After the program the visitors registered and were shown the modern nursery and the memorial rooms for patients which were donated by various churches and individuals. The tour then led to the minor surgery room, the major surgery room, the sterilizing room, the x ray room, the delivery room, the kitchen and dining area, and various service rooms.

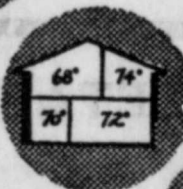

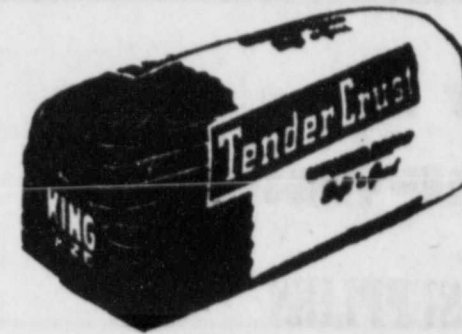
