## To Speak at Church Of the Nazarene



Rev. W. Howard Conrad, whose work as a Nazarene educator and missionary in Cuba has been suspended by the political unrest there, is in the United States, doing deputation work among churches of his denomination.

He was sent to Cuba by the foreign missions department of the Church of the Nazarene in October, 1957. He taught at the Nazarene Bible school, near Havana, and served as pastor of three churches.

Mr. Conrad will describe the country and its people and tell of the church program there. He hopes to illustrate his talks with films or slides, where possible.

A native of Kansas, Mr. Conrad graduated from Bethany Nazarene College, Bethany, Okla., and the Nazarene Theological Seminary in Kansas City, Mo.

Rev. Conrad will be at the Church of the Nazarene in Hedley on Sunday morning Feb. 26. Everyone in the community is invited to come out and hear him.

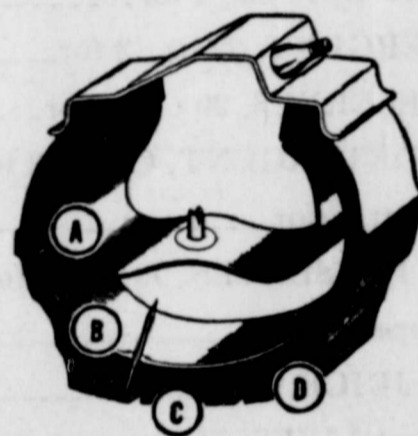
