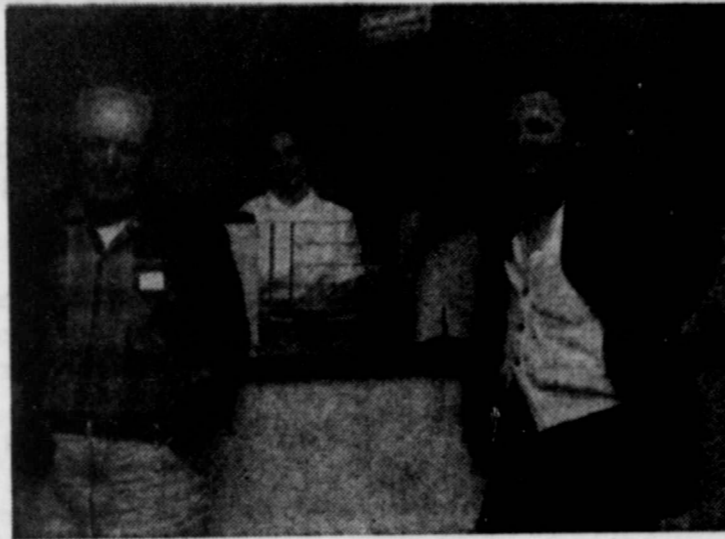

## Agreement Between Hedley and Lelia Lake Schools

In the event of a called election for the consolidation of the above named districts resulting in a favorable vote in each of the above named districts for consolidation of the two named districts, the listed items are agreed upon.

I. The Lelia Lake School Buildings and property will be deeded to the Community of Lelia Lake.

A. Stove in cafeteria

B. Deepfreeze in cafeteria

C. Refrigerator in cafeteria

D. Other items not belonging to the Lelia Lake School District

II. Property values and assessments to be equalized by the end of a period not to exceed two years from the date of the election for consolidation.

III. Maximum efforts will be made by the Consolidated School District to meet any and all requirements of the State Education Agency to maintain an Accredited

### School

IV. No obligation will be put upon the Consolidated School District to hire the teachers presently teaching at Lelia Lake. There will be positions available in the Consolidated School District. Each teacher will be considered on their individual merits and the need of the Consolidated School.

This agreement will be declared null and void in the event of failure of an Election for Consolidation in either of the two named districts.
