We would like to urge that every one in Hedley and the community pay their poll taxes before the deadline Feb. 1st. Besides the annual city and school elections there is almost sure to be an election on the Greenbelt dam or probably two this year, an election of the county on Highway right of way purchase and if these materialize the City may have to call an election to meet the demands that occur from these projects.

Also while we are on the tax subject both the city and the Hedley School district will omit the interest and penalty on all delinquent taxes if paid by Feb 1. Also they will only collect 10 years taxes so if you are interested in any property that has become delinquent now is the time to clear your title. A shadow of a title and 10 years peaceful possession gives you a good claim on land according to the statutes of the state

This includes only the people who live in the city limits which are very small and should be extended. It does not include the students, those in service or away on trips. School Census

January is the month for taking School Census. It is important to the school district for two reasons. First and probably most important is that the list of eligible students in a school district determines partly how much money the school district will receive from the State. In this instance each eligible student will mean approximately \$78.00. Secondly, the school is better able to determine how many students will be enrolled each year and in what grade.

Each census blank must be signed by the parent or guardian. All information must be filled out for each child that is of census age. Children born on or before September 1, 1943 or after September 1, 1955 are not eligible and must not be listed on the blank. Another way of putting this is that children born after September 1, 1943 and before September 1, 1955 are eligible. The ages included in this bracket are 6-18.

Census blanks are going out this week. School children will bring them home to be filled out by the parents. This should be done this week and returned to the school by the student.

If anyone knows of a new family that has moved into the district or who has children not going to school, we would like to have them brought to our attention so that they may be counted. Remember this means money to the district.

Greenbelt Dam News

Water permit for the continuation of studies and planning of a proposed dam on the Salt Fork of the Red River was extended this week by the State Board of Water Engineers upon application of the Greenbelt Municipal and Industrial Water Authority.

Directors of the Authority acted on the extension Monday night in a special session at Childress, agreeing to pay the extension fee by a unanimous vote on a motion made by Wendell Harrison, director from Memphis.

The Greenbelt Authority now has exclusive water rights for another two years on Salt Fork water and will continue planning of the proposed dam and lake to serve Paducah, Hedley, Clarendon, Memphis, Childress and Quanah.

Additional core drilling within the next few months is also planned by the Authority. It became necessary to drill more holes when a new site was pin pointed after the first location proved unfeasible. The new site is in the western part of Collingsworth County about two miles east and downstream from the original location.

Ten resolutions prepared by the Texas Water Development Board for presentation to the 57th Legislature were reviewed and discussed Monday night. Of particular interest to Greenbelt Directors was the proposal to allow the Texas Water Development Board a maximum loan capacity of \$15,000,000 on projects such as the Greenbelt. It is currently \$5,000,000 or one-third of the cost, whichever is smallest.

Greenbelt directors will recommend that the legislature pass several of the resolutions.

Donley Not So Safe

Donley County did not achieve a very enviable record in traffic safety during 1960, according to figures released by the Texas Dept. of Public Safety

The final tabulation shows that there were 48 accidents in Donley County last year involving death, personal injury or property damage. Eight persons were killed, 31 were injured, and property damage reached a total of \$29,498.

Of the 31 counties in this area, Carson County also had eight deaths, Hardeman and Moore Counties had 10 deaths and Potter County had 13. The other 26 counties all had better records than Donley County. We hope that 1961 shows some improvement in this respect.

Bethlehem

Bethlehem, one of the oldest cities in Palestine, is of great interest even today to all the Christian world, for although we aren't told in the Bible the season or time of year that Christ was born, we are told that He was born in Bethlehem. The population of Bethlehem is given as 6658. Situated on a hill, which slopes off to a deep valley both on the north and south this town six miles south of Jerusalem was also the birth place of David and the home of Ruth. Rachel, beloved wife of Jacob was buried here. Fifteen miles south was Hebron the home of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. Ten miles to the northwest was Gibeon where Joshua commanded the sun to stand still, and twelve miles to the west Socoh, where David claimed a victory for God's people by slaying a giant Philistine. The "Church of the Nativity" in Bethlehem is the oldest known church building where Christians have worshiped. It was built by Helena, mother of Constantine, the first Christian Emperor of the Roman Empire. There is a cave-like room under this building that is said to be the actual manger room in which Jesus was born. There is a tradition that this same room was a part of the ancestral home of David and before that of Ruth and Boaz. If this tradition be true the family that was to produce Christ down through the ages, lived in the very same room that Christ was born in some 1100 years before his birth.

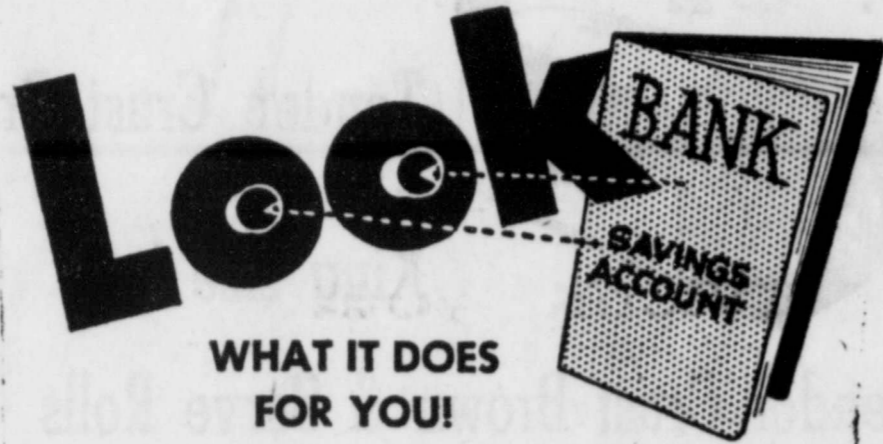

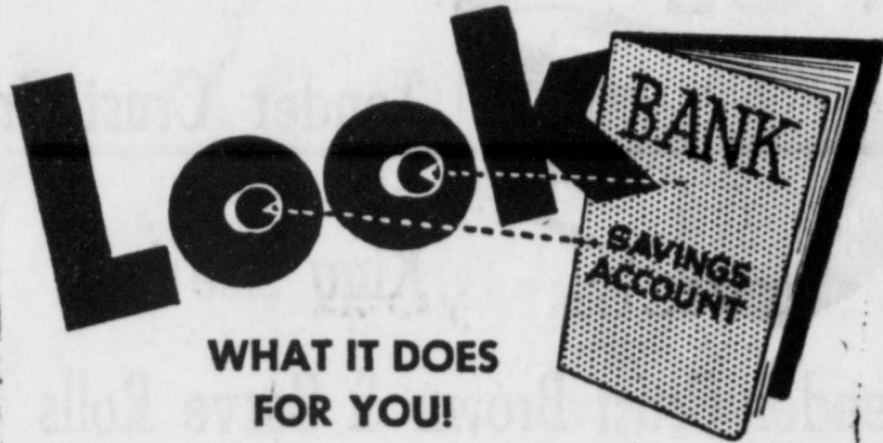
