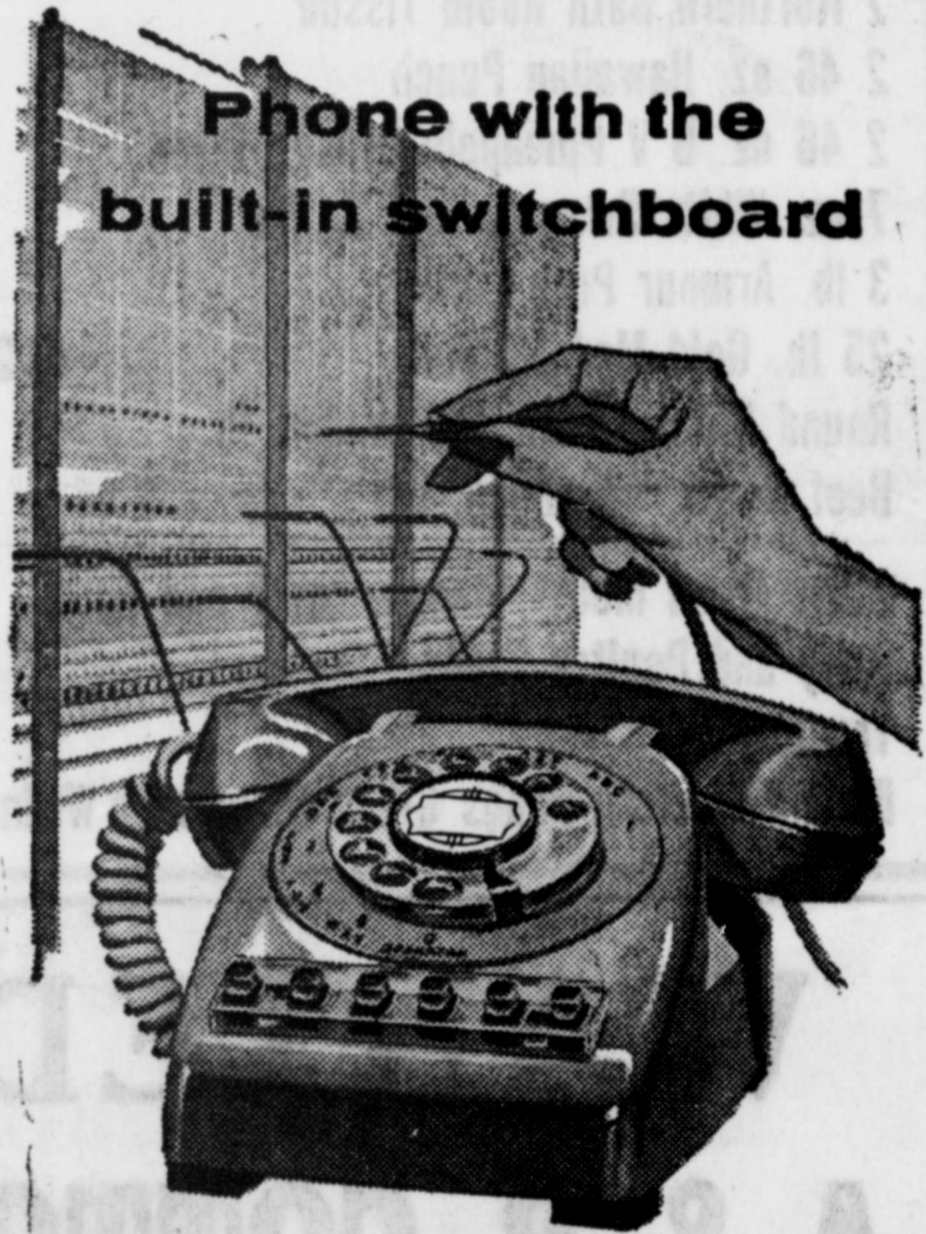

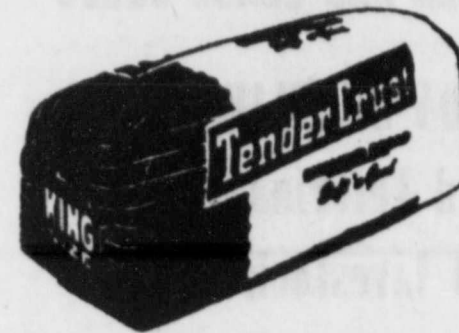
