Greenbelt Dam News

Core drilling has been completed at the dam site and the data has been turned in. It will be some two or three weeks before the log on the holes drilled can be compiled and full report on the site made.

Rumors are that the old river bed found at the first site was still encountered. Red bed was some 70 feet at this hole but other holes drilled were from only 30 to 40 ft.

Whether this site is better than the original site can only be determined after the log has been completed and the geologists have time to go over the formations.

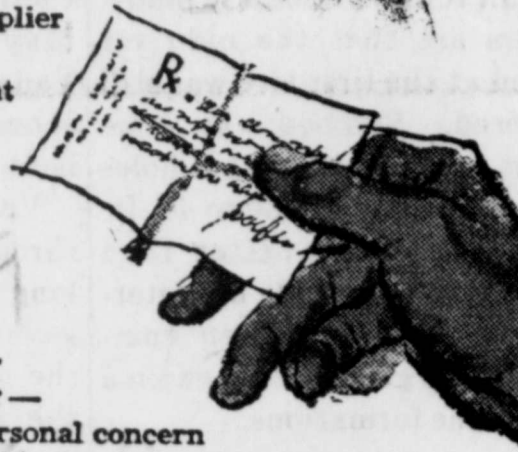
